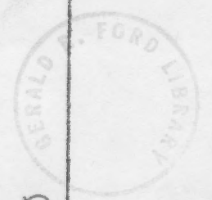

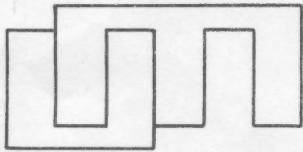



On May 31 the President appointed me to the Board of Directors of the U.S. Railway Association. It later developed that nomination had to be made in a list of three names. My name was placed in nomination by the American Steam Bureau Federation in January of 1974. No connection was made and my nomination was processed by the Department of Transportation and the White House and sent to the Senate. The Senate Commerce Committee raised the question of the fact my name was not placed in nomination in a list of three names. I am advised the Committee rejected my name requesting appointment be made in a manner that was technically correct. Steam Bureau promptly submitted a letter carrying my name and two others. I am advised the matter is now back at the White House.

Because of your earlier interest I would appreciate your support for the renomination. I have been in touch with our mutual friend John Rhodes. I am attaching copy of a letter which was sent to John by me via Fredensday under date of June 26.

2. Allan Landolt - Was Director of Dept. of Aeronautics for the State of Illinois during Ogilvie's term. Nothing happened for months until they filled the Deputy Administrator's position back in July. 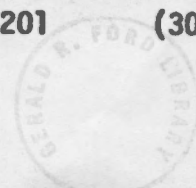
