

As a candidate, we ask that you limit persons in attendance on your behalf to two, including yourself if you choose to attend.



1. You have demonstrated GROSS FISCAL MISFEASANCE IN OFFICE, as evidenced by your active and irresponsible participation in the adoption of an excessive Sonoma County Budget for 1975-76, which contained an unprecedented, economically oppressive and unjustified annual increase of over 20% in local tax financing (AN ADDITIONAL \$5,600,000 IN A SINGLE YEAR!). Your deciding vote merely provided an intolerable, unnecessary and unwanted burden to the taxpayers of Sonoma County. You then attempted to justify and cover up your action by wilfully encouraging the erroneous general impression that this unprecedented increase was in fact a budget reduction. In view of the acknowledged depressed economic conditions, high state of unemployment in Sonoma County, and the desperate pleas of individual citizens and responsible groups for you to act responsibly in this time of financial crisis, your flagrant action in disregarding these facts has demonstrated your inability to competently control, cope with or understand the administrative complexities and fiscal responsibilities of your office, and constitutes a grossly negligent breach of the public trust and confidence placed in you.

2. We are all frustrated by the higher taxes that are forced on us by nationwide inflation; but the initiators of this recall are using the Board of Supervisors' adoption of the county budget as a vehicle for their own political ends. What they really want is unrestrained land use.

Three Supervisors are subject to identical recall petitions in a power play by land development interests. The sponsors of this recall failed to comment on increases in other taxing districts, increases even twice the size of those Sonoma County found necessary.

What is really happening is that the petitioners are using the tax issue to express their frustration about a county that has toughened its policy on land use. Bringing sense to land use and development in Sonoma County will be a large factor in controlling the hidden costs to county government of haphazard land development. A viable agriculture protected by good land use planning, enhances the economy as well as the quality of life.

Budget cutting is a painful process and ultimately pinches everyone. The five million dollars we slashed from the proposed budget was described by the Sonoma County Administrator as the most drastic reduction he had seen in twenty years. The final Sonoma County budget increase of 13% reflects a compromise between spiraling inflationary costs, not controlled by county government, and the provision of reasonable services to the public.

The initiators of this petition opposed me when I successfully ran for Supervisor last year. They did not once appear during the fifty hours of budget discussion to make suggestions for saving taxpayers money.

Known as a "fiscal conservative," I served on the Petaluma school board and for nine years kept operating costs within the previous tax limits set by the voters. I left a successful business to represent the Second District and I am diligently applying my years of experience to promote economies in county government.

I learned the views of my constituents during my personal calls at 12,000 Petaluma, Rohnert Park, and Cotati homes, less than one year ago. I maintain that availability during regular office hours in Petaluma. I am successfully carrying out campaign pledges of improving city-county relationships, land use study of the Sonoma Mountains, county-wide ground water study, expediting a regional park for Petaluma, wastewater reclamation on land, and toll-free calls to county government.

The recall of public officials is a constitutional right to be used against those who abuse the public trust. When this process is used for political gain by special interests, it undermines confidence in our electoral system.

Dear Mr. Fritscher:

Thank you for your letter dated September 8, 1976 regarding contributions to United States candidates seeking Federal Office.

Section 441e, Title 2, United States Code, entitled "Contributions by foreign nationals" provides

"(a) It shall be unlawful for a foreign national, directly or through any other person to make any contribution of money or other thing of value, or to promise expressly or impliedly to make any such contribution, in connection with an election to any political office or in connection with any primary election, convention, or caucus held to select candidates for any political office; or for any person to solicit, accept, or receive any such contribution from any such foreign national.

(b) As used in this section, the term "foreign national" means

(1) a foreign principal, as such term is defined by section 1(b) of the Foreign Agents Registration Act of 1938 (22 U.S.C. §611(b)), except that the term "Foreign national" shall not include any individual who is a citizen of the United States; or

(2) an individual who is not a citizen of the United States and who is not lawfully admitted for permanent residence, as defined by section 101(a)(20) of the Immigration and Nationality Act (8 U.S.C. §1101(a)(2))."

American citizens living in a foreign country are, of course, permitted to make a contribution to the political candidate of their choice. However, the President Ford Committee can no longer accept contributions on behalf of the President ~~for~~ Senator Dole, pursuant to the Federal election campaign laws as the President Ford Committee has accepted Federal monies for the general election. It is permissible, however, to make contributions to candidates seeking other federal office.

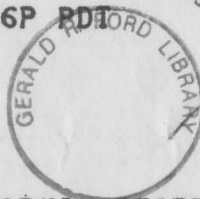

Ted Cummings, a business leader in Los Angeles, working in connection with Max Fisher and the California PFC Office, telephoned me today to inquire as to the propriety of accepting \$30,000.00 in expenditures from the Los Angeles County Republican Organization. After a somewhat confusing conversation as to the source of these funds, I reviewed this matter with Messrs. Spencer, Dave Liggett and Eddie Mahe. Apparently, Eddie Mahe has authorized a \$50,000.00 budget from the RNC to the Los Angeles County Republican Organization for general party activities but not attributable to the \$3.2 million dollars available for expenditures on behalf of the President. A Mr. Holmes Tuttle apparently asked Jerry Milbank of the RNC for authorization to utilize some of this money for a "project." Mr. Tuttle, in turn, directed Ted Cummings to expend up to \$30,000.00 on behalf of a "PFC" office in Los Angeles. In sum, it appears that this "budget" authorization was a result of confusion as to the purpose of this expenditure.

After reviewing this matter with Stu Spencer, I have directed Eddie Mahe to tell Jerry Milbank to instruct Holmes Tuttle and Ted Cummings that they do not have such a budget for PFC candidate related activity but that such expenditures must be made within the California budget as approved by Dave Liggett and the National PFC.

As State Chairman of the California Democratic Party I hereby call on you, as a responsible broadcaster, to take all feasible steps to preserve an honest political debate during the last days of this election year.

In the past two days I have been particularly troubled by the advertisements sponsored by the Ford Campaign which intentionally misstate Governor Carter's position on tax reform by claiming "Mr. Carter wants to increase taxes on those who have incomes from \$14,000 a year up."

On September 17 Governor Carter was interviewed by the Associated Press and described his proposal in these words:

"The overall effect would be to shift a substantial increase toward those who have the higher incomes and reduce the income [tax] on the lower-income and middle-income taxpayers."

The Associated Press incorrectly reported this statement by deleting certain parts of this quoted language. Immediately thereafter the Associated Press corrected its error and in fact published a full transcript of Governor Carter's remarks concerning income tax reform. This transcript of Governor Carter's interview was carried over the Associated Press "A" wire and was received in the White House. Nevertheless, President Ford thereafter mischaracterized Governor



Carter's position as calling for increased taxation of families with incomes over \$14,000.00.

Governor Carter then sent two telegrams to the White House pointing out that the Associated Press had retracted its first report of the interview and restating his own position. The President Ford Committee, however, has recently purchased broadcast time for an advertisement repeating the retracted Associated Press version of the interview and distorting Governor Carter's proposals.


I recognize, of course, that Federal law may prevent your station from refusing to air the Ford Committee's deliberate misrepresentations. Nevertheless, you have the right and the duty to assure that your viewers are not deceived. You can provide California voters with the information that the advertisement is untrue, as clearly shown by the Associated Press retraction. You could, for example, precede or follow each false advertisement with a brief announcement such as:

"Federal law requires us to run the following advertisement. However, we believe our viewers should know that the transcript of Governor Carter's remarks states the following: 'The effect would be to shift a substantial increase toward those who have the higher income and reduce the income [tax] on the lower-income and middle-income taxpayers.'"

Such an announcement would be in the spirit of the correction advertising now being required by the Federal Trade Commission for false and misleading advertisements.

We are confident that such action will assure a robust and honest debate on the issues of this campaign.

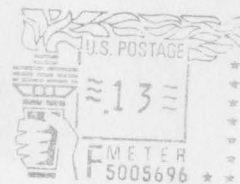

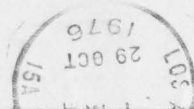
