

Dear Ron,

I want to protest against what I consider a grave lack of courtesy and style on the part of the White House.

I was invited as guest to last night's dinner for the visiting Prime Minister, Mr. Fraser, but for some reason my wife was not included.

As a member of the White House press corps for ten years, I find this verges on an insult, specially when several other colleagues were present with their wives.

To my constant embarrassment, I was asked, "Where is your wife?" I of course replied she had not been asked. Friends, such as Bill and Diane Cohen, were shocked by what they thought was an appalling lack of grace.

My wife, an Indonesian, has asked bemused questions -- the least of which is -- does this attitude reflect the First Lady's views on ERA?

I would have preferred not to be present if I realised foreign correspondents were singled out for this second-rate treatment. I am sure I speak for my colleagues by saying we would rather not be asked alone, than be forced to refuse a White House invitation.


I couldn't help but think back to the days of LBJ, when there was a spirit of warmth and generosity and good manners abroad in the White House.

From a Georgia Newsman, a Cautious Dissent

Since the Democratic Party's presidential nominee has had no national government experience, the best clues to the nature of a Jimmy Carter Presidency must be drawn from his record as Georgia's governor.

From the record, this much is clear: Carter has had his political setbacks. Indeed, so serious were these defeats that they ought to call into question Carter's reputation as a savvy politician. The setbacks also suggest that Carter was wise to enter national politics when he did: His days as a Georgia politician were probably numbered.

I lived in Alabama during Carter's fouryear term as governor, but closely followed Georgia politics and heard Carter on several occasions speak to Georgia Press Assn. conventions.

He was not a governor who became embroiled in great emotional issues, and his speeches were usually those of a skilled technician, not those of a spellbinding orator like George Wallace or former Georgia Gov. Gene Taimadge. When Carter left the governor's mansion in 1974, the postmortem of most Georgians was that Carter had been colorless, but hard-working, and that his future as a Georgia politician was not that bright. In fact, most Georgians in 1974 believed that Carter would have had real trouble winning reelection to the governorship if he could have succeeded himself (which he could not under Georgia law). That opinion still prevails, al-

though it is nearly certain Carter's home state will favor him come November.

The first of Carter's political setbacks, and the first concrete sign that Carter's political strength in Georgia was problematic, had its genesis in 1971. That year Carter named Atlanta lawyer David Gambrell, who was a chieftain in Carter's 1970 gubernatorial campaign and later became state Democratic Party chairman, to fill the U.S. Senate seat left vacant when Richard Russell died. Then, in 1972. Gambrell rah for election to retain Russell's former seat, and he lost—to a virtually unknown state representative. The embarrassment for Carter was that Gambrell, a

moderate on the race issue, ran his campaign with Carter backing, and it did him no good.

Another defeat that unmasked Carter's weakness occurred in 1974 when Carter picked Bert Lance as his heir-apparent to the governor's seat he was then vacating. A wealthy banker. Lance had been transformed into a political figure when Carter made him the state's highway director. Although he was a Carter protege and far outspent his opponents in the governor's race. Lance emerged in third place, with only 17% of the vote.

Most Georgia political-watchers pin the blame for these Carter setbacks on the wide-

spread suspicion among the people that Carter had hoodwinked them. When campaigning for the governorship, Carter presented himself as a conservative, even to the point of appearing to woo Wallace supporters. For instance, conservative support for Carter mounted when he spoke at a segregated academy during the campaign. Once in office, however, Carter moved toward a more liberal posture: He appointed some 100 blacks to state offices and, in a gesture fraight with symbolism, hung a portrait of Martin Luther King Jr. in the state capitol rotunda.

Those who know him believe Carter's liberal sentiments reflect his own inner feelings. Nevertheless, it is clear that many Georgians felt slightly betrayed by Carter's seeming flipflop.

What about Carter's record as an effective administrator during his tenure as governor? It seems somewhat mixed.

Carter has claimed that, if elected President, he would drastically reorganize the federal bureaucracy. He cites his reorganization of Georgia's government as evidence that he knows how to effect such changes. But the record speaks differently. Georgia's current. Democratic governor, George Busbee, said recently that the state's Department of Humane. Resources is "one of the worst messes" he has seen—and this is the very department that was the major centerpiece of Carter's highly vaunted state reorganization plan.

The best way to judge a politician is by his record. In the case of presidential nominee Carter, that record is as mixed as it is scanty—but what there is of it should be scrutinized very carefully before the November election.
