

#### State Campaign Organizations

Alaska The State Convention held May 21-22 resulted in 17 delegates for Ford and 2 uncommitted, leaning Reagan. Wally Hickle first wanted to split the delegation 10-Ford, 9-Reagan, but after a call from the President he offered his help in trying to reach the 18-1 split agreed to previously by Senator Stevens. The Reagan people tried every tactic they could but were turned back. Senator Stevens was a help to our effort by keeping the troops together and emphasizing party unity.

Colorado County conventions were held with the delegate count results Ford-485, Reagan-429, uncommitted-173. Presidential letters for the 1st congressional district are being sent to Washington for the President's signature. The Denver County organization met and decided on a national delegate slate, which must be approved by all concerned. A delegate monitor was appointed for the state; her name is Brenda Mischad.

Connecticut Plans are underway to send a letter to all 987 delegates by the end of the week. It's been suggested that the President send a letter to State GOP Chairman Fred Biebel. He has recently been talking about maintaining his uncommitted posture. We feel Biebel will be in the President's column, but he must have some attention.

Idaho The Board of Canvassers is meeting June 9 and will certify the results of the primary and allocate the number of delegates from Idaho. We anticipate Ford-4, Reagan-13. We expect the four delegates elected at the state party convention will be Reagan supporters; however, the Ford leadership is presently thinking of proposing to the party leadership that the state chairman, national committeeman and committeewoman be selected as delegates at-large. We would support McClure as leader of the delegates, and if this should work out, we would get 2 delegates from the 4 at-large.

Massachusetts Delegate selection caucuses under the new party rules in Massachusetts were held on May 23rd. The President Ford Committee executive committee met on May 26th to approve the candidates selected. Several ringers for Gov. Reagan were found and removed. The full Ford slate will be completed by May 31. The public announcement of John Sears' acceptance of the post of PFC State Chairman was made at a press conference in Boston on May 20. He plans to devote practically full-time to the job, even during the summer.

Montana Approximately 490 persons have filed for election as Precinct Committeemen in the June 1 primary. A mailing for those elected then is being developed. There have been rumors in the state that the Reagan forces may be planning a floor fight at the state convention. The Great Falls Tribune reports that Reagan is giving a televised speech on Friday night, May 28th.

New Jersey Two field men are now in New Jersey full-time through June 8th. They will travel the state and help with the activities of the regular Republican delegate candidates and county party organizations. Mrs. Ford visited on May 28 and met privately with most of the 67 delegate candidates. She also met with the Republican members of the state legislature. The trip received heavy press coverage and provided a good stimulus to the Ford campaign. We are in very good shape in New Jersey.

Oregon The total vote statewide in the 52.5-Ford, 47.5-Reagan primary victory was 146,950-Ford and 133,219-Reagan. All indicators immediately prior to the election indicated somewhere between a 55% and 60% victory. The President did very well in metro areas, but Reagan led downstate. A poll perhaps would have let us know more, but organizationally the job was well done. Also, the President received every single paper endorsement in the state.

<u>Vermont</u> In the face of a last-ditch effort by the Reagan forces, we were able to defeat their candidates for delegate at the state convention. We obtained 17 committed Ford delegates and 1 uncommitted, that being Peanut Kennedy, Vermont GOP State Chairman, who has publicly stated that he is solid for Ford.

#### Finance

As of May 24, seventeen states had surpassed their established fund-raising goals. 85.6% of the national goal has been attained.

#### Press

Sixty-nine actualities were prepared and fed to radio stations in Kentucky, Idaho, Tennessee, Nevada, Oregon, Arkansas, Ohio, California, Rhode Island, Montana and South Dakota. 798 actual feeds were made using the following individuals: The President; Mrs. Ford; Jack Ford; Rogers Morton; Mayor Cianci of Providence; Mayor Jim Taft of Cranston; Former Governor John Chaffee of Rhode Island; California Congressman Claire Burgener; PFC State Chairman of South Dakota Dave Volk; California Congressmen Charles Wiggins and Pete McCloskey; Governor Rhodes of Ohio; and PFC State Chairman for Nevada Oran Gragson. Additional individuals fed through the California system only included: Bill Simon, Carla Hills, State Assemblyman Jerry Lewis, Mr. Lopez, Pete Wilson, Paul Haerle, Putnam Livermore, Jack Ford, Actor Glenn Ford, William Seidman, Marjorie Lynch, State Senator Peter Behr, Congressman Claire Burgerner, State Assemblyman Dixon Arnett, and Gilda Oaxaca.

#### Special Voter Groups - National Advisory Board

The National Advisory Board program called South Dakota mayors and other prominent South Dakota Republicans requesting that they urge friends and associates to vote for the President in the primary. Drafted and mailed political action letters to mayors in Rhode Island, South Dakota and Montana. Have begun a similar mailing to California's, Ohio's and New Jersey's mayors. Obtained National Council of Physical Distribution's and Rockford, Illinois Chamber of Commerce's membership lists and expect to make a selective mailing to members shortly.

#### Treasurer's Report

A total of \$189,286.22 was received in contributions this past week, bringing to \$11,315.785.72 the amount of money received to date. There is currently a balance of \$226,800.96 on hand. A full Treasurer's Report is attached at TAB B.
