At the press briefing today The President plans to announce his intention to nominate Dixy Lee Ray as Assistant Secretary of State for Oceans and International Environmental and Scientific Affairs.

As you know, all prospective candidates for Presidential Appointments (PA or PAS) must undergo both a security investigation and a conflict of interest review as a pre-condition to announcement.

At this time, these reviews are not yet complete on Miss Ray. Regardless of the waiver for announcement purposes, we will proceed to process both in the usual manner.

I, therefore, request that you waive the security and conflict of interest review as a pre-condition to the announcement of Dixy Lee Ray as Assistant Secretary of State.
