This responds to your request for the views of the Postal Service with respect to the enrolled bill:

H.R. 14956, "To designate the "Joe L. Evins Post Office and Federal Building."

1. Purpose of Legislation as it pertains to the Postal Service.

The bill requires that the post office and Federal building at East Main Avenue and South First Street, Smithville, Tennessee, be known and designated as the "Joe L. Evins Post Office and Federal Building."

2. Position of the Postal Service.

Postal regulations provide that a post office should bear the official name of the incorporated city, town, or borough in which it is located. 39 CFR 242.1(b). This legislation would not, in our opinion, require alteration of our normal sign on the Smithville. Post Office. We would expect to affix a plaque to the Smithville post office building, noting dedication of the building to Joe L. Evins. Accordingly, we have no objection to enactment of the bill.

3. Timing.

We have no recommendation regarding the timing of Presidential action on this measure. 4. Cost or Savings.

- We have no estimate as to the cost or savings of this measure for the Postal Service.

The Postal Service recommends that the President approve this measure.

REPORT

[To accompany H.R. 14956]

The Committee on Public Works and Transportation, to whom was referred the bill (H.R. 14956) to designate the "Joe L. Evins Post Office and Federal Building," having considered the same, report favorably thereon without amendment and recommend that the bill

do pass.

Congressman Joe L. Evins was born in DeKalb County, Tenn., on October 24, 1910. He attended public schools in DeKalb County and was graduated from Vanderbilt University, Nashville, Tenn. in 1933. He obtained a law degree from Cumberland University in 1934 and conducted post graduate work in law at George Washington University in the years 1938-40. Mr. Evins served as a Member of the legal staff of the Federal Trade Commission and served with distinction during World War II, and was discharged as a Major.

He was elected to the 80th Congress, November 5, 1946, and served in succeeding Congresses through 1976. During his years in Congress, he served admirably as Chairman of the Subcommittee on Public Works Appropriations of the House Appropriations Committee; Chairman of the Subcommittee on Housing and Urban Development Appropriations Subcommittee: and Chairman of the Small Business Committee. He served the Congress in a most commendable manner. It is fitting and proper that we pay this small tribute to Joe Evins who has rendered such outstanding service, not only to Tennessee, but to the country as well.

COSTS OF THE LEGISLATION

Clause 7(a) of rule XIII of the Rules of the House of Representatives requires a statement of the estimated cost to the United States which would be incurred in carrying out H.R. 14956, as reported. There would be no costs resulting from enactment of H.R. 14956, as reported.

The committee ordered the bill reported by voice vote.

COMPLIANCE WITH CLAUSE 2(1) OF RULE XI OF THE RULES OF THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES

(1) With reference to clause 2(1)(3)(A) of rule XI of the Rules of the House of Representatives, no separate hearings were held on the subject matter of this legislation by the Subcommittee on Investigations and Review. However, the Subcommittee on Public Buildings and Grounds held hearings on this subject matter which resulted in the reported bill.

(2) With respect to clause 2(1)(3)(B) of rule XI of the Rules of the House of Representatives the bill, as reported, does not provide new budget authority or increased tax expenditures. Accordingly, a statement pursuant to section 308(a) of the Congressional Budget Act is not required.

(3) With reference to clause 2(1)(3)(C) of rule XI of the Rules of the House of Representatives, the committee has not received an estimate and comparison prepared by the Director of the Congressional Budget Office under section 403 of the Congressional Budget

(4) With reference to clause 2(1)(3)(D) of rule XI of the Rules of the House of Representatives, the Committee has not received a report for the Committee on Government Operations pertaining to

this subject matter.

(5) With reference to clause 2(1)(4) of rule XI of the Rules of the House of Representatives, H.R. 14956, as reported, will not affect prices and costs since it does not authorize additional funds. Therefore, H.R. 14956, as reported, would not have an inflationary impact on the national economy.
