The Senator has accepted an invitation to be present when you sign the ERDA bill at 3:30 p. m. today in the Cabinet Room.

You indicated you wanted to call Scoop to ask him to come a few minutes early or stay a few minutes late to discuss privately with you the Jackson-Vanik amendment to the Trade bill.

If Senator Jackson comes early, I recommend the two of you do not enter the Cabinet Room together because of appearances to other ERDA guests.
