The Bicentennial offers these communities a vehicle for sharing their achievements. Jim, HUD is sponsoring a nationwide Bicentennial program called "Horizons on Display". The activity is taking place in 200 communities and is primarily involved with longterm solutions to community problems.

Earlier this year, the site managers of the communities were in Washington for a meeting and a visit to the White House. Although we did try, we could not work out a visit with the President for the group.

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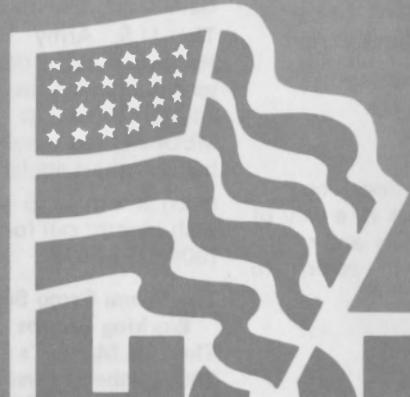


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
