SUBJECT: CYPRIOT AMBASSADOR'S CALL ON UNDER SECRETARY SISCO
GENEVA FOR HARTMAN

1. CYPRIOT AMBASSADOR DIMITRIOU CALLED ON UNDER SECRETARY SISCO AT 1700, AUGUST 10. SISCO OPENED BY REFERRING TO PRESIDENT FORD'S DESIRE THAT ALL AMBASSADORS IN WASHINGTON UNDERSTAND THAT MAIN LINES OF U.S. FOREIGN POLICY WILL CONTINUE AS IN THE PAST. SECRETARY HAD SENT MESSAGE ALONG THESE LINES TO ACTING PRESIDENT CLERIDES ON BEHALF OF PRESIDENT FORD.

2. DIMITRIOU EXPRESSED APPRECIATION AND SAID HE HAD WRITTEN PRESIDENT FORD CONGRATULATING HIM AND ASKING THAT HIS ADMINISTRATION DO ALL POSSIBLE TO PROTECT SOVEREIGNTY AND INDEPENDENCE OF CYPRUS. HE ASKED WHETHER COPY OF MESSAGE TO CLERIDES HAD BEEN SENT TO MAKARIOS AND WHAT WAS STATUS OF ARCHBISHOP. SISCO REPLIED THERE HAD BEEN NO MESSAGE TO MAKARIOS, WHOSE STATUS WAS UNCHANGED AS FAR AS WE ARE CONCERNED.

3. DIMITRIOU CHARACTERIZED NEW CYPRIOT CABINET AS "VERY GOOD" INVOLVING PERSONS WITHOUT POLITICAL AMBITIONS. HE HAD SPOKEN WITH ARCHBISHOP PREVIOUS DAY AND MAKARIOS WAS PLEASED.

4. SISCO BRIEFED AMBASSADOR ON LATEST DEVELOPMENTS AT GENEVA WHERE A DEADLOCK HAD DEVELOPED OVER SEATING ARRANGEMENTS. HE NOTED THAT ON GROUND IN CYPRUS SITUATION SEEMED TO HAVE QUIETED DOWN.

5. DIMITRIOU ARGUED STRONGLY THAT USG MUST PLAY MAJOR ROLE IN REACHING A SOLUTION MAINLY THROUGH PERSUADING TURKEY TO EXERCISE MODERATION. SISCO REPLIED THAT US HAD TRIED TO PLAY CONSTRUCTIVE ROLE AND WAS CURRENTLY ACTIVE WITH ASSISTANT SECRETARY HARTMAN PRESENT IN GENEVA. IT WAS NOT, HOWEVER, CLEAR EXACTLY WHAT COULD BE DONE AT THIS MOMENT, THOUGH WE HAVE CONTINUOUSLY PURSUED MATTER OF CONSOLIDATING CEASEFIRE.

6. DIMITRIOU SUGGESTED TURKISH GOVERNMENT HAD MISLED USG INTO THINKING THEY DESIRED PEACE WHILE INSTEAD MOUNTING FULL-SCALE OPERATION AGAINST CYPRUS. THIS HAD CREATED SERIOUS PROBLEM INVOLVING SURVIVAL OF CYPRUS AS INDEPENDENT, SOVEREIGN STATE.

7. SISCO REPLIED THAT USG HAD MADE IT CLEAR WE WOULD NOT SUPPORT ENOSIS OR PARTITION. DIMITRIOU CLAIMED TURKISH PROPOSALS WOULD LEAD TO PARTITION PARTICULARLY IN THEIR INSISTENCE ON A DEMARCATION LINE. HE SAID CYPRUS WAS AT TURKEY'S MERCY. OTHER INTERESTED PARTIES, INCLUDING US AND UK, SHOULD CONVINCEN TURKS TO HOLD BACK OTHERWISE LONG-RANGE PROBLEMS WOULD BE CREATED IN REGION.

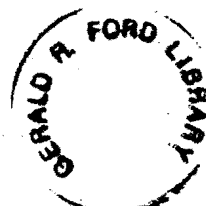
8. SISCO SAID USG FEELS ANY SOLUTION MUST BE ACCEPTABLE TO BOTH CYPRUS COMMUNITIES AND GREEK AND TURKISH CYPRIOTS AND WE DO NOT DESPAIR THAT A FORMULA MAY BE FOUND, THOUGH THIS WILL NOT BE EASY.

9. DIMITRIOU ASKED ABOUT SOVIET INTENTIONS AND SISCO STRESSED IT WAS NOT IN ANYONE'S INTEREST TO INJECT THE SOVIET FACTOR. RATHER, IT WAS IMPORTANT TO SEEK SOLUTION WITHIN GENEVA FRAMEWORK AND WESTERN CONTEXT. DIMITRIOU OBSERVED THAT WITHOUT A SETTLEMENT SOVIETS COULD EXPLOIT SITUATION AND KARAMANLIS WOULD FIND IT DIFFICULT TO CONTINUE IN OFFICE. ALL THIS MADE US ROLE MOST VITAL. SISCO ASSURED AMBASSADOR WE UNDERSTOOD HIS POINT. KISSINGER

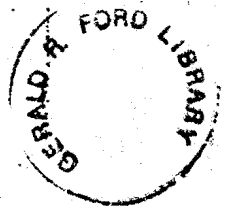

1. ASSUMING THAT CLERIDES HAS RETURNED TO NICOSIA, YOU SHOULD DELIVER TO HIM THE FOLLOWING ORAL MESSAGE FROM ME:
2. I WANT YOU TO KNOW THAT I ADMIRER THE STATESMANLIKE POSITION WHICH YOU ASSUMED AT THE GENEVA CONFERENCE. IT SEEMED TO ME THAT GIVEN GREATER FLEXIBILITY ON ALL SIDES, IT MIGHT WELL HAVE BEEN POSSIBLE TO AVOID THE RESUMPTION OF THE FIGHTING.
3. I DID WANT YOU TO KNOW THAT WE FOR OUR PART DID OUR UTMOST TO PROLONG THE NEGOTIATING SESSIONS IN GENEVA, FOR WE FELT THAT THERE WERE PROSPECTS FOR THE GRADUAL DEVELOPMENT OF THE OUTLINES OF AN ACCEPTABLE SETTLEMENT.
4. WE CONSIDER THE RESORT TO MILITARY ACTION TO BE COMPLETELY UNJUSTIFIABLE IN THE CIRCUMSTANCES AND I AM SURE YOU WILL HAVE SEEN OUR PUBLIC STATEMENTS TO THAT EFFECT.
5. I EARNESTLY HOPE THAT IN SPITE OF THIS UNJUSTIFIED MILITARY ACTION, YOU WILL CONSIDER WHAT THE POSSIBILITIES MAY BE TO BRING ABOUT A RESUMPTION OF THE NEGOTIATIONS.
6. WE ARE FOR OUR PART PREPARED TO ASSUME A MORE DIRECT ROLE IF THE PARTIES CONCERNED BELIEVE THAT WOULD BE HELPFUL. I SHOULD BE GRATEFUL FOR ANY VIEWS OR IDEAS YOU MAY HAVE AS TO HOW WE COULD BE MORE DIRECTLY HELPFUL TO THE PARTIES. KISSINGER

2. AS CLERIDES KNOWS, WE HAVE BEEN IN INTENSIVE DISCUSSIONS WITH ECEVIT WITH A VIEW TO PRESSING GOT TO STOP ITS MILITARY OPERATION IMMEDIATELY IN COMPLIANCE WITH SECURITY COUNCIL RESOLUTION. AFTER PERSISTENT INTERVENTIONSON OUR PART, WE HAVE RECEIVED ASSURANCE FROM ECEVIT THAT TURKISH MILITARY OPERATIONS WILL HALT AT 12:00 NOON, WASHINGTON TIME, FRIDAY.

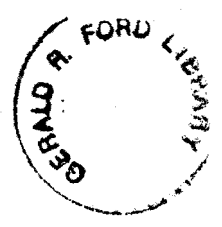

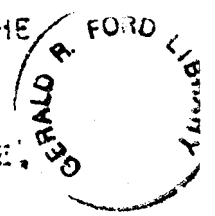

FOR AMBASSADOR BROWN FROM SECRETARY

1. I WOULD APPRECIATE YOUR ESTIMATE OF THE POSSIBILITIES FOR BEGINNING TALKS BETWEEN CLERIDES AND DENKTASH. THE FIRST REPORTS WE ARE GETTING ON THE BRITISH INITIATIVE TO RECONVENE THE GENEVA MEETING APPEAR TO INDICATE THAT THE GREEKS ARE UNLIKELY TO AGREE TO AN EARLY RESUMPTION OF THOSE TALKS. IF THIS SITUATION HOLDS THERE MIGHT BE SOME VALUE IN ENCOURAGING CLERIDES AND DENKTASH TO TALK, AS WE DISCUSSED BEFORE YOU LEFT, FIRST IN TERMS OF THE HUMANITARIAN PROBLEMS OF EXCHANGING PRISONERS AND DEALING WITH REFUGEES, RELIEF MATTERS AND ALSO TRY TO WORK OUT SUITABLE ARRANGEMENTS IN COLLABORATION WITH UNFICYP TO REOPEN NICOSIA AIRPORT. IT MIGHT BE POSSIBLE FOLLOWING THE ESTABLISHMENT OF SOME MORE NORMAL RELATIONS ON THE ISLAND TO HAVE THE TWO COMMUNITY LEADERS PROCEED THEN TO AN EXPLORATION OF POSSIBLE POLITICAL ARRANGEMENTS PUT FORWARD BY THE BRITISH.

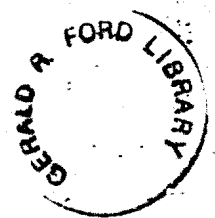

1. FBIS NO. 46 IS AFP DISPATCH FROM LONDON DATED AUGUST 22 WHICH CONTAINS THE FOLLOWING STATEMENT ATTRIBUTED TO CLERIDES. "WE HAVE NOT YET SEEN THE WORST OF THIS TRAGEDY...AT THE MOMENT MY STRONGEST FEELING IS ONE OF DISGUST--DISGUST FOR THOSE COUNTRIES WHICH COULD HAVE PREVENTED THE TURKISH INVASION IN CYPRUS AND INSTEAD OF THAT THEY ARE SATISFYING THEMSELVES BY JUST PASSING RESOLUTIONS." THE "IRONY OF THE SITUATION" PRESIDENT CLERIDES ADDED WAS THAT THE WEAPONS BEING USED BY THE TURKS WERE PROVIDED BY NATO FOR THE DEFENSE OF THE WESTERN WORLD.



2. WHILE AFP MAY NOT BE THE MOST ACCURATE NEWS SERVICE IN THE WORLD, IF ANYTHING CLOSE TO THESE REMARKS WAS IN FACT SAID BY CLERIDES, I BELIEVE IT TO BE UNFORTUNATE, EVEN THOUGH WE CAN APPRECIATE DEEP FEELINGS INVOLVED.

3. YOU SHOULD VERIFY WHETHER THIS IS AN ACCURATE STATEMENT AND IF SO YOU SHOULD TAKE UP IN FIRM TERMS WITH CLERIDES. HE MUST UNDERSTAND THAT ALTHOUGH THE UNITED STATES IS NOT REQUIRED TO DO SO IT IS USING ITS BEST EFFORTS TO BRING ABOUT A NEGOTIATION AND A JUST SOLUTION TO THIS PROBLEM. IF WE ARE CONTINUALLY ATTACKED FOR OUR EFFORTS, THOSE EFFORTS CANNOT BE EXPECTED TO CONTINUE. FACT IS THAT ALL CONCERNED MUST UNDERSTAND THAT WE WILL NOT TOLERATE ANTI-AMERICAN STATEMENTS IN CONTEXT OF RELATIONSHIPS IN WHICH THE US HAS TRIED AND EXPECTS TO CONTINUE TO BE HELPFUL IN ACHIEVING A SENSIBLE SETTLEMENT OF THE CYPRUS ISSUE.

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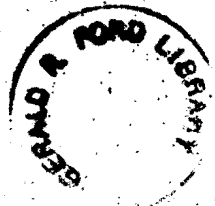

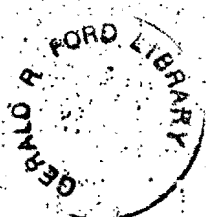

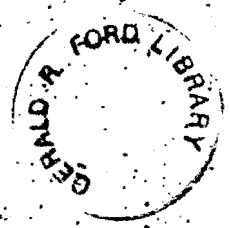

YOU SHOULD SEC CLERIDES AS SOON AS POSSIBLE AND CONVEY
THE FOLLOWING:

1. SHOULD THE GREEK GOVERNMENT ACCEPT THE SOVIET PRO-
POSAL, CLERIDES SHOULD UNDERSTAND THAT THIS IS A VERY
UNWISE COURSE OF ACTION. WE DO NOT BELIEVE THAT THIS
TYPE OF UNWIELDY MEETING IS GOING TO MOVE THE CYPRUS
PROBLEM TOWARD A SOLUTION. INSTEAD, IT WILL LEAD TO
A STALEMATE WHICH WILL BE OF BENEFIT TO THE SOVIETS,
BUT WILL NOT BE IN THE INTERESTS OF EITHER THE GREEK
OR TURKISH COMMUNITIES ON CYPRUS. WHILE SUCH A STALE-
MATE MAY APPEAR TO OFFER SOME SHORT-TERM ADVANTAGE
DOMESTICALLY TO THE GREEK GOVERNMENT, IT WILL IN THE

NOT YIELD TO PRESSURES CREATED BY THE DELIBERATE ENCOURAGEMENT OF ANTI-AMERICAN FEELING. AS OUR ARAB

FRIENDS LEARNED BETWEEN 1907 AND 1975, SUCH A DELIBERATE POLICY OF ANTI-AMERICANISM WILL ONLY LEAD TO A CESSATION OF OUR EFFORTS TO BRING ABOUT A PEACEFUL SOLUTION TO THIS PROBLEM.

3. IF THE US IS TO USE ITS INFLUENCE WITH TURKEY IN AN EFFORT TO OBTAIN THE KIND OF CONCESSIONS NEEDED TO ACHIEVE A SOLUTION, THERE MUST BE SERIOUS NEGOTIATION IN PROGRESS. IT IS ONLY IN SUCH A CONTEXT, AND THE SOVIET PROPOSAL DOES NOT OFFER IT, THAT WE CAN PRESS THE TURKISH GOVERNMENT TO SHOW FLEXIBILITY AND THUS PERMIT THE EXPLANATION OF PROPOSALS SUCH AS THOSE SUGGESTED BY THE BRITISH GOVERNMENT.

4. WE SUPPORT THE INDEPENDENCE OF CYPRUS AND WE WILL DO ALL THAT WE CAN TO GIVE CLERIDES SUPPORT IN HIS EFFORTS TO ACHIEVE THIS GOAL, BUT WE CAN ONLY DO SO IF HE USES HIS INFLUENCE TO BEGIN SERIOUS NEGOTIATIONS.

5. IN THE ABSENCE OF AGREEMENT ON A MEETING AMONG THE GUARANTOR POWERS, WE HOPE THAT SOME WAY CAN BE FOUND TO BEGIN DISCUSSIONS DIRECTLY BETWEEN CLERIDES AND DENKTASH AND WE THEREFORE URGE CLERIDES TO DO THIS AS SOON AS POSSIBLE, PERHAPS BEGINNING WITH A DISCUSSION OF HUMANITARIAN MATTERS. HE SHOULD KNOW THAT WE WILL DO ALL THAT WE CAN TO MAKE AVAILABLE ASSISTANCE TO DEAL WITH THESE SERIOUS HUMAN PROBLEMS. 1. WE HAVE NO ADDITIONAL POINTS FOR YOU TO TAKE UP WITH DENKTASH AT DINNER TONIGHT. HOWEVER, YOU MIGHT WANT TO REVIEW SUBJECTS YOU HAVE ALREADY DISCUSSED WITH HIM, INCLUDING THE NEED FOR SOMETHING ON REFUGEES AND THE DANGER OF FURTHER TURKISH MILITARY MOVES. 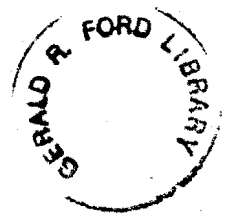

1. WITH REGARD TO THE REFERENCE IN AMBASSADOR KUBISCH'S TALKING POINTS (REFTEL) TO "THE UNOFFICIAL STATEMENT OF THE GREEK POSITION ON A POSSIBLE CYPRUS SOLUTION," THE TEXT OF THAT STATEMENT IS:

2. QTE. 1. HAVING OCCUPIED 40 PER CENT OF CYPRUS TERRITORY BY FORCE OF ARMS TURKEY DEMANDED THE RESUMPTION OF NEGOTIATIONS. HAVING BEHIND THEM THE BITTER EXPERIENCE OF THE TURKISH FOREIGN MINISTER'S BEHAVIOR IN GENEVA, THE GREEK GOVERNMENT REQUESTED THAT TURKEY, IN ORDER TO PROVE HER GOOD FAITH AND HER WILLINGNESS TO NEGOTIATE IN A CONCILIATORY SPIRIT, MAKE CERTAIN GESTURES BEFORE ANY DIRECT NEGOTIATIONS ARE INITIATED.

THESE PRECONDITIONS WERE:

A. THAT THE TURKISH FORCES WITHDRAW TO THE LINE DRAWN ON AUGUST 9, 1974, OR, AT LEAST, NORTH OF THE PIROI AREA AND OF THE OLD NICOSIA-FAMAGUSTA ROAD;

B. THAT THE MASSES OF REFUGEES WHO HAVE FLED TO SOUTHERN CYPRUS BE ALLOWED TO RETURN TO THEIR HOMES IN SAFETY.

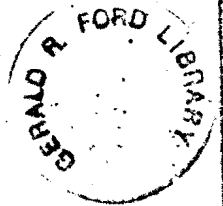

2. IF, ON THE OTHER HAND, TURKEY ACCEPTED THE INVITATION OF A DIALOGUE THROUGH A THIRD POWER, SUBSTANTIVE ISSUES COULD BE TACKLED AT ONCE.

THE BASIS FOR SUCH AN EXCHANGE OF VIEWS COULD BE THE FEDERATIVE ORGANIZATION OF THE CYPRIOT STATE UNDER THE FOLLOWING CONDITIONS:

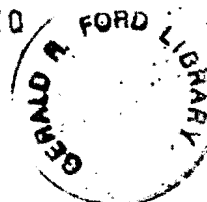
- A. THE TURKISH AREA WOULD CORRESPOND APPROXIMATELY TO THE PERCENTAGE OF THE TURKISH CYPRIOT POPULATION;
- B. NO EXCHANGE OF POPULATIONS WOULD TAKE PLACE;
- C. REFUGEES WOULD RETURN TO THEIR HOMES WHERE THEY WOULD BE ALLOWED TO RESIDE IN SAFETY;
- D. THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT WOULD HAVE SUBSTANTIVE POWERS EFFECTIVELY ENSURING THE INDEPENDENCE, SOVEREIGNTY AND TERRITORIAL INTEGRITY OF THE REPUBLIC OF CYPRUS.

THE REPUBLIC OF CYPRUS WOULD BE DEMILITARIZED FOLLOWING THE CONCLUSION OF A FINAL AGREEMENT. AN EFFECTIVE SYSTEM OF INTERNATIONAL GUARANTEES WOULD BE SET UP TO PRECLUDE A REPETITION OF THE INVASION OF THE ISLAND BY TURKISH FORCES.

3. SHOULD A CONVERGENCE OF VIEWS OCCUR ON THE FUNDAMENTAL POINTS MENTIONED ABOVE, GREECE WOULD HAVE NO OBJECTION, IF SUCH WERE TURKEY'S WISH, FOR TALKS TO BE HELD IN NICOSIA BETWEEN MESSRS. CLERIDES AND DENKTASH, UNDER THE AUSPICES OF THE SECRETARY GENERAL OF THE UNITED NATIONS AND IN THE PRESENCE OF THE AMBASSADORS OF GREECE AND TURKEY, TO DRAFT IN DETAIL THE TEXT OF THE NEW CONSTITUTION OF CYPRUS.

4. THE FUTURE OF CYPRUS IS ONLY ONE OF THE DIFFICULTIES CREATED BY TURKEY IN HER RELATIONS WITH GREECE. A SEPARATE AGREEMENT ON CYPRUS WOULD NOT BY ITSELF SUBSTANTIALLY IMPROVE GREEK-TURKISH RELATIONS. TURKEY HAS OF LATE FOLLOWED AN AGGRESSIVE FOREIGN POLICY AIMED AT EXPANDING HER INFLUENCE OVER THE AEGEAN AND OVER

WESTERN THRAE. THERE HAVE BEEN SEVERAL INDICATIONS THAT THESE EXPLOSIVE ISSUES, ALTHOUGH MOMENTARILY OVERSHADOWED BY DEVELOPMENTS IN CYPRUS, ARE VERY MUCH ALIVE AND ARE LIKELY TO BE RAISED BY TURKEY AS SOON AS THE QUESTION OF CYPRUS HAS BEEN SETTLED. THEREFORE, THE GREEK GOVERNMENT TAKES THE VIEW THAT IF DURABLE PEACE AND STABILITY ARE TO RETURN TO THE AREA, THE GREEK-TURKISH RELATIONSHIP OUGHT TO BE RECONSIDERED IN ITS ENTIRETY NOW, WITH A VIEW TO ELIMINATING ALL POINTS OF FRICTION BETWEEN THE TWO COUNTRIES. 1. PLEASE SEE CLERIDES AS SOON AS POSSIBLE AND GIVE HIM THE FOLLOWING ORAL MESSAGE FROM ME.

BEGIN MESSAGE: THE SECRETARY WANTS CLERIDES TO KNOW THAT THE PRESIDENT AND HE HAVE BEEN FOLLOWING WITH GREAT INTEREST AND ADMIRATION HIS EFFORTS OVER THE PAST WEEK TO PROMOTE A PEACEFUL SETTLEMENT IN CYPRUS. THE SECRETARY HAS BEEN INFORMED BY AMBASSADOR CRAWFORD OF CLERIDES' BELIEF THAT HIS DISCUSSIONS WITH DENKTASH ON HUMANITARIAN ISSUES CAN BE ENLARGED TO ENCOMPASS NEGOTIATIONS ON THE BASIC POLITICAL ISSUES WHICH ARE OF INTEREST TO THE TWO COMMUNITIES IN CYPRUS. THE UNITED STATES FULLY SUPPORTS THE NEGOTIATIONS BETWEEN CLERIDES AND DENKTASH. WE BELIEVE THESE NEGOTIATIONS PROVIDE THE BEST PROSPECT FOR A JUST AND LASTING SOLUTION TO THE CYPRUS PROBLEM AND HOPE THAT CLERIDES WILL CONTINUE TO PLAY THE ACTIVE AND CONSTRUCTIVE ROLE WHICH HAS ALREADY EARNED HIM SUCH A MEASURE OF RESPECT. THE SECRETARY MET

WITH THE FOREIGN MINISTERS OF GREECE AND TURKEY IN NEW YORK LAST WEEK AND HE WILL BE SEEING THEM AGAIN EARLY NEXT WEEK. THE SECRETARY WAS GRATIFIED TO FIND THAT THEY TOO SUPPORT THE EFFORTS THAT CLERIDES AND DENKTASH HAVE BEEN MAKING AND AGREE WITH US THAT THE TALKS IN NICOSIA SHOULD BE ENCOURAGED TO MOVE AHEAD ON SUBSTANTIVE ISSUES.

WHEN THE SECRETARY MEETS AGAIN WITH THE FOREIGN MINISTERS OF GREECE AND TURKEY HE WILL REAFFIRM TO THEM OUR STRONG SUPPORT FOR CLERIDES' EFFORTS. AT THAT TIME HE WILL RESTATE OUR VIEW THAT NOTHING SHOULD BE DONE AT THE UN OR ELSEWHERE THAT WOULD WEAKEN CLERIDES' LEADERSHIP OF THE CYPRUS GOVERNMENT OR DIMINISH PROSPECTS FOR THE SUCCESS OF HIS NEGOTIATIONS. IN PARTICULAR THE SECRETARY WILL STRESS AGAIN TO THE GREEK FOREIGN MINISTER THE NEED TO URGE ARCHBISHOP MAKARIOS TO TAKE NO ACTION THAT COULD PREJUDICE THE CONTINUING EFFORTS IN NICOSIA. 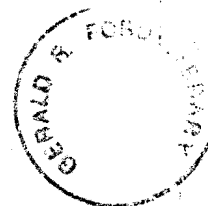

IN ADOPTING CRA LANGUAGE MAKING PRESIDENT'S AUTHORITY TO SUSPEND STRICTURES ON ASSISTANCE TO TURKEY UNTIL DECEMBER 10 CONDITIONAL ON TURKEY'S OBSERVANCE OF CEASE-FIRE, CONGRESS DID NOT (AT LEAST TO DATE) ADDRESS QUESTION OF HOW OBSERVANCE WAS TO BE DEFINED. NOR HAS EXECUTIVE BRANCH YET HAD OCCASION TO EXAMINE THIS QUESTION IN DEPTH, THOUGH IT IS OF OBVIOUS POTENTIAL CONCERN TO US. IT IS OUR PRELIMINARY JUDGMENT THAT CONGRESS INTENDED THE CONTINUED OBSERVANCE RUBRIC TO REFLECT AN OVERALL INTENT THAT DURING SUSPENSION OF STATUTORY PROHIBITION TURKEY NOT EXTEND ITS MILITARY POSITION ON CYPRUS.

2. IN ANY CASE, IT WOULD BE IN NO ONE'S INTEREST FOR USG OFFICIALS TO TRY AT THIS STAGE TO DEFINE EITHER PUBLICLY OR FOR FOREIGN INTERLOCUTORS PRECISELY WHAT WOULD OR WOULD NOT CONSTITUTE ELEMENTS OF VIOLATION, OR TO ATTEMPT TO ANSWER WHETHER GIVEN ACTION DOES OR DOES NOT SEEM TO BE IN

VIOLATION. TO DO SO RISKS INVITING ENDLESS CHARGES AND COUNTER-CHARGES REGARDING WHO STRUCK WHOM, WHICH WILL PROBABLY BE FORTHCOMING IN ANY CASE. BEST YOU CAN DO AT THIS TIME, AS GOC REGISTERS WITH YOU SPECIFIC CHARGES OF VIOLATION, IS TO INDICATE YOU WILL PASS THEM TO WASHINGTON. INGERSOLL

SUBJECT: SECRETARY'S MESSAGE TO CLERIDES

- PLEASE CONVEY FOLLOWING ORAL MESSAGE TO CLERIDES FROM ME.
- BEGIN TEXT: AS I PROMISED IN MY LAST MESSAGE I WANT YOU TO HAVE FOR YOUR CONFIDENTIAL INFORMATION A REPORT ON MY CONVERSATION ON NOVEMBER 13 WITH ARCHBISHOP MAKARIOS. FROM THE OUTSET IT WAS CLEAR THAT THE ARCHBISHOP INTENDS TO RETURN TO CYPRUS WITHIN THE NEXT FEW WEEKS AFTER STOPPING IN LONDON AND ATHENS. I STRESSED THAT HIS RETURN COULD CAUSE A SETBACK IN PROGRESS TOWARD A NEGOTIATED SETTLEMENT AND I URGED THAT HE MAKE NO FINAL PLANS UNTIL THE TURKISH SITUATION HAD CLARIFIED. I ALSO EXPRESSED MY VIEW THAT THE ONLY HOPE FOR PROGRESS TOWARD A NEGOTIATED SETTLEMENT LIES IN THE FRAMEWORK OF YOUR TALKS WITH MR. DENKTASH WHICH HAVE ALREADY ACHIEVED SOME RESULTS ON HUMANITARIAN ISSUES. I ADDED THAT THE US WILL CONTINUE TO PLAY A SUPPORTING ROLE IN THIS EFFORT, PARTICULARLY WITH REGARD TO OUR EFFORTS TO OBTAIN THE CONCESSIONS FROM TURKEY WHICH EVERYONE AGREES WILL BE NEEDED TO BRING ABOUT A SUCCESSFUL NEGOTIATION.

I DISCUSSED WITH THE ARCHBISHOP THE FACT THAT OUR PLAN TO OBTAIN SOME TURKISH GESTURES AS A PRELUDE TO ENLARGED TALKS BETWEEN YOU AND MR. DENKTASH HAD RECEIVED A SETBACK WHEN

PRIME MINISTER ECEVIT RESIGNED AND MY VISIT TO ANKARA WAS CANCELLED. I OBSERVED THAT IN ORDER FOR US TO JUDGE THE PROSPECTS FOR REVISED EFFORTS IT WOULD BE NECESSARY TO ESTABLISH A DIALOGUE WITH A NEW TURKISH GOVERNMENT AND TO

DETERMINE WHETHER WE CAN PICK UP AT THE POINT WE LEFT OFF WITH PRIME MINISTER ECEVIT. WE STILL BELIEVE WE SHOULD FIRST TRY TO OBTAIN SOME MOVEMENT IN THE DIRECTION OF NEGOTIATIONS, AND THEN, THROUGH YOUR TALKS WITH MR. DENKTASH, THE FORM OF A SOLUTION MIGHT EMERGE.

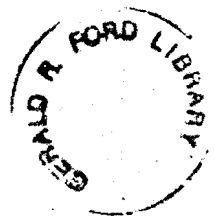
THE ARCHBISHOP AND I DISCUSSED SOME OF HIS VIEWS ON THE ELEMENTS OF A SETTLEMENT. I TOLD HIM THAT WE BELIEVE THAT REALISTIC NEGOTIATIONS WOULD HAVE TO BE CONDUCTED ON THE BASIS OF A GEOGRAPHIC FEDERATION WITHIN A SYSTEM ACCEPTABLE TO THE TWO PARTIES. I TOLD HIM THAT WHILE VARIOUS FORMULAE FOR A GEOGRAPHIC FEDERATION COULD BE EXPLORED, IT WAS MY JUDGMENT THAT ONLY A BI-ZONAL ARRANGEMENT WOULD SEEM TO MEET THE PRACTICAL REALITIES OF THE CYPRUS SITUATION.

I WISH TO EMPHASIZE AGAIN MY ADMIRATION FOR THE STATESMAN-LIKE WAY IN WHICH YOU HAVE BORNE YOUR HEAVY RESPONSIBILITIES. YOUR HELPFUL AND REALISTIC STATEMENTS HAVE DONE MUCH TO CLARIFY THE ISSUES. I UNDERSTAND THAT YOU WILL BE CONSULTING WITH PRIME MINISTER KARAMANLIS AS WELL AS ARCHBISHOP MAKARIOS BEFORE THE LATTER MAKES FINAL PLANS REGARDING HIS RETURN TO THE ISLAND. I TRUST THAT IN THIS PROCESS YOU WILL CONTINUE TO HAVE THE FULL SUPPORT NEEDED FOR YOU TO CONDUCT AND ENLARGE THE SCOPE OF YOUR NEGOTIATIONS WITH MR. DENKTASH. I WILL WANT TO KEEP IN TOUCH WITH YOU AS THESE MATTERS MOVE FORWARD AND IN LIGHT OF DEVELOPMENTS IN ATHENS AND ANKARA. END TEXT.

3. AT THE TIME YOU GIVE CLERIDES THE ABOVE MESSAGE, YOU SHOULD TAKE THE OPPORTUNITY TO STRESS TO HIM AGAIN OUR CONCERN OVER ANY PLANS HIS GOVERNMENT MAY HAVE TO GIVE CONSIDERATION TO INTRODUCTION OF A SOVIET AIR SERVICE IN CYPRUS. INTRODUCTION OF SOVIETS INTO CYPRUS SITUATION WOULD BE EXCEEDINGLY DANGEROUS AND WOULD UNDERMINE ALL OUR EFFORTS TO PROMOTE A SOLUTION. KISSINGER

FROM THE SECRETARY FOR AMBASSADOR CRAWFORD

1. AS SOON AS DENKTASH AND CLERIDES HAVE ANNOUNCED THEIR INTENTION TO BEGIN NEGOTIATIONS ON THE POLITICAL ISSUES OF A CYPRUS SETTLEMENT I WOULD LIKE YOU TO GIVE THEM ORAL MESSAGES FROM ME. IF MAKARIOS IS AVAILABLE, YOU SHOULD ALSO SEE HIM TO DELIVER A SIMILAR MESSAGE.

2. MESSAGE TO CLERIDES: THE SECRETARY HAS ALWAYS BEEN IMPRESSED BY THE STATESMANSHIP AND REALISM WITH WHICH CLERIDES HAS APPROACHED QUESTIONS RELATED BOTH TO HUMANITARIAN AND POLITICAL ISSUES ON CYPRUS. NOW THAT THE GREEK GOVERNMENT AND GREEK CYPRIOTS HAVE AGREED ON MOVING TO SUBSTANTIVE POLITICAL NEGOTIATIONS HE BELIEVES THAT REAL PROGRESS ON BASIC ISSUES SHOULD BE POSSIBLE. THE SECRETARY HOPES THAT BOTH SIDES WILL ENTER THESE NEGOTIATIONS WITH

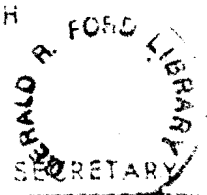

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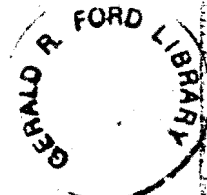
THE SERIOUS INTENTION OF BRINGING THEM TO A SUCCESSFUL CONCLUSION AS QUICKLY AS POSSIBLE. IT MIGHT BE POSSIBLE TO REACH AND TO IMPLEMENT AGREEMENTS ON PRACTICAL MATTERS SUCH AS THE REOPENING OF THE NICOSIA AIRPORT AND THE UTILIZATION OF FAMAGUSTA PORT BEFORE AGREEMENT HAS BEEN REACHED, OR PROGRESS MADE, ON MAJOR POLITICAL ISSUES CONCERNING THE FUTURE OF CYPRUS. THE SECRETARY WISHES TO

ASSURE CLERIDES THAT THE U.S. GOVERNMENT SUPPORTS THESE NEGOTIATIONS AND WILL, AS APPROPRIATE AND FEASIBLE, ASSIST IN ACHIEVING A SATISFACTORY OUTCOME. END MESSAGE.

3. MESSAGE TO DENKTASH: YOU SHOULD SPEAK TO DENKTASH ALONG SAME LINES AS ABOVE AND ADD THAT THE SECRETARY HAS UNDERSTOOD HIS CONCERN REGARDING THE RETURN OF ARCHBISHOP MAKARIOS AND HIS DOUBTS REGARDING THE NEGOTIATING AUTHORITY THAT MIGHT BE VESTED IN CLERIDES. HOWEVER, AS A RESULT OF DISCUSSIONS IN BRUSSELS, THE SECRETARY BELIEVES THAT DENKTASH SHOULD HAVE NO HESITATION IN NEGOTIATING BASIC POLITICAL ISSUES WITH CLERIDES SINCE THE LATTER ENJOYS THE SUPPORT OF THE GREEK GOVERNMENT IN NEGOTIATING ON BEHALF OF THE GREEK CYPRIOT COMMUNITY. THE SECRETARY FURTHER BELIEVES THAT THERE IS A GOOD POSSIBILITY THAT IMAGINATIVE AND FLEXIBLE PROPOSALS FROM THE TURKISH SIDE COULD MOVE THE NEGOTIATIONS TO A RAPID CONCLUSION SATISFACTORY TO THE TURKISH CYPRIOT COMMUNITY. ON THE OTHER HAND, IF RIGID POSITIONS ARE ADOPTED IN A STRATEGY FOR DRAWN OUT NEGOTIATIONS VALUABLE TIME WILL BE LOST AND THE FAVORABLE CONDITIONS THAT MAKE A RAPID SETTLEMENT POSSIBLE NOW MAY NO LONGER EXIST. THE SECRETARY WISHES TO KEEP IN TOUCH WITH DENKTASH THROUGH AMBASSADOR CRAWFORD AS THE NEGOTIATIONS PROGRESS. END MESSAGE.

4. MESSAGE TO MAKARIOS: IF YOU ARE ABLE TO SEE MAKARIOS BEFORE YOUR DEPARTURE YOU SHOULD TELL HIM THAT THE SECRETARY IS CALLING YOU TO WASHINGTON IN ORDER TO REVIEW WITH YOU IN DETAIL THE SITUATION ON THE ISLAND AT A TIME WHEN REPRESENTATIVES OF THE TWO COMMUNITIES ARE MOVING TOWARD THE NEGOTIATION OF A POLITICAL SETTLEMENT. THE SECRETARY WANTS THE ARCHBISHOP TO KNOW THAT, WHILE HE CANNOT SUBSCRIBE TO ANY PARTICULAR NEGOTIATING POSITION,

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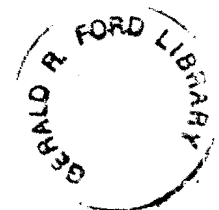
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HE BELIEVES THAT WITH CLERIDES REPRESENTING A COMMON GREEK POSITION AND DENKTASH ENJOYING THE BACKING OF THE TURKISH GOVERNMENT THE WAY IS OPEN FOR SERIOUS AND RAPID NEGOTIATIONS TOWARD A PEACE OF CONCILIATION ON THE ISLAND. THE SECRETARY WOULD WELCOME HAVING FROM AMBASSADOR CRAWFORD THE ARCHBISHOP'S ASSESSMENT OF THE SITUATION, AND HE SENDS HIS GREETINGS. END MESSAGE.
