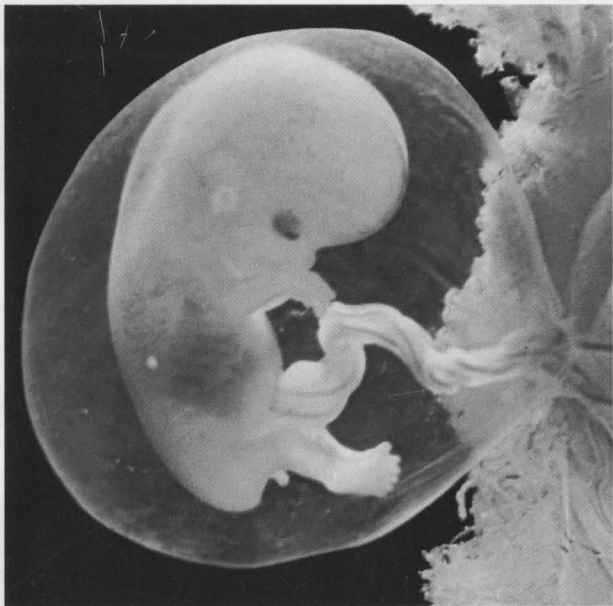

“The child by reason of his physical and mental immaturity, needs special safeguards and care, including appropriate legal protection, before as well as after birth.”

"The child shall enjoy special protection, and shall be given opportunities and facilities, by law and by other means, to enable him to develop physically, mentally, morally, spiritually and socially in a healthy and normal manner and in conditions of freedom and dignity. In the enactment of laws for this purpose the best interests of the child shall be the paramount consideration."

Minnesota Law

Under present Minnesota law any abortion, or intentional destruction of the unborn child, is considered a felony punishable by imprisonment. The only exception involves saving the life of the mother.

Today, attempts are being made to include other reasons for obtaining an abortion. These reasons range from a suspected deformity in the offspring to complete permissiveness, or the granting of abortion on demand.

Before Minnesotans allow further exceptions, the following questions should be carefully considered.

Is the unborn child a human being?

The fertilized ovum constitutes a unique genetic package which is completely programmed for and actively oriented toward adult human existence. The first faint heart beat, the development of vital organs, the beginning of respiration, the onset of puberty, etc., are all moments in this orderly development toward maturity.

There is no magic point before which the embryo is inhuman and after which it suddenly becomes human. Rather, at every stage the developing organism has specifically human characteristics which set it apart from any other animal species. If this is not a human being, what is it?

Does the unborn child have any rights?

THE UNITED NATIONS DECLARATION ON THE RIGHTS OF THE CHILD recognizes that the being before birth is a "child," and that the child, so defined, needs legal protection. THE DECLARATION OF INDEPENDENCE clearly states that all men are endowed by their Creator with the inalienable right to life. THE 14TH AMENDMENT TO THE CONSTITUTION safeguards this right by guaranteeing that no person may be deprived of life without due process



of law—"due process" being concerned with the prevention of arbitrary and unreasonable legislation and unfair judicial procedures. **THE COURTS** have recognized that the unborn child is a human being, can be protected from parental neglect, and can inherit property.

How many illegal abortions are performed each year in this country?

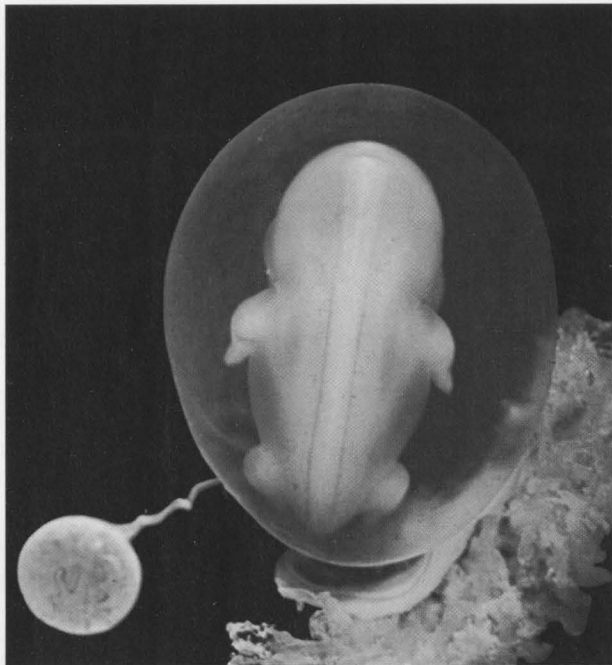
We don't know. Guesses range from 100,000 to 1,200,000. Any figure is highly speculative, however.

How many women die each year in this country from the effects of illegal abortions?

The best statistical estimates are not much over 500, if that many. According to the U. S. Bureau of Vital Statistics, in 1965 there were 235 deaths from abortions of all kinds. The Minnesota average is about 1.5 per year.

Will relaxed abortion laws eliminate illegal abortions?

NO—unless abortions are allowed for any reason whatsoever.

ever. In many countries with very permissive abortion laws, the number of illegal abortions has actually risen, partly because a new demand has been produced.

Wouldn't it be better to have no law at all than a law which is often broken?

If the mark of a good law were its observance, laws against speeding and theft would have to be repealed. Prohibiting abortion protects the key principle that innocent life may not be directly attacked.

What about rape and incest?

Fortunately, pregnancy from intercourse during criminal assault is extremely rare and easily preventable if the rape is reported immediately. If pregnancy does occur, there is another human life to consider.

Is abortion the answer to the problem of birth defects?

The steady progress of medical science is the only sure

answer. Persistent technological advances are rapidly eliminating some of the known causes of crippling deformities such as syphilis, Rh incompatibility, and German measles.

How valid are psychiatric reasons for abortion?

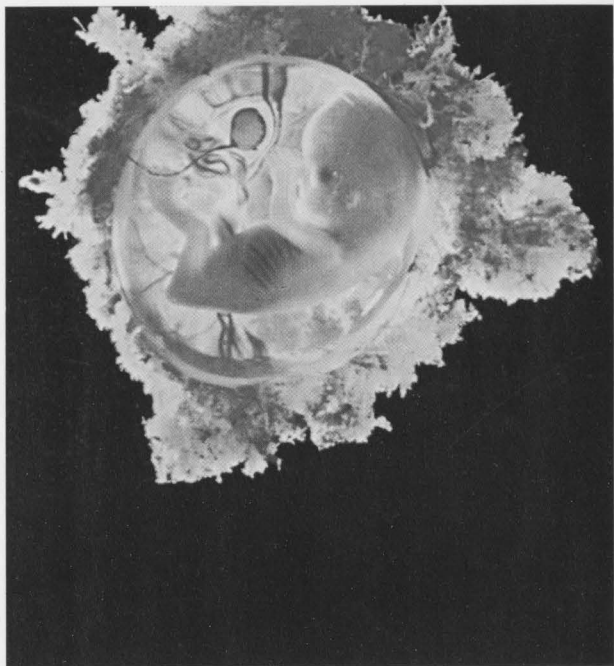
There is no known psychiatric disorder for which abortion is a recognized cure.

What about a woman's rights to privacy and autonomy over her own body?

The right to marital privacy does not imply the right to mistreat children, born or unborn. Control over the use of one's body does not apply to the embryo, which is not part of the mother, but a separate entity.

Should abortion be accepted as a means of population control?

Our country's falling birth rate does not suggest an unmanageable fertility which requires such a desperate measure. Our own life-and-death policies should not be

based on the faulty economics of other countries.

What about the woman and her problems?

The solution to the woman's problems is neither to offer her abortion, nor merely to prohibit it, but rather to demonstrate that there are humane alternatives. Concerned persons can free her from socio-economic pressures so that she can do what a mother normally wants to do—bear her child.

This means that we must provide counseling, medical care, financial assistance, homes for unwed mothers, adoption agencies and effective welfare programs. All of these are available now in varying degrees. Better development and use of such programs and agencies is far more socially progressive than the violent, destructive, superficial solution of unrestricted abortion.

The unborn need your voice. Here's how you can help:

While the proponents of relaxed abortion laws in Minnesota are becoming increasingly vocal, the friends of the unborn

must also be heard. It is a question of who is the more concerned—those who would defend the sacredness of human life or those who would destroy it as a matter of convenience.

Write a personal letter to your State Senator and Representative informing them of your position on this vital question.

Write letters to your local newspaper. Become a spokesman for those who cannot speak.

MCCL is firmly committed to the protection and fostering of the most basic value of our society—life itself. Today anti-life forces are attacking this value with increasing intensity. More and more, war and violence are being tolerated as though they were solutions to human problems.

This same negative approach can be seen in the attempts to relax or to eliminate altogether the humane laws which protect the constitutional and judicially established right to life of the human embryo.

We favor a positive, constructive approach to the abortion issue, namely recognition of the right to life of both mother and child, and we oppose the violent, destructive, de-humanizing approach of unrestrained abortion.

As a consequence, we are committed to the position that the law should not tolerate taking the innocent life of an unborn child, at any stage of its development, unless this is done to preserve a value which is truly commensurate with human life itself.

The developing human being has a right to life which must be protected whenever possible. The destruction of a human embryo is not justified for the convenience of another person.

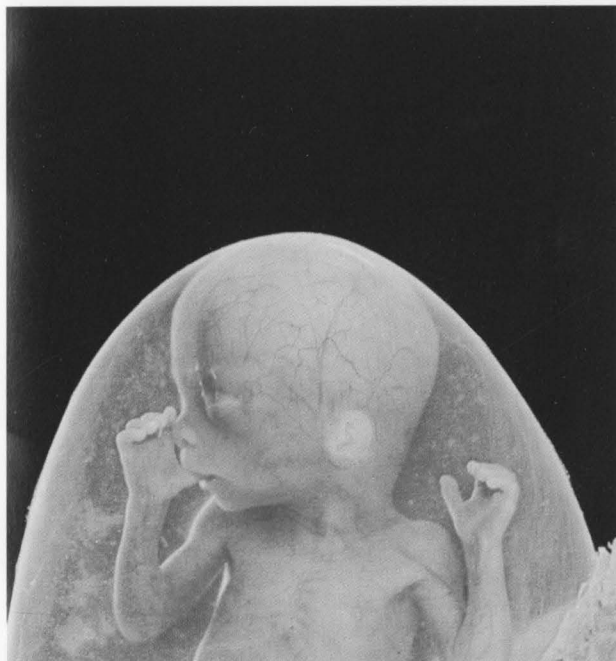

The Symbol shows the fetus in a protective enclosure in the form of the number 9 for 9 months, full term.



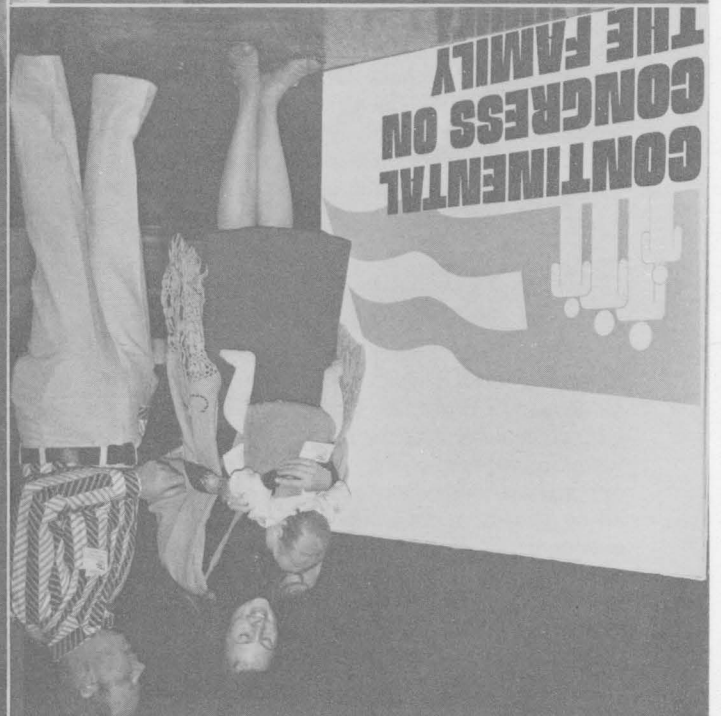
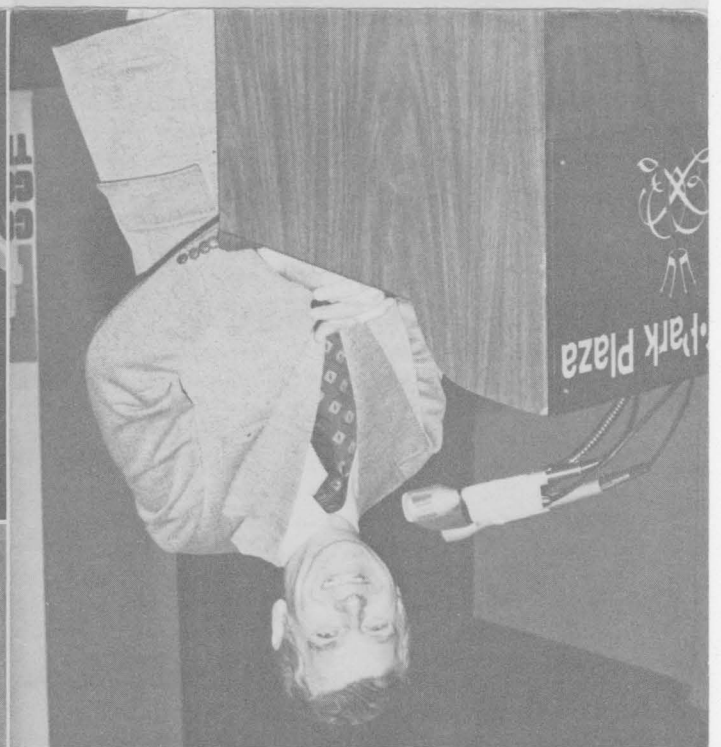

AFFIRMATION ON THE FAMILY

INTRODUCTION:

We, members of the church of Jesus Christ and participants in the 1975 Continental Congress on the Family, affirm our belief in the one eternal triune God who is Creator, Sustainer, Savior and Lord of the universe. We express our gratitude for His great salvation and rejoice in the fellowship He has given with Himself and with other believers. We are deeply concerned about the deteriorating state of the family. We confess we have failed to give sufficient attention to our own families. We dedicate ourselves anew to the task of strengthening families in our homes, churches, communities and nations. We affirm the divine inspiration and authority of the Bible in its entirety as the foundation on which we seek to build stronger marriages and better family relationships. To this end, we publicly affirm our faith and resolve.

1. THE ORIGIN AND PURPOSE OF MARRIAGE:

We believe marriage was instituted by God at the beginning of the human race and was designed to involve the total life-long commitment of a man and woman to God and to each other. Therefore, marriage is an honorable status involving the privileges and responsibilities of mutual submission, companionship, respect, fidelity, sexual fulfillment and procreation. It is a joyful joining of lives at many levels and provides the opportunity for mature love so vital to the wholeness of persons, prompting the poetic celebration of Adam in Genesis 2:23.

2. THE UNIQUENESS OF CHRISTIAN MARRIAGE:

We affirm Christian marriage as a unique husband-wife relationship modeled after Christ's relationship to the Church. In Christian marriage, the husband and wife strive to become one spiritually, intellectually, emotionally, physically, and function interdependently as equals in accordance with Biblically prescribed roles. The husband is head of the wife. He is responsible to love her as Christ loved the Church and he loves himself. The husband-wife dedicate themselves to the well-being of each other, cleaving, providing, and encouraging each other in their God-given freedom to develop their own gifts and abilities. The husband and wife are joint heirs with Christ and share equally "in joy and in sorrow, in plenty and in want, in sickness and in health." The wife submits herself to her husband, loves him and respects him. Christian marriage is meant to be a life-long relationship between one man and one woman, indissoluble except by death.

3. DIVORCE AND REMARRIAGE:

We affirm the permanence of marriage as the intent of God. We believe that divorce is contrary to God's intention for marriage. Divorce is also a profound human tragedy leaving a legacy of anguish, bitterness, loneliness, a sense of failure, and a deep fear of close personal relations. We regret the ease with which divorces are attained and believe that easy divorce and remarriage are among the factors contributing to the breakdown of family life. We believe that reconciliation is an alternative superior to divorce.

The remarriage of divorced persons is inconsistent with the plan of God for mankind, but in the opinion of some believers, may be permitted because of divine grace and as a specific manifestation of the forgiveness and new beginnings offered mankind by the Christian gospel. The Church must be a community of compassion, love, healing and forgiveness for divorced, separated and remarried persons. The Church must also attempt to prevent divorce by clearly and persistently setting forth the Biblical teachings on marriage and sex relations, and by providing a therapeutic community of believers.

4. CHILDREN AND FAMILY LIFE:

We affirm that children, natural and adopted, are a heritage from God, given in sacred trust. They are not to be abused or neglected. Children are not pawns of the Church, state or parents. Every child deserves to have a warm, caring relationship with a mother and father, the opportunity to develop a healthy self-esteem through loving parents, and the opportunity to be nurtured in an environment which models Christian behavior and values.

We believe that the roles of parents include providing for their children's growth (mentally, physically, spiritually,

and socially), and teaching them from the Word of God in a spirit of Christian love and nurture. Parents, together, are responsible to teach spiritual truth and other information by word of mouth and by example. They are to discipline in a firm, consistent, loving manner in the home. The role of the child includes becoming an obedient learner who is being trained to become a mature adult able to exercise wise and responsible discernment in making decisions. Children are to honor their parents, to obey them as they would obey the Lord, and to care for their needs in old age. Each member of the Christian family has spiritual gifts which are to be discovered, developed, and used to glorify God and strengthen each other within the family.

We deeply regret the breakdown in family closeness and order, and we urge mothers and especially fathers to resume their God-ordained roles as leaders in the home. We oppose the unhealthy influences which seek to exploit children through pornography, drug abuse, and unethical advertising. We are deeply concerned about the harmful effects of television, films and printed news media, the lack of discipline and poor adult example in home and school, and the breakdown of family unity and cohesion. We urge parents and schools to raise and teach children in a climate of mature love, respect and discipline. We urge churches to give priority attention to the task of equipping parents to provide homes in which the spiritual, psychological, intellectual and social development of children is of crucial importance.

5. THE SINGLE PERSON:

We agree that the single life is a valid lifestyle for many Christians and one to which some have been called by God. Singleness and celibacy are, for some persons, gifts from God, preferable to marriage, and conducive to greater personal and spiritual development. Many other single persons desire to marry but find no suitable mate for reasons beyond their control. We agree that the local church is intended to be the family of all God's people. We urge churches, individuals and families to be sensitive to the needs of the single, divorced and widowed persons in their fellowship and to help them fully utilize their gifts in the church. We encourage singles to develop a personal ministry and to establish meaningful relationships within the church family.

6. THE WIDOWED AND ELDERLY:

We affirm that widows and widowers are to be respected, honored and accepted fully as equals in the body of believers. We are greatly disturbed by the dishonor and difficulties experienced by the aged and widowed in our society. Family members are to honor and care for the widowed, especially those who are elderly. The Church also has responsibility to nurture and where appropriate, to minister to the elderly, neglected, lonely and needy in a spirit of Christian acceptance and concern.

(Job 12:12; Ps. 71:9; Prov. 16:31; 23:22; I Tim. 5:1-16; Titus 2:3-5)

7. HUMAN SEXUALITY:

The human body and the capacity for sexual relationship, enjoyment, and reproduction are God's gifts to be received in an attitude of thanksgiving, wonder, and joyful worship. We rejoice that God created male and female as sexual beings and we affirm that sexual intercourse within marriage is good, desirable, honorable, and consistent with person holiness. Parents are to convey such attitudes to children along with providing factual information. Parents and churches have a God-assigned responsibility to provide moral guidance by word and by example so that God's gift of sex will be used in ways honoring Jesus Christ.

We deplore distorted, unbiblical and sinful sexual attitudes and practices, both within and outside of marriage, which contribute to the breakdown of the family. We resolve to resist the moral decline in our society, to teach that sex is to be enjoyed with mutual respect and fulfillment within marriage, and to proclaim that ultimate control results from Christian maturation which is brought about by the power of the Holy Spirit through the fellowship of the faithful and through happy, useful service to Christ.

8. HOMOSEXUALITY:

We affirm that sexual unions between persons of the same sex are unbiblical and sinful, a perversion of the divine plan of the Creator. We oppose attempts by such homosexual unions to form unisex families through adoption, or foster-parenthood of children.

While we acknowledge the Bible teaches homosexuality to be sinful, we recognize that a homosexual orientation can be the result of having been sinned against. We oppose the unjust and unkind treatment given to homosexuals by individuals, society and the Church, and we urge the Church, as the Body of Christ, to accept such individuals as needing understanding, forgiveness, encouragement, and spiritual support.

We pledge ourselves to minister to those who are homosexually oriented in order to help them to change their life-style in a manner which brings glory to God.

9. BIRTH CONTROL:

We acknowledge that Christians differ in their views on birth control and we respect these differences in the light of scripture's almost total silence on this subject. God, at the time of creation, commanded mankind to be fruitful and multiply and we rejoice in the birth of children as a heritage and gift from God. We are deeply concerned about the realities of overpopulation, world hunger, and the harmful effects that overpopulation can have on the environment and on individual families. We encourage Christian couples to limit the size of their families, in a way that is not at variance with Biblical teaching and to keep family size to the number of children that can be nourished and taught effectively.

(Gen. 1:38; 38:9-10; Ps. 127:4-5; Prov. 22:6; Eph. 5:17; I Tim. 5:8)

10. ABORTION:

We acknowledge that Christians differ in their view concerning the time when personhood begins, but we agree that God has admonished us to choose life instead of death, and has set penalties for those who would, even accidentally, cause a pregnant woman to be injured in such a way that an unborn child is harmed. We believe that compassion for distressed mothers and families, and concern for unborn children require us to offer spiritual guidance and material solace consistent with the teachings of God's Word. We urge the church to influence the social-moral climate in which unintended pregnancies occur.

We see no grounds on which Christians who are concerned for all human life and for the well-being of the family can condone the free and easy practice of abortion as it now exists in our society. At the same time, we exhort the church to show compassion for those who suffer because of the abortion experience.

11. THE CHRISTIAN FAMILY AND THE CHURCH:

We affirm that the family as a unit is not self-sufficient and self-contained as a body of believers. Rather, the family has need of continuing support from other families and from individuals within the Body. The local Church is a company of believers who exist for fellowship, worship, teaching, and the development of spiritual gifts to the end that God will be glorified and the Body of Christ edified. As part of the universal Body of Christ, the local church is an extended family composed of nuclear families and individuals who are living apart from nuclear families.

The church exists to support, nurture, and equip individuals and families for growth in discipleship (including evangelism) and effective functioning. We urge, therefore, that families become involved actively in the local church and that they pray, worship and serve Christ together. We urge churches to minister to families and individuals in creative ways which build church and family unity, prepare young people for mate selection and marriage, educate families in effective family living, assist family members and individuals in their spiritual and personal growth, and give support in times of stress or special need.

DEVELOPING ALTERNATIVES TO ABORTION

Over one million women aborted their unborn children during the past twelve months in the United States. Most were neither physically or mentally ill. More than one third were under 20 years of age. None were required by law to consult the baby's father, even if he was her husband. Those who could not afford to pay for the abortion were subsidized by federal and state governments. Minors were not required to notify their parents, or to seek their consent.

Abortion is legal in this country and has become the second most common operation, following tonsillectomy. The United States Supreme Court, in a 7-2 decision on January 22, 1973 ruled that a woman's "fundamental right to privacy" gave her the option of ending a pregnancy until the moment of live birth occurs. She need only find a willing physician.

Those who advocated the legalization of abortion and those who oppose it are engaged in a fierce dispute over the right to life of the unborn child versus the right to privacy of women. Re-establishment of the protection of the law previously enjoyed by unborn children is highlighted by the "right-to-lifers". Those speaking against any encroachment on the Court's decision have rallied behind the "right-to-choose."

For the sake of semantics and image, one pole of argument calls itself "pro-life" and the other prefers to be designated "pro-choice." The distinction becomes clear by an evaluation of these labels in the light of what the Scriptures say regarding the unborn and life-oriented choice.

The acknowledgment of the pregnant Mary by Elizabeth as the mother of the Lord, and the unborn John's leap for joy in the presence of the unborn Jesus is known to all Christians. The Psalmist wrote of his awareness that God's



factor determining whether pregnancy assistance will be adequate may be where the woman lives when she seeks help, raising the question of whether discrimination is produced by geographical location.

The legal climate resulting from the Supreme Court abortion decision has permitted the creation of an implied national policy against life. Abortion advocates argue that to prevent discrimination against poor women the "fundamental right" to an abortion mandates that it be paid for by public funds. The Department of Health, Education, and Welfare (DHEW) in early 1974 issued an impact statement setting out, on a cost/benefit ratio, the price to taxpayers of publicly funded abortion versus the cost of prenatal care, childbirth, and post-partum followup. The statement suggest^{ED} to the United States Congress that it was in the best financial interest of Americans to structure services to the poor in a manner that abortion receives priority.

This approach to improving the quality of life caused a furor among many legislators and their constituents, and set in motion shock waves of reaction. Examination began of the policy practices of governmental agencies, public and private groups, and advisory committees which most intimately deal with the abortion versus life questions. One chilling fact emerged -- it is much cheaper, easier, and more private to abort than to give birth.

As Christians trying to obey the Word of God in an increasingly secularized society, must we numbly accept abortion-on-demand-until-birth? Can we, in conscience, abandon desperately frightened women and hope that they will -- somehow -- make the choice for life which God demands? Is abortion the best we have to offer?

Many Americans are working to blunt or overturn the 1973 Supreme Court decision. Development of innovative alternatives to abortion has only recently begun to be recognized to be a necessary adjunct to measures designed to alter the legal climate. Newly proposed federal legislation was introduced into the Senate Health Subcommittee, chaired by Sen. Edward Kennedy, on October 18, 1975

and depression. Positive feelings of acceptance develop as the pregnancy advances and fetal movements are detected. Pressure to abort due to the psychic strains of the early months can be reduced by sympathetic and patient supportive counselling. A woman should be able to rely on the interest of a continuing caseworker or clergyman who can follow her through the pregnancy, visit her after delivery and assist in the post-partum adjustments. Money should be made available by both governmental agencies and churches to existing and future "life-supporting" organizations to ensure that this kind of comprehensive counselling and follow-up is available to all who need and request it.

However, the present slim resources of these dedicated "hot-line" groups cannot match the millions of dollars in private foundation funds and federal grants for abortion programs that clinics, hospitals, and abortion counseling services enjoy. In today's climate, often the first contact a troubled pregnant woman has is with a minister associated with the Clergy Consultation Service, which is organized nationwide and was founded to provide abortion information⁽¹⁾. The Clergy Service, associated with Planned Parenthood Inc., is widely advertised and available. Although CCS claims to open all options, it has been in the forefront of the opening of not a few abortion clinics and admits that a very high percentage of its clients accept an abortion referral. CCS spokesmen have been known to paint abortion as the only "moral" choice when the dilemma is complex or socioeconomic factors are severe.

Training for specialized counseling in problem pregnancy situations is very difficult to obtain for today's busy clergy. Some may be relieved to have at their disposal the telephone number of an abortion clinic, particularly when their denomination has indicated its sanction by an enabling resolution. The abortion counselor may feel a tangible sense of accomplishment, unlike the despair which often accompanies attempts to help the alcoholic or the potential



sense of values, her maternal instinct, how much support she has from her parents, then the recollection of having had an abortion can serve as a trigger for all sorts of emotional problems."

Mrs. Sherri Finkbine Burrows, who went to Sweden for an abortion in 1962 after learning that she had inadvertently taken the teratogenic drug thalidomide, has publicly stated that she suffers from lingering guilt feelings and that she attempts to help other women cope with postabortion mental and emotional problems. (3)

Post-abortal guilt, manifested by psychological indicators and spiritual anguish, has not been studied in enough depth to publish extensive and unbiased conclusions. The federal government should be urged to register its concern over the conflicting data brought forth to date regarding these after-effects, by undertaking a long-term research project to study the ultimate impact of the present policies.

Church-related maternity care centers and Christian social service workers can contribute to the compilation and evaluation of information. Equity and fairness demands that research programs involving abortion data include professional personnel of the pro-life persuasion as well as proponents of legalized abortion.

There is presently very uneven and incomplete reporting of data on the demographic and statistical aspects of abortion. The Chief of Statistical Services, Center for Disease Control (CDC) of the DHEW, Jack C. Smith, stated in January, 1975, that "abortion may have a substantial impact on the health of this country's citizens but without complete, accurate and detailed reporting the true impact of abortion on health will remain unknown." (4)

It is generally agreed by both proponents (5) and opponents of abortion that more work needs to be done in the demographic field before any solid conclusions regarding its safety are drawn.



have little or no idea about the nature of responsible parenthood and even less insight into the reasons for her own actions which have led to the pregnancy. The single young mother often struggles to survive on meager funds, isolated from her peers, alienated from her family, and stunted in her emotional and social development. Children of these mothers may suffer even worse deprivations.

By working together, the public and voluntary sectors can do much to help these young single heads of families. Further unintended pregnancies can also be reduced by involvement after the baby is delivered to assist the young mother's development into a maturing woman able to make responsible decisions about both her own and her child's future.

CHILD CARE SERVICES

There is a compelling need for the provision of child care services when mothers must leave their homes to work or to further their educations. The well-run day care facility can be viewed as a positive alternative to abortion. For many pregnant women, the knowledge that they will be the sole support of themselves and their baby, but must remain at home to care for the child and be compelled by circumstances to seek welfare support instead of a job is sufficient motivation to seek abortion.

Care for children under the age of three years presents special problems, as the child-adult ratio must be very low to achieve the individualized program necessary for healthy mental and emotional development. (6) At present, this kind of service is lacking in most child care programs, and yet it is the most needed for the new mother if she is not to become a candidate for continuing assistance.

Child care centers should be sensitive to, and respond to, the needs and desires of the members of the community in which they are situated. Churches and denominational social concerns committees can work with others in their locale to establish facilities which will begin to meet the demonstrated need.



ADOPTION POLICIES

It is evident from recent United States Senate hearings on "black-market" adoptions that the rights of infants are being violated. Adoption exists to meet the needs of the child, but practices flourish which negate that basic premise and which are destructive to the mother.

An example of the problems a single pregnant woman may face is illustrated by the Stanley decision, which has been interpreted by some lower courts to mean that efforts to find and consult the baby's father must be made prior to replacement of a child for adoption. The attendant publicity and legal action resulting from this alone discourages many women from continuing a pregnancy or from relinquishing a child for placement in a waiting qualified family.

Further identification of weaknesses in adoption policies have highlighted the practice of pregnant women being intercepted by "counseling services" which are often associated with abortion clinics. These "finders" either steer the woman toward abortion or, if she rejects it, then make arrangements with second or third parties to provide her with maintenance during pregnancy, and subsequently with money received from the adoptive parents. In effect, the baby is purchased by the highest bidder. These practices are frequently set up to be marginally legal. Those involved in the "finder" network defend their action by pointing to the dearth of providers of life support services.

GENETIC COUNSELING

Genetic counseling should be available to anyone of childbearing age who has a legitimate concern about his or her ability to produce normal children. Advising couples of genetic risk before they begin a child's life can help them decide whether they wish to assume the statistical risk of their offspring inheriting a metabolic or structural defect.

Procedures designed to diagnose intrauterine illness in the unborn child are laudable, as long as the intention is to treat and not kill the child if it is found to be imperfect. Making it acceptable to kill the imperfect baby



EDUCATING OUR YOUNG PEOPLE

"I didn't know what I was doing -- didn't know there was a baby already growing," is an often-heard cry as counselors listen to women working through post-abortal psychological problems. Pregnancy is seen as an abstract by most women until the baby has grown large enough for its kicks and wiggles to be felt. This occurs somewhere between the 4th and 5th month. Abortion clinics do not describe the stages of intrauterine development, and, if asked, refer to the unborn as merely a mass of cells or employ euphemisms such as "product of conception."

Several tasteful and accurate films depicting the development of unborn life, relating it to the creation of a family with joy and wonder, are available and suitable for use in teen and college age groups. Teaching our children to value human life, developing courses that reach even into the primary years, has been seen by Christian educators as essential if they are to grow up knowing that as children of God they are called to be gentle with those who are weak, helpful to those who are in need, and protective of those who are endangered.

OUR HEAVY BURDEN

The abortion question centers around human rights -- their interpretation and their denial. The unborn child lays claim to certain human rights before both God and man by the fact of his existence, judicial fiat notwithstanding. Regardless of the social or legal climate in which his life begins and moves toward birth, his mother is his first line of defense against pre-birth aggression. It is literally with her that his life rests. Christians must examine the pregnant woman's life situation, assess what is required to preserve her personal dignity, her mental and physical health, and her spiritual integrity before God, and then help to

love begins with the first days of unborn life: "Thine eyes did see my substance, it as yet being unperfect, and in Thy book all my members were written, which in continuance were fashioned when as yet there were none of them. How precious, also, are Thy thoughts unto me, O God. How great is the sum of them." (Psalm 139: 13-18).

Christians are enthusiastic about life and its mystery, and deeply aware that God has firmly admonished us regarding our choice in the matter. He has set before us life and death, and tamped the guidepost firmly in place: "...choose life, that you and your descendants might live." (Deut. 30:19).

To choose an abortion is to make a choice for death.

Our belief in and obedience to the Bible, then, will cause us to reject abortion as a solution to human problems. Yet, the number of women who do choose the operation is increasing sharply. Is it correct to assume that none of them are Christians? Most of us would disagree.

The argument for the right to life versus the right to privacy has resulted in a climate of increasing bitterness between the adversaries. An additional, ^{sub}bler, negative effect has taken place in the midst of the furor. The pregnant woman who chooses to give birth to her baby despite distressed circumstances has been almost overlooked, her needs largely ignored, and her choice made more difficult. Many are simply unable, due to economic deprivation brought about as a result of pregnancy, to see their way clear to continue pregnancy. Maternity home care services have shriveled, while discriminatory practices in medical insurance coverage make it difficult or impossible for single women and even **some who are** married to receive maternity benefits (although abortion is usually covered). Both public and church-related schools often segregate pregnant students, and some still deny them continued education. Only 13 states provide an additional payment for ^awelfare mother during pregnancy, thus encouraging her malnourishment and that of the baby. Adoption practices may require public disclosure of motherhood. The sole



designed specifically to increase services to troubled pregnant women and to erase discriminatory practices. Pro-life support is important to the passage of these measures. Even some abortion advocates have begun to notice the plight of the woman who chooses life and have spoken in favor of alternatives legislation.

Christians cannot remain inert, but must examine their posture toward the problems of less fortunate mothers. Even if others walk by and refuse to notice, dare we fail to offer our concern and care? To effectively help, it is necessary to know what we are attempting to accomplish and where the trouble spots are.

What are the conditions of life which confront women who refuse to abort their babies? What are their rights? What is society's duty to them and to the children they will bear? What is the church's duty? Are we meeting that duty? If these women have been largely ignored by the public sector (and much of the private sector), pushed into the background or eliminated totally from the abortion debate what must be done to correct this? An overview of current practices and problems encountered in the provision of life supporting pregnancy services can help determine an action course.

PROVIDING CHRISTIAN COUNSELING

Some pro-life activists have attempted to provide abortion alternatives with crisis intervention "hot-line" telephones and referral services. In most areas of the country, individuals working in these specialized organizations are unsalaried, raise their own funds, staff telephones, conduct training sessions, and do a generally excellent job with very limited resources. Despite their zeal and dedication, clients must look for backup services to inadequate pre-existing support systems. A limited funding base has required these alternatives groups to seek tax-deductible IRS status, which negates their ability to affect legislation that would strengthen the inadequate service delivery systems upon which they rely.

During the early months of pregnancy it is not uncommon for any woman, regardless of marital or socioeconomic status, to react with fear, resentment,



suicide. Having been a party to an arranged abortion, most feel a need to defend their position. Often cited is the unavailability of any other resource.

Concerned Christians can encourage the creation of a new program that will allow involved CCS clergy to withdraw from abortion counseling services. Establishment of a church-supported and clergy-sponsored nationwide Life Counseling Service should be a mandate. To assume that pregnant women seeking crisis intervention automatically are looking for an abortion referral is a gross error. The Christian counselor is aware that "informed consent" applies not only to an understanding of the medical aspects of abortion but to the spiritual as well. Often bereft and suffering, the unhappily pregnant woman looks for redemptive meaning to her anguish and assurances that she will not be forced from the community. Most will choose life if offered hope.

Jesus said "Temptations to sin are sure to come, but woe to him by whom they come." (Luke 17:1). Clergy who counsel and refer women for abortion must ultimately answer to the Lord, but churches can help to see that the mechanism is rejected through which he or she implements the counseling.

Post-Abortal Counseling

Abortion proponents maintain that the psychological aftereffects of an abortion are minimal or nonexistent. They make these claims despite the fact that no definitive long-term studies demonstrating this hypothesis have been undertaken in the United States. Caseworkers, clergy and others who have handled post-abortive psychological sequelae know that complications do occur. Frank Ayd, M.D., a psychiatrist, recently told the United States District Court for the Eastern District of Pennsylvania:

"I think the important thing^{is}, to put it this way, we can scrape the baby out of the womb of the mother, but we can't scrape it out of her mind and since it's in her mind, there are going to be various things which will remind her of the fact that she was pregnant, once was in fact a mother, and that she has terminated this. Depending on her religious upbringing, her particular





SPECIAL HELP FOR UNWED MOTHERS

Services to unwed mothers, many of whom are students, should help to eliminate the social stigma which much of our society still places on single parenthood. Many school systems, both public and private, insist that single pregnant girls leave regular classes and take special segregated courses -- segregated in the sense that only pregnant girls can attend. This, in effect, is a labelling experience if the girl does not wish to enter such a class, and can be interpreted by her as "punishment" for her pregnancy. The baby's father, often also a student, is never subjected to such segregation or notice.

A strong emphasis should be placed on encouraging pregnant students to continue with their studies. They should be able to choose whether they prefer to remain in regular classes, or to attend a special school, or even to receive home-bound education. Recent federal DHEW regulations require publicly-funded schools to establish classes for pregnant students but widespread implementation of the regulations will proceed only if citizens insist at the local level.

During pregnancy, motivation is high for acceptance of practical courses in parenting and homemaking skills. The majority of unwed mothers keep their children. Comprehensive training in not only the basic skills of mothering such as "how to bathe the baby" but also the myriad details which constitute the art of parenthood can do much to help young women fully understand and cope with stresses of everyday living with children.

It seems clear that we are not able at this time to prevent pregnancy from occurring among young teenagers in this country. Very young mothers are often thrust into an adult world with the responsibility of raising a child while minimally equipped to handle the pressures with which they are surrounded.

The problem of pregnancy in the young teenage girl is compounded by the complexities of her subliminal motivations. Out of wedlock pregnancies may not be unintended. Refusal to use restraint or contraception is an all too common practice among teenagers. The very young mother is quite likely to

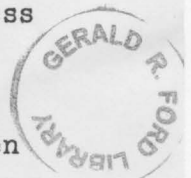
BETTER NUTRITION

It is a simple fact that the presence of the unborn child's dependent intrauterine existence alters its mother's own needs. However, as a result of a 1975 Supreme Court decision in Burns v. Alcala,⁽⁷⁾ mothers dependent on public assistance in 38 states receive no funds for the benefit of the child until it is born. The small additional payments, where provided, are barely enough to improve the protein content of the mother's diet. Ignoring the changing nutritional needs of a pregnant mother courts disaster -- socially, humanly, and economically -- ⁱⁿ the form of possible lowered mental ability of her child. The infant's brain and nervous system develop most rapidly during the last trimester of pregnancy. It is then that malnutrition will work its ravages on both baby and mother, ravages we can never fully repair regardless of subsequent investments in services and treatment.

Although abortion advocates have claimed that infant mortality has been reduced since the advent of legalization, the National Foundation-March of Dimes Annual Report for 1974⁽⁸⁾ points out that infant death rates are still appallingly high among those women most at medical and social risk. The ratio rises sharply; only 11.9 per thousand live births in the no-risk group, 24.4 per thousand for those at social risk, 27.3 for women at medical risk, and 41.6 per thousand for those at both medical and social risk.

Something is happening -- or is not happening -- to perpetuate patterns of discrimination toward poor pregnant women that make them a uniquely disadvantaged class. Malnourishment during pregnancy is a major contributing factor to premature birth, and low birthweight is the underlying or contributing cause of half the deaths of United States infants.⁽⁹⁾

As churches support programs to feed the world's hungry, it is important that we not overlook those who live among us. Nutritional supplements during pregnancy not only can offer hope and prevent abortion, but can help to save lives of infants after birth as well.



in the womb lays the foundation for the direct killing of the defective newborn infant. Emphasis should be placed, instead, on pre-conception counseling and on providing helping measures for families raising children with problems.

Christian counselors can play a vital role in helping couples resolve their conflicts concerning genetic inheritance.

RAPE TREATMENT TO PREVENT ABORTION

There is a growing interest in the problems of the rape victim. Abortion for rape need not be written into law since women given prompt adequate medical care will not conceive. What is most important is ready access to rapid, compassionate, nonjudgmental handling by police officials and involved medical personnel.

Aggressive and comprehensive rape prevention and treatment programs can be considered a definite alternative to abortion.

FAMILY PLANNING

Research into safe and effective ways to prevent unintended pregnancies can help to reduce the incidence of induced abortion. A wide variety of methods are presently available to enable people with varying personal beliefs to select one which is consistent with their own system of values.

Respect for the beliefs that motivate Americans to determine the size of their families should be encouraged, and the right to determine their contraceptive method protected.

Mere knowledge of the facts of usage and access to contraception is not enough to prevent unintended pregnancy. Education for both young people and others that emphasizes an understanding of the awesome responsibility of parenthood, coupled with sex education reflecting the moral and religious mores of the community in which it is taught can do much to reduce undesirable behavior and prevent promiscuity-related abortions.



provide for those needs. We can use our power as citizens to win positive federal and state programs, and exercise our responsibility as members of the body to motivate and direct those in our churches who are involved with social concerns to initiate life support services. If we neglect to do so, then we must seriously ask ourselves if we are not ultimately the ones to blame, through our apathy and neglect, for the loss of many unborn infant lives and ravages upon women and families.



Thank you for your warm and understanding letter of November 19. It is indeed true that the problems which we had did get disclosed to the press. A few days ago I had a couple of long talks with somebody from the National Catholic Reporter. He was all set to make a big article about the problem that we had and I tried to play it down, I hope successfully. I think we had some unfortunate changes in the statement but we got the thing straightened up and I was a little distressed that anybody from the press would want to make a big issue of it.

I greatly appreciate your kind remarks about my work at the Congress. I think the Lord was with us in some exciting ways during that week and I am hoping that the Congress will just be a beginning for a number of follow-up activities during the year that is ahead.

Harold O.J. Brown, who teaches at Trinity part-time, has an office right across the hall from me so we get the opportunity to interact informally at least once or twice a week. I appreciate the work that you are doing with ACCL and look forward to further contacts in the future.

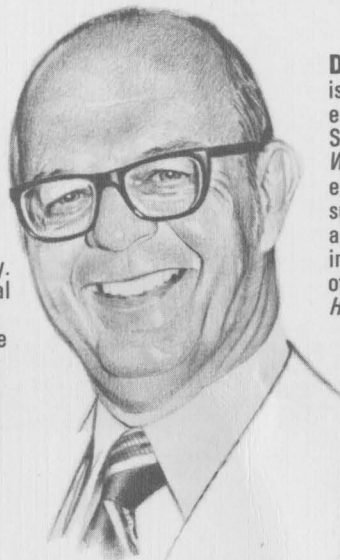

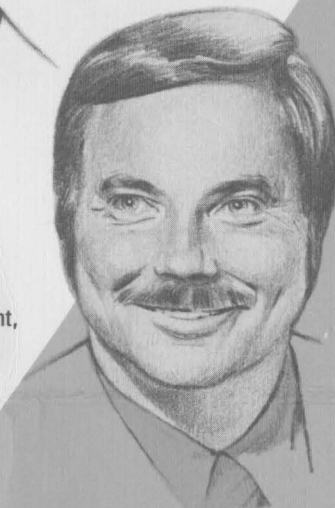

Dear Dr. Collins,

On behalf of Marjory Mecklenburg and myself, please accept our "thank-you" for scheduling a seminar on alternatives to abortion at the Continental Congress on the Family. We are very pleased that this most pressing topic will be receiving attention at such an important gathering of Christians.

If the program has not already been printed, would it be possible for you to alter the seminar title to read

"Developing Alternatives to Abortion"

rather than "Alternatives to Abortion" as referred to in your letter of August 28? The difference is a subtle one, but the message which we present is one of awakening our audience to the need for a new anticonsumptive positive response to the woman troubled by a problem pregnancy. The truth of the matter is that there presently exists no widely available comprehensive help for the woman who chooses to give birth. Her economic status is of little or no consideration in this situation, as the affluent college student may need the most complex services.

Our approach is one of concerned advocacy on behalf of both the mother and unborn child. For this particular seminar, we will slant the presentation toward practical responses that can be made by Christian congregations, and by the Christian acting as citizen.

The paper will be in your hands by mid-September, as requested. For your information, enclosed is a copy of the testimony which ACCL presented to Senator Birch Bayh's Subcommittee on Constitutional Amendments on June 19, 1975, discussing the role of government in abortion alternatives provision.

This paper is by no means a full treatise of the subject, but it does at least touch on what we have identified to be the major problem areas.

Senator Mark Hatfield was one of the first public figures to take an active interest in prevention of abortion by means of provision of alternatives. It is fitting that at this Congress his ideas should be presented by those of us to which he has been an inspiration.

Again, please accept our gratitude for this opportunity to speak on behalf of troubled pregnant women and their babies.

Abortion

We affirm our belief that God has shown us through His Word that He created unborn children in His image, recognizes their human attributes, and assigns them a place worthy of respect and protection. We acknowledge that God has admonished us to choose life instead of death, and has set penalties for those who would, even accidentally, cause a pregnant woman to be injured in such a way that an unborn child is harmed. We believe that compassion for distressed mothers and families, and concern for unborn children, requires us to offer spiritual guidance and material solace consistent with the teachings of God's Word. The intentional killing of any innocent human being at any stage of development represents a violation of the sixth commandment. However, the loss of life to the unborn which occurs as a result of medical procedures intended to save the mother's life is not to be viewed as a moral wrong, nor is it an act which should be prohibited by legislation. We see no grounds on which Christians who are concerned for all human life and for the well-being of the family can condone the free and easy practice of abortion as it now exists in our society. Introduction:

We, members of the church of Jesus Christ and participants in the Continental Congress on the Family, affirm our belief in the one eternal triune God who is Creator, Sustainer and Lord of the universe. We express our gratitude for His great salvation and rejoice in the fellowship He has given with Himself and with other believers. We are deeply concerned about the deteriorating state of the family. We confess we have failed to give sufficient attention to our own families. We dedicate ourselves anew to the task of strengthening families in our homes, churches, communities and nations. We affirm the divine inspiration and authority of the Bible in its entirety as the foundation on which we seek to build stronger marriages and better family relationships.

The Origin and Purpose of Marriage

We believe marriage was instituted by God at the beginning of the human race and was designed to involve the total life-long commitment of a man and woman to God and to each other. Marriage is an honorable status, involving mutual submission, companionship, love, respect, fidelity, sexual fulfillment, and procreation.

(Gen. 2:18-25; Ex. 20:14; Matt. 19:4-6; Eph. 5:21-33; I Cor. 7:1-5; I Peter 3:1-7)

The Uniqueness of Christian Marriage:

We affirm Christian marriage as a unique husband-wife relationship modeled after Christ's relationship to the church. In Christian marriage, the husband and wife become one spiritually, intellectually, emotionally, physically, and function interdependently as equals in accordance with Biblically prescribed roles. The husband is head of the wife. He is responsible to love her as Christ loved the church and he loves himself. The husband dedicates himself to the well-being of his wife, cleaves to her, provides for her, and encourages her in her God-given freedom to develop her own gifts and abilities. The husband and wife are joint heirs with Christ and share equally "in joy and in sorrow, in plenty and in want, in sickness and in health." The Christian wife subjects herself to her husband, loves him and respects him. Christian marriage is meant to be a life-long relationship between one man and one woman, indissoluble except by death.

Divorce and Remarriage

We affirm the permanence of marriage as the intent of God. We believe that divorce is contrary to God's intention for marriage, therefore, it is sin.

Divorce is also a profound human tragedy leaving a legacy of anguish, bitterness, loneliness, a sense of failure, and a deep fear of close personal relations. We regret the ease with which divorces are attained and believe that easy divorce and remarriage are among the factors contributing to the breakdown of family life. We believe that reconciliation is an alternative superior to divorce. The remarriage of divorced persons is inconsistent with the plan of God for mankind, but in the opinion of some believers, may be permitted because of divine grace and as a specific manifestation of the forgiveness and new beginnings offered mankind by the Christian gospel. The church must be a community of compassion, love, healing and forgiveness for divorced, separated and remarried persons. The church must also attempt to prevent divorce by clearly and persistently setting forth the Biblical teachings on marriage and sex relations, and by providing a therapeutic community of believers. (Gen. 2:24; Matt. 19:1-9; I Cor. 7:10-14, 39; Rom. 7:2-4)



Children and Family Life

We affirm that children are a heritage from God, given in sacred trust. They are not to be abused or neglected. Children are not pawns of the church, state or parents. Every child deserves to have a warm, caring relationship with a mother and father, the opportunity to develop a healthy self-esteem through loving parents, and the opportunity to be nurtured in an environment which models christian behavior and values. We believe that the roles of parents include providing for their children's growth (mentally, physically, spiritually, and socially), and teaching them from the Word of God in a spirit of Christian love and nurture. Parents, together, are responsible to teach spiritual truth and other information by word of mouth and by example. They are to discipline in a firm, consistent, loving manner in the home. The father, under the authority of Christ, must take responsibility for family leadership, care, teaching, and discipline. The mother is to help in child rearing (but not to maintain full responsibility for it except in the absence of the father) and is to have full authority, under the husband to guide the children. The role of the child includes becoming an obedient learner who is being trained to become a mature adult able to exercise wise and responsible discernment in making moral decisions. Children are to honor their parents, to obey them as they would obey the Lord, and to care for their needs in old age. Each member of the Christian family has spiritual gifts which are to be discovered, developed, and used to glorify God and strengthen each other within the family. We deeply regret the breakdown in family closeness and order, and we urge mothers and especially fathers to resume their God-ordained roles as leaders in the home. We oppose the unhealthy influences which seek to exploit children through pornography, drug abuse, and unethical advertising. We are deeply concerned about the harmful effects of television and printed news media, the lack of discipline and poor adult example in home and school, and the breakdown of family unity and cohesion. We urge parents and schools to raise and teach children in a climate of mature love, respect and discipline. We urge churches to give priority attention to the task of equipping parents to provide homes in which the spiritual, psychological, intellectual and social development of children is of crucial importance.

(Gen. 1:27-28; Ex. 20:12; Deut. 5:16; 6:4-25; Prov. 1:8; 6:20; 10:1; 20:11; 22:6; 31:10-31; Acts 5:1-11; 18:1-4, 24-28; Rom. 16:3-5, I Cor. 11:11; Eph. 5:21-33; 6:1-4; Col. 3:20, 21, 24; Heb 5:12-14; I Tim. 5:3-4, 8; II Tim. 1:5; 3:15; Titus 2:4)

The Single Person

We agree that the single life is a valid and preferred lifestyle for many Christians and one to which many believers have been called by God. Singleness and celibacy are, for some persons, gifts from God, preferable to marriage, and conducive to greater personal and spiritual development. We agree that the local church is intended to be

the family of all God's people. We urge churches and individuals to fully accept single, divorced and widowed persons into their fellowship. Segregation by age, sex, or marital status should be minimized in the church and single adults should be incorporated into every aspect of church life. We agree that leadership should be chosen on the basis of the Spirit's gifts to individuals and not on the basis of age, sex or marital status.

(Ps. 68:6; Matt. 19:12; I Cor. 7:7-8, 25-27, 32-35)



The Widowed and Elderly

We affirm that widows and widowers are to be respected, honored and accepted fully as equals in the body of believers. We are greatly disturbed by the dishonor and difficulties experienced by the aged and widowed in our society. Family members are to honor and care for the widowed, especially those who are elderly. The church also has responsibility to nurture and where feasible and appropriate, to provide for the elderly, neglected, lonely and needy in a spirit of Christian acceptance and concern. (Job 12:12; Ps. 71:9; Prov. 16:31; 23:22; I Tim. 5:1-16; Titus 2:3)

Human Sexuality

The human body and the capacity for sexual relationship, enjoyment, and reproduction are God's gifts to be received in an attitude of thanksgiving, wonder, and joyful worship. We rejoice that God created male and female as sexual beings and we affirm that sexual intercourse within marriage is good, desirable, honorable, and consistent with personal holiness. Parents are to convey such attitudes to children along with providing factual information. Parents and churches have a God-assigned responsibility to provide moral guidance by word and by example so that God's gift of sex will be used in ways honoring Jesus Christ. We deplore distorted, unbiblical and sinful sexual attitudes and practices, both within and outside of marriage, which contribute to the breakdown of the family. We resolve to resist the moral decline in our society, to teach that sex is to be enjoyed with mutual respect and fulfillment within marriage, and to proclaim that ultimate control results from Christian maturation which is brought about by the power of the Holy Spirit through the fellowship of the faithful and through happy, useful service to Christ.

(Gen. 1:26-31; Deut. 5:18 6:1-25; I Sam. 2:22; Ps. 139:13-18; Prov. 1:8-10; 5: 18-19; 6:20; 7:27; I Cor. 6:14-20, 7:1-6; Eph. 6:4; I Thes. 4:1-8; I Tim. 4:3-5; Heb. 13:4)

Homosexuality

We oppose the unjust and unkind treatment given to homosexuals by individuals, churches and society and we urge the church to accept such persons as individuals in need of support, encouragement, forgiveness and understanding. We affirm that sexual unions between members of the same sex are unbiblical and sinful, a perversion of the divine plan of the Creator. We cannot affirm attempts by homosexuals to form unisex families and oppose the adoption of children by such homosexual adults. At the same time that we acknowledge homosexual acts to be sinful, we recognize that a homosexual orientation usually results from having been sinned against and is not in itself sinful. We pledge ourselves to help those who are homosexuals to change their lifestyle in a manner that brings glory to God.

(Lev. 18:22; 20:13; Rom. 1:27; I Cor. 6:9; I Tim. 1:10)

Birth Control

We acknowledge that Christians differ in their views on birth control and we respect these differences in the light of scripture's almost total silence on this subject. God, at the time of creation, commanded mankind to be fruitful and multiply and we rejoice in the birth of children as a heritage and gift from God. We are deeply concerned about the realities of overpopulation, world hunger, and the harmful effects that overpopulation can have on the environment and on individual families. We encourage Christian couples to limit the size of their families in any way that is consistent with their conscience and not at variance with Biblical teaching. We encourage Christian couples to keep family size to the number of children that can be nourished and taught effectively.

(Gen. 1:38; 38:9-10; Ps. 127:4-5; Prov. 22:6; Eph. 5:17; I Tim. 5:8)



Abortion

We acknowledge that God has admonished us to choose life instead of death, and has set penalties for those who would, even accidentally, cause a pregnant woman to be injured in such a way that an unborn child is harmed. We believe that compassion for distressed mothers and families, and concern for unborn children, requires us to offer spiritual guidance and material solace consistent with the teachings of God's Word. The intentional killing of any innocent human being at any stage of development represents a violation of the sixth commandment and can be justified only as the lesser of evils in order to save the mother's life, or in instances of rape and perhaps in some situations involving gross fetal abnormality. Abortion involves moral decisions and is not to be regarded as an act that should be sanctioned or prohibited by government legislation. We see no grounds on which Christians who are concerned for all human life and for the well-being of the family can condone the free and easy practice of abortion as it now exists in our society.

(Gen. 9:6; Ex. 20:21-22; 21:14; Deut. 5:17; 30:19, 20; Ps. 8; 139:13-18; Jer. 1:4-5; Luke 1: 39-66; 10:30-37; Acts 10:34-35; James 2:26)

The Christian Family and the Church

We affirm that the family as a unit is not self-sufficient and self-contained as a body of believers. Rather, the family has need of continuing support from other families and from individuals within the Body. The local church is a company of believers who exist for fellowship, worship, teaching, and the development of spiritual gifts to the end that God will be glorified and the Body of Christ edified. As part of the universal Body of Christ, the local church is an extended family composed of nuclear families and individuals who are living apart from nuclear families. The church exists to support, nurture, and equip individuals and families for growth in discipleship (including evangelism) and effective functioning. We urge, therefore, that families become involved actively in the local church and that they pray, worship and serve Christ together. We urge churches to minister to families and individuals in creative ways which build church and family unity, prepare young people for mate selection and marriage, educate families in effective family living, assist family members and individuals in their spiritual and personal growth, and give support in times of stress or special need.

'Haste' at Concordia troubles Preus

Concordia College's board of control acted too hastily in accepting the resignation of college President Harvey Stegemoeller, the president of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod told students at the St. Paul school this week.

At the same time, Dr. J. A. O. Preus told the students Stegemoeller should not have resigned, but should have stayed and fought out the issues with the board, now dominated by Preus' conservative supporters.

Stegemoeller, identified with synod moderates, told students at the same meeting that he resigned because he doubted that he and the new board of control could have made it together to the end of the school year in June.

"I DID not resign as a threat," he said. "My resignation was to try to preserve the peace of Concordia."

Preus said he doubted that the Concordia board could have succeeded in firing Stegemoeller.

He told Stegemoeller:

"I'm very grateful, Harvey. You have done a wonderful job as president of this school.

"You have conducted yourself in a responsible way and I'm only sorry for the difficulties that have befallen you."

STEGEMOLLER resigned when the Concordia board ordered him to implement resolutions adopted by synod's convention in July in Anaheim, Calif., that were aimed at synod moderates. He is

now executive director of the Minnesota Private College Council.

Preus, who has headquarters in St. Louis, came to St. Paul to answer questions from both the Concordia students and faculty, meeting separately, regarding the issues raised by Stegemoeller's resignation.

In his hour-long appearance before the students, who stood and applauded when he had finished, Preus emphasized that he has no authority over boards of control of synod's colleges and seminaries.

Regional accrediting agencies insist that boards of control must have final jurisdiction over the schools they accredit, he said.

"WHILE I can admonish and rebuke, I do not have authority to say: 'This action must be reversed.'"

In an answer to another question, Preus said he did not want to see a split in the Missouri Synod and indicated he did not foresee one.

However, he warned that if the synod's doctrinal controversy continues the synod may find itself increasingly strapped financially as disenchanted members withhold their support.

"Certain auxiliary organizations (which he did not identify) are prospering mightily while the synodical dollar is shrinking," he said.

Preus said the organization "strongest for splitting" is made up mostly of synod clergy.

"PASTORS," he observed, "often have been much more radicalized than their congregations."

Preus conceded there would be a split in the synod if he and other officials "came down like gangbusters on certain institutions and people."

He said he wanted to avoid "bringing lay people to an uproar."

In response to another question, Preus discussed the status of Seminex, the breakaway seminary formed by faculty and students after Dr. John Tietjen was suspended as president of Concordia Seminary, St. Louis.

He said the Missouri Synod cannot recognize Seminex as a synod institution unless it comes under the supervision of a synod-elected board of control.

TEACHERS at Seminex, he said, can clear themselves of a doctrinal cloud hanging over them if they meet with and satisfy a new committee he has appointed, Preus said.

Preus deplored the "trial by journalism" he said now exists in the Missouri Synod, and he criticized two publications, the moderate "Missouri in Perspective" and the conservative "Christian News," as irresponsible.

He said the key doctrinal issue before the synod is whether God inspired the Bible as free from error. He said the synod also needs to give further study to the role and function of the binding nature of resolutions adopted by synod conventions.

Preus said the Missouri Synod remains in altar and pulpit fellowship with the American Lutheran Church, but he said the ALC had strained that fellowship by ordaining women as pastors and by injecting itself into internal problems of the Missouri Synod.

'EASY' ABORTION IS CONDEMNED

"Free and easy" abortion was condemned in a statement issued on the last day of the Continental Congress on the Family, conducted in St. Louis, Mo., under largely evangelical auspices.

The affirmation on the family also described homosexuality as "unbiblical and sinful" and called divorce "contrary to God's intention."

The statement was drafted by a six-member committee headed by Dr. Gary Collins, professor at Trinity Evangelical Divinity School, Deerfield, Ill., and the congress program director.

A spokesman said the statement was "merely a consensus of our efforts and hopes" and not the final word on an evangelical approach to family issues.

An early draft of the statement said "divorce is sinful," but the final version omitted that direct statement, instead calling divorce "contrary to God's intention for marriage" and a "profound human tragedy."

Remarriage of divorced persons, the statement said, is "inconsistent with the plan of God... but in the opinion of some believers" it "may be permitted because of divine grace and as a specific manifestation of the forgiveness and new beginnings offered mankind by the Christian gospel."

The affirmation lamented "the breakdown in family closeness and order" and urged "mothers and especially fathers to resume their God-ordained roles as leaders in the home."

It expressed deep concern about the "harmful effects" of television, films, and the printed news media, and the "lack of discipline and poor adult example" in homes and schools.

BOB MUMFORD, a prominent leader in the charismatic movement, has been dropped from the team of the Second World Conference on the Holy Spirit in Jerusalem because of his role in the controversy over "shepherding"
