SUBJECT: Weekly Status Report

The following are key projects and problems within my assigned areas which should be brought to your attention at this time:

1. Food Stamps: Task Force has begun development of options for Presidential action to be completed by early August.
2. Work & Education: Meeting with President left most basic questions unresolved. Follow-up guidance to Agencies is needed. Jim Cannon has proposed draft memorandum on this.
3. Aid to Non-Public Schools: Ted Bell is preparing final draft analysis but legal interpretation of application of recent Supreme Court decision is as yet unresolved.
4. White House Conference on Handicapped: Action plan is under review by OMB and Council.
5. Alternatives to Conference on Education: HEW is to have proposals by July 17th.
6. Social Security: Effort aimed at producing comprehensive restructuring of Social Security system is underway.
7. Higher Education: First draft of proposed revisions in student aid has been received and we are working with HEW and OMB.
8. Maximum Allowable Cost Regulations: We have begun discussions with HEW and OMB on the cost effectiveness of these proposed regulations. Doctors, Pharmaceutical industry and medical associations have been outspoken in their opposition and criticism of these proposals.

9. Child Nutrition Legislation: Congress will soon approve child nutrition legislation which is likely to be more than \$1 billion above administration request of \$1.7 billion.
10. Health Services Legislation: Health Services legislation similar to that vetoed by the President in December will most likely be passed by Congress in the coming weeks.
11. Health Maintenance Organizations: Proposed amendments to HMO legislation are under consideration at HEW and may generate some controversy when they are finally approved.
12. Health Planning: Objections to HEW administration of health planning legislation are increasing substantially.


