During August, you have an even dozen speeches and remarks scheduled:

Sunday, August 10 -- St. Edwards Hospital, Fort Smith, Arkansas (Remarks); Refugee Center, Fort Chafee, Arkansas (Remarks)

Monday, August 18 -- Oil Shale Tour, Rifle, Colorado (No remarks scheduled); Iowa State Fair, Des Moines (Speech); Iowa Fundraiser, Des Moines (Remarks)

Tuesday, August 19 -- American Legion, Minneapolis (Speech); Minnesota Fundraiser, Minneapolis (Remarks); Dirksen Library, Pekin, Illinois (Remarks); White House Conference, Peoria (Remarks and Q & A)

Monday, August 25 -- Hardware Industry, Chicago (Speech); White House Conference, Milwaukee, Wisconsin (Remarks and Q & A)

Saturday, August 30 -- AFL/CIO Rally, Augusta, Maine (Speech); Augusta, Maine, and Newport, Rhode Island, Fundraisers (Remarks)



Des Moines Fairgrounds (August 18) (Casserly)

A crowd of approximately 100,000 is expected for your speech at the Iowa State Fairgrounds' outdoor amphitheater. Time of speech: 4:30 p.m. Suggested subjects:

1. Secretary Butz suggests two possible approaches. The first would be a pat on the back for the farmer and for his record of productivity.

Unlike other segments of our economy, agriculture has not had the problem of lagging productivity. Output per man-hour on farms is now 3.4 times higher than it was 20 years ago (compared with manufacturing output per manhour which is only 1.8 times higher than two decades ago). Reasons for this include: capital investment per worker, hard work, and individual productivity. In short, American agriculture still has room for individual incentive, individual productivity and individual accomplishment.

Again this year, U.S. grain production is expected to hit record levels. The wheat crop may be close to 2.2 billion bushels -- and at least 1.2 billion bushels of that can move into export markets. Our productive strength will be needed in the future to help feed not only Americans but the world. The farmer must be prepared to meet that challenge. His Government must be prepared to help him where it can.

2. Secretary Butz also suggests as a second option a speech dealing with the role of the farmer in the world -- specifically zeroing in on the importance of farm exports. Over the past 40 years, the U.S. has moved progressively toward freer international trade. No industry has more to gain in this effort than agriculture. It makes little sense to restrict farm production at a time when the world's population is exploding -- and when grocery prices are rising at home.

The Nation's farm exports totaled nearly \$22 billion last year. Thus, agriculture accounted for more than 22 percent of this country's exports for the year. Farm goods became our best earner of foreign oil, imported cameras and stereoes, and imported cars and motorcycles.

Net farm income reached \$27 billion in 1974 -- surpassed only by 1973. This wealth spreads throughout our entire economy. Our production will become more and more important in the years ahead. If we can continue to produce, the world will not go hungry. The Government must help the farmer all it can -- and hamper his efforts as little as possible.

3. Iowa Governor Ray suggests a third option for the fairgrounds speech: A ringing defense of the farmer who is tired of criticism and accusations of being responsible for high prices. The speech would give him a pat on the back for doing a good job, reminding his critics of the contribution to the country of agriculture.

In Sioux City last October, you discussed beef imports -- and your observations were apparently not all that popular in Iowa. You could discuss this subject as well with a clarification of your views.

Ray also suggests including a few paragraphs on the free market: if not for it, farmers would be in real trouble price-wise. Presidential support could also be discussed for better grain inspection and grading -- a fair and honest system, sound and clean. You could come out very strongly on this. (FYI: the Des Moines Register has taken a strong stand on this subject.)

Des Moines GOP Fundraiser (August 18)(Butler)

Dick Redman of the State GOP advises that this event does not call for a formal speech. Instead, your participation involves "mix and mingling" with several hundred Republicans at a \$100-a-head reception at 6:30 p.m. Redman suggests five minutes of very informal remarks there. Following this reception, you are scheduled to have dinner with a small number (25-50) of Republican contributors who will be paying \$2,000 to \$3,000 a plate for the privilege. Their contributions will go to offset the party's deficit of about \$75,000.

Since this is to be a rather informal affair, Redman suggests brief remarks stressing party unity, broadening the base, more registration -- an inspirational talk about the GOP and where it's going. (Note: Redman and Wythe Willy of Governor Ray's staff advise that Reagan has a small but rather determined following in Iowa, and that H.R. Gross is running that show. But he also advises that in the State party chairman election held July 21, a Ford-Ray ally was handily elected over a conservative challenger.

Minneapolis American Legion Convention (August 19)(Friedman)

Approximately 30,000 American Legionnaires and Auxillary members are expected to be on hand for your speech which is scheduled for 10:30 a.m. Milt Friedman, who is presently in Europe on the pre-advance trip, is assigned to draft this speech plans to discuss options with you on the way back from your European trip.

Minneapolis GOP Fundraiser (August 19) (Butler)

Like the Iowa GOP fundraiser, this event will have two stages. The first is a GOP Leadership Conference, to be attended by some 600 people. You will be asked to present three awards to outstanding party workers. This conference includes contributors, members of the legislature, and local workers who will have earned their way into the meeting by their success in neighborhood fundraising drives.

The second stage is a meeting of the Elephants Club, which usually has about 30 attendees, but which is expected to number 300 for your appearance. These people are very much pro-business, fairly wealthy, according to State Chairman Chuck Slocum. Subject to approval, it is suggested that you speak for 10 minutes or so and then have 10-15 minutes of question and answers.

For the first speech, Slocum suggests you would do well to appeal to independent voters in Minnesota. A recently published poll indicates that among independents, you rank second only to Hubert Humphrey in popularity, beating Mondale and all others. A "New Agenda" or "Fresh Start" (or whatever we want to call it) speech would go over very well, but should be even more positive than the recent Cleveland speech. Minnesota Republicans would like to know what you have in mind for the future, according to Slocum.

For the second speech, Slocum suggests a more traditional Republican speech, heavy on economizing, vetoes, deficit dangers, running the Government more efficiently. This approach, he says, would be perfect for this business-dominated, affluent audience.

Pat Butler, who is assigned to write these speeches, would like to switch the order of these two Minnesota speeches, making the first (to the conservative "rock-ribbed" contributors) on "Where we (GOP) stand, " and the second (to the leadership conference and, by extension, to Minnesota independents) on "Where we are going." These speeches are to be delivered only about an hour apart, and the themes would play well if done in the above order, but not in reverse order.

White House Field Conference, Peoria (August 19)

You are scheduled to close the White House Field Conference in an afternoon address to approximately 500 participants. Co-sponsoring organizations for this event include 10-15 business, agricultural, labor, civic, education and press associations. Under a new format, you are supposed to open with 10 minutes of prepared remarks, followed by 30 to 40 minutes of questions and answers.

Congressman Bob Michel suggests you talk about the role of private enterprise in the future of America. He points out that Peoria's unemployment is less than 5% and that is because the following companies -- all international trade oriented -- have stayed ahead or up with the rest of the world: Caterpillar Tractor, Westinghouse Air Brake, Keystone Steel and Wire, Hiram Walker Distillery and Corn Products International (located in Pekin about 10 miles down the river). He describes Peoria as a "very progressive" Republican area.

Michel says Peoria is also very energy conscious and worried about natural gas shortages. It has already experienced some economic limits because of such shortages. He believes the relationship between education and work might be mentioned since the new Central Illinois Community College -- which does much to fit people for jobs -- has 10,000 students. This is double that of local Bradley College. The new college is doing a great job. Since Caterpillar and Westinghouse produce all types of earth-moving equipment, Michel says that "Peoria is an earth-moving community."

In short, he suggests a good free-enterprise type of speech -- less government, more individual freedom.
