## PRESIDENT FORD COMMITTEE WEEKLY REPORT \#47

WEEK ENDING JUNE 19, 1976

POLITICAL WRAP-UP
Delaware The Delaware state convention met and elected our preferred slate of 17 delegates. It is hoped that fifteen of the delegates will commit at the caucus to be held Monday night, June 28. Two others will remain uncommitted to Kansas City. It is possible that a third or even a fourth delegate will resist committing, but they are with the President.

Minnesota The Minnesota State Convention will be held June 2426. In Minnesota, there is a good possibility that we will get all 18 at-1arge delegates. The lowest number of delegates would be 15 for the President and 3 for Reagan. We now have the results from the congressional district conventions: 16 delegates for the President, 6 for Reagan, and 4 uncommitted. A straw poll is taken at the state convention. If the President gets $60 \%$ or more in the straw poll, the 18 at-large delegates are bound by the straw vote. We anticipate being very close to the $60 \%$ figure and hope that we will be able to do this.

New Jersey Senator Case is reluctant to call a meeting of the delegation for the purpose of committing to the President. He has told Tom Kean that they would have more influence in the selection of a Vice-Presidential candidate if they remain uncommitted. Kean is anxious to commit the delegation soon, perhaps by telephone. He feels that Case will fall into place if 59 or 60 delegates are committing.

At the meeting held this past weekend, less than half the delegation was present. For this reason, no motion for commitment was made. Tom Kean felt it would not be appropriate to vote on commitment without all or nearly all the delegates in attendance. We still feel there are only four possible weak spots amont the 67 delegates.

North Dakota The PFC is gearing up for the July 7-9 state convention in Fargo, North Dakota. President we are polling at the national headquarters all 579 delegates to the state convention as to their Presidential preference. As of June 22, 142 telephone calls have been completed. The count is 88-Ford, 10-Reagan, 44-uncommitted. In conjunction with the polling, a letter is going out under the President's signature, to all participants in the state convention.

We are having a meeting at the time of the National Committee meeting in Washington with Ben Clayburgh, National Committeeman; Allan Young, State Chairman; Gerridee Wheeler, National Committeewoman; Chairman Morton; and Senator Milton Young, if possible. The purpose of the meeting is to resolve the delegate slate for the national convention. The history in North Dakota is that the state conventions have never turned down the nominating committee's list of delegates to the national convention. We have been working with Allan Young principally, and Ben Clayburgh on the list. Both Allan Young and Clayburgh have stated on numerous occasions that they are very strongly pro-Ford. However, the slate of delegates that Young put together had 8 Reagan and 10 Ford. We have told them that this is not acceptable to us.

Allan Young made a serious error in that he put the list together and then informed the individuals on the list. We hope to resolve this matter this week from the 10-8, down to at least 14-4 for the President. At one time, Allan Young told us that we would get all 18 at-large. It is apparent that Allan Young and Ben Clayburgh are putting their re-election as state chairman and national committeeman ahead of the interests of the President.

Texas Texas held their state convention this past weekend in Fort Worth in order to elect four at-large delegates. They elected J. Evetts Hailey, Michael Halbouty, Ron Paul and Mrs. Eddie Chiles. Ray Barnhart was elected Chairman of the delegation. Both the National Committeeman and Committeewoman were not reinstated (Fred Agnich and Pat Archer). GOP Party members who were not elected delegates are: Senator John Tower, Governor John Connally, Fred Agnich, Pat Archer, GOP State Chairman Ray Hutchison, President of Women's Federation Ann Bergman, and Vice State Chairman Polly Sowe11.

Following are a few of the planks adopted in the Texas Platform: strong against revenue sharing; Anti-ERA; strong Panama; strong right-to-life; and on Defense--"We reaffirm our opposition to Communist totalitarian governments." It has been reported--not convirmed-that there are no Mexican Americans nor Blacks on the delegation, except the possibility of one alternate of each.

9 individual actualities were prepared and fed to radio stations in Iowa and Colorado. Individuals fed through the system included The President, Secretary Butz, Rogers Morton, and Iowa Governor Robert Ray. 175 actual feeds were made. Actuality activity is greatly curtailed now because the Committee has moved completely into the convention states.

## Finance

As of June 14, eighteen states had surpassed their established fund-raising goals. $92.5 \%$ of the national goal has been attained.

A total of $\$ 136,620.42$ was received in contributions this past week, bringint to $\$ 12,175,020.43$ the amount of money received to date. There is currently a balance of $\$ 221,740.98$ on hand. A full Treasurer's Report is attached at TAB B.
