Weekly Report #10, Week ending September 13, 1975

ORGANIZATION - Ed DeBolt of the R. H. Donnelley Corporation has been retained to further develop the overall campaign strategy, as well as to begin developing the technical programs needed in New Hampshire and Florida. He also will supervise research as needed for these early States.

Bob Flanigan of Colorado has agreed to coordinate Regional activities in 10 Western States -- Idaho, Nevada, Arizona, Utah, Montana, Wyoming, New Mexico, Colorado, North and South Dakota. He will be able to spend two to three days a week in these activities until mid-October, when he will be able to spend full time.

Stu Spencer has agreed to coordinate four far-Western States in addition to California.

Dick Herman was asked to coordinate the mid-Western States, but is unable to do so due to personal reasons. However, he will help advise and be available when needed in all areas that we need him.

<u>RNC MEETING</u> - Five staff members, in addition to myself, met with at least one member of every State delegation attending the meeting. Response was favorable, although many reported pockets of Reagan strength and indicated that <u>IF</u> Reagan begins to actively campaign, his base could easily build. Several Western States are pushing for neutrality, led by Tom Stroock, the Wyoming State Chairman and newly-elected Chairman of the Western States Chairmen.

Eastern and mid-Western States showed the most enthusiasm and reported the least problems.

During a Southern States Chairmen's meeting, Clarke Reed was mildly criticized for his anti-Rockefeller statements, as such statements were not helping the Party and your nomination, but adding credence to a Reagan bid.

Over all, we noticed a lack of excitement in the meeting itself and in the campaign. Everyone seemed much more pre-occupied with what we are going to do to help elect local candidates - presuming that you are the President now and will be after the next election.

NATIONAL FEDERATION OF REPUBLICAN WOMEN - I met with 20 delegations at their national convention in Dallas and listened, basically, to their thoughts about the election. These women can be invaluable to a campaign effort, but give little overall thought to a national campaign effort. Again, they seemed more concerned about internal problems and how we would work with them, rather than how they could help your campaign.

Your speech was extremely well-received -- not only for content, but also for sincerity. You definitely out-scored Governor Reagan at this event.

STATE COMMITTEES

<u>PENNSYLVANIA</u> - During my visit to Philadelphia to meet with State Central Committee members, I met with Drew Lewis concerning the PFC in the State. He is going to put together a broad based Committee, and agreed that due to the particular structure of the primary selection process in Pennsylvania, the strongest candidates should run for District delegates - as opposed to their being nominated by the State Committee as at-large delegates.

Tim Ryan has been hired as Assistant General Counsel and will LEGAL The F.E.C. has formed a large task force under begin on October 6, 1975. the direction of Commissioners Staebler and Thomson to propose regulations regarding allocation and payment of campaign expenditures, including Presidential travel. Both Chairman Curtis and Jack Murphy have expressed highly favorable comments on the September 3 letter from Phil Buchen. The SunPac proposal regarding the formation of corporate political action committees appears to be favorably viewed by at least four Commission members and the advisory opinion should be released within the next few weeks. The F.E.C. General Counsel has tentatively concluded that there are no State limitations on the amount of fund-raising expenses that may be made in any State. If this conclusion is sustained by the F.E.C., it would provide additional flexibility in our fund-raising efforts particularly in connection with the smaller states (e.g., New Hampshire). A good relationship has been established with the legal staff of the F.E.C. and all relevant developments are being reported directly by Bob Visser to Phil Buchen's office.

FINANCE - \$10,430 was raised during the week, for a total of \$647,881. A statement is attached.

A coordinator for the national telephone bank was hired and has begun working on the lists, along with a number of volunteers.
