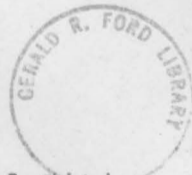

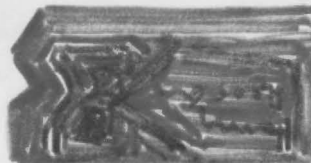

Fast thinking Lake Forest shoe store owner **C. J. Halsey**, who got the idea for the display, asked his congressman, Rep. **Robert McClory** (R-Ill.), for help and McClory passed the request on to Ford.

The campaign has certainly heated up. Wives of Republican and Democratic presidential candidates have been pitted against each other in a chili cook-off. **Rosalynn Carter** was the hands-down winner in what was billed as "The Chili Poll" at a Los Angeles shopping mall.

Though neither woman was present for the contest, each submitted her recipe. The chili dishes were placed in identical unmarked bowls with shoppers invited to sample them.

John Dempsey of New Mexico proclaimed Mrs. Carter's chili "superior, more tasty, tangy, and spicy." **Betty Ford's** was "a bit too conservative, too middle of the road."

Newlywed **Peter Lawford** received a deep cut on the leg Wednesday while filming a movie, "Fantasy Island." It seems actress **Carol Lynley** hurled a glass at him as part of a scene. The glass hit him on the left leg and shattered. Lawford was taken to UCLA Medical Center.

Actors **Telly Savalas** and **Cliff Robertson**, Olympic Gold medalist **Bruce Jenner**, sportscaster **Frank Gifford**, New York Mets pitcher **Tom Seaver**, composer **Burt Bachrach** and Texas department store executive **Stanley Marcus** have in common.

They are all "ideal images—best representing the way American men see themselves and would like others to see them," says the Men's Fashion Association of America. NEITHER OF THE WOMEN WAS PRESENT FOR THE SAMPLING, BUT EACH SUBMITTED THEIR PERSONAL RECIPIES FOR CHILI DISHES WHICH WERE WHIPPED UP BY LOCAL CHEFS AND SERVED TO CIVIC CENTER WORKERS, OFF-DUTY JURORS, SHOPPERS AND PASSERS-BY AT THE LOS ANGELES SHOPPING MALL.

THE RECIPIES WERE PLACED IN IDENTICAL DISHES WITH IDENTICAL PORTIONS WITH THE CHEF'S NAME MASKED OUT. THE SAMPLERS TOOK A SPOONFUL OF EACH AND THEN MARKED THEIR PREFERENCE.

"MRS. CARTER'S CHILI WAS SUPERIOR, MORE TASTY, TANGY AND SPICY," SAID JOHN DEMPSEY OF NEW MEXICO. "MRS. FORD'S AS A BIT TOO CONSERVATIVE, TOO MIDDLE-OF-THE-ROAD."

THE COUNT IN THE "CHILI POLL" WAS 41 VOTES FOR MRS. CARTER'S RECIPE AND 11 FOR MRS. FORD'S.

THE EVENT WAS SPONSORED BY THE INTERNATIONAL CHILI SOCIETY, WHICH THIS SUNDAY HOSTS A CHILI COOK-OFF AT ROSAMOND, CALIF., WITH PROCEEDS GOING TO THE CHILDREN'S HOSPITAL OF LOS ANGELES.

MRS. CARTER'S RECIPIE CALLS FOR: "ONE POUND ROUND STEAK, CUT INTO BITE SIZE CUBES, THREE TABLESPOONS OF CORN OIL, COOKED UNTIL THE MEAT LOOKS GREY. ADD FOUR OUNCE CAN GREEN CHILIES, CHOPPED; EIGHT OUNCE CAN OF TOMATO PASTE; ONE SMALL ONION, CHOPPED; 1 1/2 CUPS OF WATER; THREE CLOVES, FINELY CHOPPED; 1/2 TEASPOON OREGANO; 1/4 TEASPOON PEPPER; 1/2 TABLESPOON SUGAR; 1/2 TABLESPOON FLOUR; 1 1/2 TEASPOONS SALT; TWO TABLESPOONS CHILI POWEP. SIMMER IN HEAVY POT FOR ONE HOUR."

MEANWHILE ...: In the Beverly Hilton Hotel in Beverly Hills Wednesday, there were some stale jokes and speeches, but few of the 500 women in the audience were listening anyway. They came to the City of Hope luncheon to see **Betty Ford**, who was being honored "for being a First Lady in every way." Ford, in a new coral dress designed by **Luis Estevez**, appeared tired and drawn, but smiled brightly as she made a belated entrance leaning heavily on the arm of **Michael Hersch**, president of the City of Hope. Although the lunch and Estevez fashion show were not billed as a partisan event, the afternoon did take on some political overtones.
