Many thanks for hosting that nice luncheon to mourn (or celebrate) the impending departure of Don Olson for the ivory towers of Mayo.

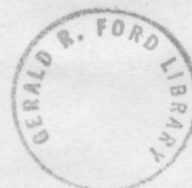
