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

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



AS WE CONTINUE TO MARCH TOWARD THAT GOAL, WHICH YOUR STATESMANSHIP IN LARGE MEASURE HAS BROUGHT WITHIN REACH, I AM DETERMINED TO CONTINUE TO STRENGTHEN AND DEEPEN THE RELATIONS SO RECENTLY RENEWED BETWEEN OUR TWO COUNTRIES.
