SUBJECT: WEEKLY REPORT #4, Week Ending August 2, 1975

ORGANIZATION - A current staff roster with a brief description of responsibilities is attached. In addition, Alan Woods has been asked to work with us on an expenses-paid basis for one month. Former Congressman Hal Haskell, on a volunteer, expensespaid basis, will begin making key calls in the Northeast Region.

STATE COMMITTEES

NORTH CAROLINA - On Tuesday, August 5, Governor Jim Holshouser will announce at a Press Conference in Raleigh the formation of the North Carolina President Ford Committee. The Co-Chairmen are Jim Peden of Raleigh and Margaret King of Charlotte. Approximately 90 people have accepted the invitation to attend the conference and luncheon following, including Congressmen Jim Broyhill and Jim Martin, former Congressman Charlie Jonas, and virtually every District and County official in the State.

<u>GENERAL</u> - I am asking several members and former members of the RNC to help contact all National Committee members. Dick Rosenbaum has agreed to handle the Northeast and Jim Holshouser the South. John McDonald, Dick Herman and Frank Fahrenkopf will also be contacted. Dan Kuykendall is handling former Members of Congress. Attached is a memorandum which we will be sending to all Republican National Committee members, Members of Congress and Governors.

SENATE AND HOUSE

Meetings were held on Wednesday, July 30, with members of the Senate and House, hosted by Hugh Scott and John Rhodes. The purpose was to brief key leadership on PFC plans and to ask each

in attendance to touch base with a suggested list of their fellow members.

I also met with the Maryland delegation at the invitation of Glenn Beall. Marjorie Holt and Bob Bauman attended along with the A.A.'s of Gil Gude and Mac Mathias, both of whom had previous engagements and could not themselves be in attendance. Bauman has not committed to Reagan openly, but obviously is · leaning that way. Holt also is not ready to openly endorse the Presidenc. However, all want to be kept informed. They believe the Committee approach in Maryland is best for now.

STATE CLEARANCES - Lee Nunn has set up a system for clearing all appointments with appropriate Republican leaders in each State. This will include RNC members, Senators, Congressmen, and Governors.

FINANCE - Total contributions received as of August 1 total \$510,172.50. Nineteen states have met qualifying amounts, with 2 or 3 more states due to qualify today. We plan to announce the 20 states on August 7, the first month anniversary of the PFC.
