Code 9 - Returned call which I had left at his office. He is returning home from Bar Harbor - called enroute. Said "Tell him Code 9 has the message and will implement to the best of his ability. I am on my way back from Bar Harbor making telephone calls as I go. Tell him to tell Betty to wear the elephant dress for luck. Have to get on to the next telephone."

Ambassador Feldman - Called to let me know they are cancelling the party which they had planned on June 21st at which they wanted Mrs. Ford. They were asked to cancel by Bob O'Dell who convinced them it was too close to the fund-raiser being given on June 17th and it would be better to combine the two efforts. They will have at least 20 to 25 at June 17th party who will give \$1,000. Also said to tell you Sam Newhouse was placing editorials in Newark and Cleveland papers based on material the Ambassador had furnished to him. (Bob Orben has been sending him your speeches) He is extremely pleased with photo you autographed.

Lyle Nelson - By all means. Has been getting the word around informally, but will now get busy with many specific telephone calls. Says he thinks we'll do all right in Bay Area but is concerned about Los Angeles and Southern part.

Les Vice - Certainly will. Has many friends in area. Belongs to Silverado Country Club where he has been "brainwashing" his golfing buddies. Has been working for you and will continue to do so. Believes telephone calls is good approach and will be happy to do all he can that way. "He's been my friend for a long time and I really have confidence in his ability." (He now lives in Napa, Calif.)

Tom Cline - V.P. of Wickes Co. John Hekman gave me his name and said there are many employees in the company. I called Mr. Cline who was very gracious and said he certainly would call all his friends in LeMesa. Said his wife is working at PFC Committee in LeMesa. He believes the sentiment in that area is on your side. Will do all he can to help.

Mrs. Grace Bruinsma - John Hekman's sister. He gave me her number. She said she and her husband, Henry, would be more than glad to generate all the interest they could, via telephone and otherwise. Said however, that San Jose as nearly as they can tell is predominately pro-Reagan. Mr. Bruinsma is the head of the School of Humanities at San Jose College.

Mr. President

Bill Morrish Called from Oakland in response to your call to him of night before last regarding situation in Alameda and Contra Costa Counties. Said Northern Alameda was very good. The party organization was strong and it looked very encouraging. But there is concern in the southern part of the County. Said they felt Mrs. Ford's visit to Berkeley on Saturday would help tremendously. Contra Costa County looks much better. Your visit to Walnut Creek really put area in winning column, they believe. Said Reagan has announced he doesn't expect to have support of County. Media campaign is picking up on both sides. He seemed quite optimistic.

Mary Ann Keeler (Called her on another problem) She said she and her husband are placing two 1/2 page ads in LA Times to run on Sunday and Monday. Also placing three 1/2 page ads in Akron Journal for Sunday and Monday. She told me her brother is advertising mgr. for LA Times so the ads will be strategically placed!

Dr. Alan Levey (I was talking to him re another matter) Asked him if he knew anybody in California. Said he had "gobs" of relatives. I suggested that he call them and he said he most certainly would.

Ray Kaiser Will be in Chicago until Monday but will do his best when he returns to get out a proper vote.

Alex Dreier Was not home but spoke with Mrs. Dreier who told me that Mr. Dreier has done a TV tape in your behalf which is played several times a day in Palm Springs. Isn't that terrific?? He and some of his friends "put up the coins" to pay for the taping!! She said they would be more than glad to make calls in addition!

John B. Thune Great - be more than happy to call all his friends and encourage chain of calls. "In my path of life (YMCA) I have opportunity to outline fine character of the man and I know it is rubbing off." Was very pleased that you had asked someone whom you had met when in California about him and told them to say "Hi" to him for you. "Tell him I said 'Hi' back."

Kim Hallamore Making telephone calls like mad. Talked with Dan Burns last night. They believe you are doing much better than polls show. Says that Proposition 15 which would curtail nuclear energy plant activity has everyone very upset and unclear about whom they will support. He will let me know if he has another report tomorrow. (As a typical pedestrian type, I voted against the Proposition)

Interim report: He has set up pyramid telephone bank among members of Young Industry for Eisenhower which he organized about 20 years ago. Has congratulated each of them on becoming Chairman of the First Ford Pyramid Telephone Bank. Has their oath in blood. Also talked with Put Livermore in Northern California. Mr. Livermore told him that 3 out of the 4 California Chairmen are for you and the fourth died last week. Said that Mr. Livermore and former Congressman Mailliard had a press conference yesterday "blasting" Reagan for his statement about sending the troupes to Rhodesia.

Alex Dreier

Called and said his wife had given him my message. Explained that on the TV tapes he has done and are being played about ten times a day all through the valley, are done through the American Federation of TV and Radio Artists. Leon Parma knows about it and PFC must pay Mr. Dreier scale for appearing through AFTRA. However, he simply endorses the payment checks and sends them back to PFC.

Mr. Dreier says that he is concentrating on groups that don't agree with him rather than to people who support you anyway. Says he has been talking to "hundreds" a day! Has also done two half-hour television interview programs which didn't need to be paid for by anyone.

Rhodes, Carl - Palm Springs - Mrs Rhodes says they certainly will contact as many as possible between now and Tuesday. "Give him our best; we are with him."

Sandor, Dr. George - Palos Verdes - Called Marba to say how elated he is to have your letter of May 31. He is suspending the practice of medicine until June 8th. He is absolutely thrilled that you recalled his October visit and says your memory is remarkable.

Ter Avest, Paul - Davis - "Jerry and I are old friends; I'll be happy to do all possible and we'll hope for the best for him. "

PURPOSE : To convince him to lead uncommitted delegate slate at July 26 state convention.

BACKGROUND : The Reagan forces in Utah, led by GOP State Chairman, Dick Richards, have a 60%-40% edge; therefore, to run a Ford slate in earnest would probably be futile. In order to prevent a complete Reagan sweep it is our strategy to back an uncommitted slate headed by Senator Garn. That includes well-known Republicans such as former Secretary David Kennedy, former Senator Wallace Bennett, and several legislators.

Meeting him in office 6/23/76

Senator Garn has indicated he favors the President but will probably not run for delegate. He has complaints about White House handling of certain issues (Presidential trip to Utah, Executive Order on Predator Control, the Energy Bill, etc.) A call from the President to discuss these issues as well as his delegate candidacy is needed. PFC Chairman Warren Pugh agrees with this strategy.

- TOPICS OF DISCUSSION :
- 1) Indicate your regret the Economic Summit precluded a visit to Utah.
 - 2) Inquire about his problems with the Executive Order on Predator Control and ask about impact on Utah.
 - 3) Inquire about your prospects at July 16 state convention. It's likely he'll indicate the situation is grave which provides occasion to ask for his help.
 - 4) Each delegate to the national convention is critical: You would like him to run for delegate (uncommitted) and lead an uncommitted slate, thus lending his considerable popularity to your cause in Utah.
