Accompanying this memo are copies of ticket-splitting analysis prepared to date for your states. Not all the data has been collected yet so not all of your states are ready.

The printout displays 1968 Presidential vote and at least two other major statewide races in '68 or '70. Ticket-splitting is the simple percent difference between these two other races. In most cases the first race printed to the right of the Presidential column is a Republican who won relatively substantially (we call him the "ticket-leader"). In order to enhance the President's strength it is necessary to duplicate the ticket-leader. This can be done best by concentrating on high Republican and high ticket-splitting areas. State organizational and political considerations will determine what ticket-splitting areas can actually be targeted.
