In March of this year, the President adopted a policy that members of the Executive Branch should not appear jointly with persons outside the Government in panels before Congressional Committees. This was in response to a growing Congressional practice to invite outside experts to appear jointly with Government witnesses and engage them in debates. This put Government officials in the awkward position of having to confront outside specialists in free wheeling confrontations. In rejecting Congressional requests for further appearances of this kind, our letters have premised the policy on comity and the President's preference for the traditional method of exchange between the Executive Branch and the Congress.

The attached letter at Tab A from Representative William A. Barrett, Chairman of the Subcommittee on Housing and Community Development of the House Committee on Banking, Currency and Housing requests an exception to that policy for a hearing to be held next week. This request can be distinguished from the situation that gave rise to the above policy. The panel consists only of technicians, both governmental and nongovernmental. Since only relatively low-level technical specialists are involved, there should be no risk of embarrassment by confronting high-level executive officials with outside specialists.

I believe this distinction has merit and that it would strengthen the viability of the President's policy. That policy is obviously unpopular on the Hill and lacks a firm legal basis. By allowing an exception in cases in which only government technicians of low rank are involved, the Congressional interest in having sessions of this kind might be realized in a meaningful way, while saving senior officials from the embarrassment of such confrontations. I have attached a response for your signature that would adopt this distinction.

Attached at Tab B is the other letter from Chairman Barrett that Tod Hullin forwarded to me. It makes no express reference to the policy, though we may have to raise the objection. If so, the contrast between permitting the appearance of technicians while simultaneously refusing as to senior officials should clarify our position.

Dear Mr. Chairman:

Thank you for your letter of August 28, 1975, in which you request an exception to the President's policy that Federal officials not appear on panels before Congressional committees at the same time as nongovernmental witnesses.

The basis on which you request this exception which Mr. Kamm of the Subcommittee staff elaborated to Mr. Chapman of my staff by telephone, is that the Federal officials involved are technical specialists rather than senior policy-making officials. I understand from this that the individuals involved will be speaking basically as technicians rather than a spokesman for the Executive Branch. In these circumstances, principles of comity governing exchanges between executive and legislative branches do not apply.

On the basis of this understanding, your request for a joint appearance is granted for the purpose of permitting Mr. Forstall and Mr. Beals to participate in a panel of demographers dealing with the interpretation of current population trends. This permission is not truly an exception to the President's policy, but a clarification of its intended scope. It does not in any way detract from the principle that Federal officials who appear as spokesman for the Executive Branch should not appear jointly in panels including nongovernment personnel.

Dear Mr. Buchen:

The Subcommittee on Housing and Community Development of the Committee on Banking, Currency and Housing has scheduled a series of hearings on the President's 1974 Report on National Growth and Development. The preliminary schedule for these hearings is enclosed.

As you will note, the first session of that hearing is planned as a panel of demographers dealing with the interpretation of current population trends. Two of those involved, Mr. Forstall and Mr. Beals, are officials in the Executive Branch, and two, Mr. Morrison and Mr. Pushkarev, are associated with non-Federal quasi-public organizations. We are now informed that a recent White House policy forbids Federal officials to appear on panels before Congressional committees in conjunction with non-Federal witnesses.

Without questioning the merits of the overall policy, we would like to seek an exception to permit Mr. Forstall and Mr. Beals to appear on our panel together with their non-Federal colleagues. The subject matter involved is quite technical with few immediate implications for Federal policy. However, I do feel that the interaction among the panel members is essential to help the Subcommittee members understand the range of choices in public policy matters resulting from differing demographic assumptions.



Mr. Sylvan Kamm of the Subcommittee staff has discussed this matter with Mr. Dudley H. Chapman of your staff.

Dear Mr. Vice President:

Under the provisions of part A of the Urban Growth and New Community Development Act of 1970, the President is directed to file a biennial Report on Urban Growth with the Congress starting in February, 1972. Since the legislation requiring the preparation of the Report was initiated by our Subcommittee, we have felt it appropriate to hold oversight hearings on the Report in order to determine how interested public and private groups view its substance as an expression of Administration policy. Two days of hearings were held on the President's first Report on June 6 and 7, 1972. The President's second Report was submitted to the Congress in December, 1974. We have scheduled the hearings for September 4, 5 and 8, 1975.


Since by statute the preparation of the Report is the responsibility of the Domestic Council, we felt it appropriate to request you, as Chairman, to designate the Administration's witnesses. We respectfully request that the Administration be prepared to have its representatives appear on September 8 at 11:00 a.m. Since I understand HUD was assigned the role of lead agency, it may be appropriate for someone familiar with its work on the Report be a part of the group of witnesses to appear on behalf of the Administration.



Also, we have taken note of the recent publication Costs of Sprawl which was jointly sponsored by HUD, CEQ and EPA. Since the findings of this study do appear to have some significant relation to urban growth issues we would also appreciate having the opportunity of discussing the study with appropriate representatives of the three sponsoring agencies.

The staff of the Subcommittee has already discussed the hearings with Mr. Richard L. Dunham and we will be sending him a schedule of the Subcommittee agenda.

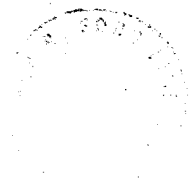

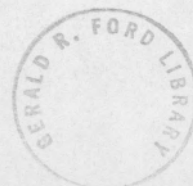

WASHINGTON (AP) -- A BIPARTISAN PANEL OF 12 HOUSE MEMBERS TODAY ANNOUNCED THEIR FORMATION OF AN ENVIRONMENTAL STUDY CONFERENCE TO COLLECT AND DISTRIBUTE WITHIN THE CONGRESS EVALUATED INFORMATION ON THE ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACTS AND COSTS OF LEGISLATION.

"THIS IS NO TIME TO HAVE THE ENVIRONMENTAL MOVEMENT SHRINK IN THE FACE OF THE ENERGY CRISIS," SAID REP. RICHARD OTTINGER, D-N.Y., PRINCIPAL ORGANIZER OF THE GROUP WITH REP. HENRY HEINZ, R-PA.

OTTINGER AND REP. GILBERT GUDE, R-MD., SAID THEY DID NOT ANTICIPATE THAT THE GROUP WOULD ISSUE ENDORSEMENTS OR REJECTIONS OF SPECIFIC BILLS. OTTINGER SAID THE GROUP WOULD "GATHER THE BEST INFORMATION, SCIENTIFIC AND TECHNOLOGICAL, AND THEN, I THINK, THE CONCLUSIONS WOULD SPEAK FOR THEMSELVES."

OTTINGER SAID THE QUESTIONS OF STAFFING, OFFICE SPACE AND FUNDS FOR THE GROUP HAVE NOT BEEN RESOLVED. SIMILAR GROUPS ARE OPERATED WITH STAFF AND MONEY FROM HOUSE MEMBERS' REGULAR OFFICE ALLOWANCES.

REP. KEN HECHLER, D-W.VA., A LEADING OPPONENT OF STRIP MINING, SAID THE GROUP'S SERVICES "WILL PREVENT THE KIND OF ECONOMIC BLACKMAIL THAT'S GOING ON IN THIS COUNTRY" WHEN AN INDUSTRY THAT WANTS TO CHANGE SITES SHUTS DOWN A PLANT AND BLAMES ANTIPOLLUTION STATUTES.

REP. JOHN DINGELL, D-MICH., SAID ENVIRONMENTALISTS WITHIN THE HOUSE HAVE LONG NEEDED A "REAL, INSIDE COORDINATING MECHANISM" TO DRAW ON FOR INFORMATION IN BATTLING FOR ANTIPOLLUTION MEASURES.

ALSO, HEINZ SAID, "WE'VE GOT TO SEE THAT ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION ISN'T MADE THE FALL GUY" IN ARGUMENTS OVER HIGHER FUEL COSTS AND INFLATION IN OTHER BASIC COMMODITIES.

HECHLER SAID THE GROUP'S MEMBERS ARE NOT "ANTI-ENERGY, BUT IT'S GOT TO BE CLEAN ENERGY" THAT DOES NOT ENDANGER PUBLIC HEALTH OR WATER AND AIR SUPPLIES.

REP. TIM WIRTH, D-COLO., A FRESHMAN, SAID THAT EVEN IN HIS MINERAL-RICH DISTRICT THE FACTS ARE INCOMPLETE ON VARIOUS FUEL-SUPPLY ISSUES AND ALTERNATIVES, AND THE ESC WOULD HELP NEW MEMBERS AND VETERANS SORT OUT THE "BEWILDERLY ARRAY" OF PROPOSALS AND ARGUMENTS.

Twelve Members of the House have circulated a "Dear Colleague" inviting other Members to join a bi-partisan Environmental Study Conference.

The prize movers are Richard Ottinger (D-NY) and John Heinz (R-Pa). The letter was sent January 24th to be received in Members' first mail deliveries on Monday, January 27th. (Conte, while not a co-signer, is one of the organizers.)

Signatories participated in a news conference at 11 a.m. today at which they explained the purpose of the Conference, as detailed in the attached hand-out.

The organizers stressed that this is to be a bi-partisan group which will seek to provide accurate and complete information to all interested Members. It will not be taking positions, on environmental issues, but will be a clearinghouse. (Staff members contrasted the good information available on strip mining bills as opposed to the misinformation on clean air which was abroad during last year's legislative battles.)

During questions and answers from media (few media representatives attended) Members stressed the following points:

..Energy and a clean environment are not incompatible; we must enlarge energy supplies while safeguarding the environment.

..In the current climate environmental issues are likely to be a the "fall guy" for economic and energy problems.

..Such a study conference will transcend committee jurisdictions, thus giving Members broader information than would be available from committee staffs.

..Details as to office space, staff, financing are yet to be worked out (partially dependent upon interest of Members), but, basically, it is expected that Members will share their clerk-hire allowances for staff.

..The organization meeting will be Monday, February 3rd, at 2 p.m.

All co-signers except Vander Jagt and Prossler participated in the news conference.

We are proposing to start an Environmental Study Conference, the tentative purposes of which are:

1. To give all Members interested in environmental legislation a vehicle for furthering their environmental goals.
2. To collect information about environmental problems and solutions, from knowledgeable institutions and organizations.
3. To follow the status of environmental legislation for interested Members.
4. To alert Members when environmentally significant legislation is under consideration by Congressional Committees and when such bills come to the floor of the House.
5. To serve as a two-way clearinghouse between Members and scientists, and Members and environmental organizations, in one direction giving information on Congressional activities; in the other obtaining resource information for Members in connection with legislation and hearings.
6. To serve as a two-way clearinghouse between Members and environmental lawyers, obtaining legal advice on environmental law and enforcement for Members and obtaining information for lawyers.
7. Through Environmental Study Conference member task forces investigating the operation of environmental laws and environmental threats that may be susceptible to legislative remedy, and providing a vehicle for Members to force public attention on environmental problems and solutions.

It is contemplated that the ESC will have a small staff paid for out of Members' staff allowances and will seek office space in the House office building complex.



It is further contemplated that ESC will include any interested Members of either party.

Environmental Study Conference will make positions, but will endeavor to inform Members of issues, environmental consequences, agreements that can be expected on all sides, costs of legislation vs. costs of lack of legislation, and all other pertinent information.

Environmental Study Conference will work closely with environmental organizations and interested scientific groups. The proposal has been discussed with all the environmental organizations and has their general approval.

--set up task forces within the ESC for particular subject areas, especially with regard to environmental threats that may be susceptible to legislative remedy.

--provide a vehicle for ESC members to focus public attention on environmental problems and solutions.

office space in the near future to serve the ESC.

While the ESC will not itself take positions, according to the sponsors, it will endeavor to inform its members on various issues, on environmental consequences of proposed legislation, on the costs of proposed legislation and on the costs of failing to enact such legislation.
