


If you cannot attend MBI, you could have MBI come to you.







# With Each Other. Dr Against Each Other?

How closely does your family work with your church? Are you working together or do you have separate agendas, goals, values, motivations?

As never before the church and family-institutions ordained by God-are facing pressures from a secular society that is far more interested in doing its own thing rather than God's will. As never before church and family need to combine forces because . . .

The church and the family need each other.

Churches need members. In fact, churches are members. A church isn't a building; it's a living organism, part of the total body of Christ. Most churches draw most of their members from families. In fact, families are usually acknowledged as the backbone of the local church.

And families need the church. The Christian family seeks a relationship with God. It needs a place, more important, a community in which to worship, fellowship, learn and serve. The church provides that kind of community.

The church and the family feed each other.


The church feeds the family on the Word of God-through preaching and teaching. The church brings the family the good news that Christ died for the sins of all. And the church helps the family work out a Christian lifestyle-how to share Christ with the world, how to apply eternal biblical truth to the concerns and questions of everyday living.


And in many ways the family feeds the church. The family provides the church with stability, a sense of permanence, and resources. Family giving units are a key source of church support. Family units provide the manpower for the church the leaders, teachers, workers of all kinds. And family units are a key to church ministry, still effective channels for transferring the Christian faith. (See 1 Tim. 1:5.)

The church and the family should never bleed each other. Ironically, the bleeding goes on, as the family unconsciously expects the church staff "to do the job." Education, evangelism, even fellowship, are left to the professionals to plan, promote and pull off. And, as the church moves into the vacuum, it often creates an activity schedule that bleeds the family of time and energy. It is significant and encouraging (also ironic) that church boards are voting to close everything down one night a week so families can have some time for themselves!

Are your family and church allies, or adversaries unawares? Take the quiz on p. 5. Think about it. Pray about it. Do something about it . . . now.

# COMPETING OR SHE SAME TEAM?

A pastor placed his activity-packed church bulletin under my nose: "Look at that, Hendricks, something going every night!"

Howard G. Hendricks, father of four, is professor and chairman of the Department of Christian Education at Dallas Theological Seminary. Dr. Hendricks is a well-known authority on Christian marriage and the home. As well as being the author of numerous books, he and his wife work as a team in family life conferences and seminars.

"Are you proud of that?" I asked. "I wouldn't be. What if some family wanted to build their home life? On exactly what night of the week would you suggest they do this?"

The disturbing question rises: is it possible that some churches are doing more to break up homes than to build them? Are we engaged in a program of competition with the home, or cooperation? Do churches conceive of the home as an adversary or an ally?

In many churches today the home and church seem almost diametrically

opposed. The home simply provides the church with "customers." In contrast, we are suggesting a church should be primarily committed to training parents to do the work God has called *them* to do, not trying to do their work for them. The chief job of the home, as conceived by God, is to train the family members to live fruitfully in home, church, and society.

God's personnel officer, the Holy Spirit, tacks up His requirements for applicants to the deacon and elder posts in 1 Timothy 3. Very high on the list in both cases is effective functioning in the family—"one who rules well..."

Because how can you rule the church if you can't rule your home? If you cannot serve well in a limited sphere, don't enlarge it. If we are looking for a person qualified for leadership in the church, we are not to look at his public ministry only but also at his management in his home. If he cannot function in his home, then he has forfeited the privilege of leadership in the church.

On a flight from San Francisco to Chicago, I was seeking as always, an m

opportunity to share my faith. I was seated next to a young business executive with a small corporation headquartered in Chicago. It seemed the time was ripe to broach spiritual things, but the minute I did he bristled.

"The most vital concern for the home springs from the fact that it is the most dynamic means of perpetuating virile Christianity."

"Would you mind if we changed the subject?" he asked curtly.

"Not at all," I replied, "but I'd be interested to know why."

"I'll tell you why I'm not interested in Christianity," he said. "Chrisitanity robbed me of my parents, and I'm not interested in anything that would do that." Then he told me a sordid story of a father who traveled rather extensively as a Christian businessman giving his testimony, and of a mother who was busily engaged in teaching home Bible classes. Then he added with a touch of sarcasm and bitterness, "My parents were so busy leading everyone else to Christ that they lost their four boys, and there's not one of us who's interested. Now would you mind if we changed the subject!"

Succeeding in church and failing at home can be a cop-out. One spends more and more time at church where he or she is "making it," and less and less time at home where there is static. God says that if you cannot conduct your home life, don't try to lead in public ministry. Actually, you have nothing to say.

The average church has a child 1 percent of his time; the home has him 83 percent of the time; and the school for the remainder. We are too often trying to do in our churches on a 1 percent basis what we cannot accomplish. And all too often we are neglecting this choice 83 percent period when children are exposed to parents on a very dynamic interpersonal level. The home marks a child for life.

Columbia University spent a quarter of a million dollars in research, only to corroborate the truth of Scripture. Conclusion: there is no second force in the life of a child compared with the impact in his home. The compelling challenge to the church today is the training and equipping of parents to "train up" children according to God's plan.

#### Christianity Needs the Family

The most vital concern for the home springs from the fact that it is the most dynamic means of perpetuating virile Christianity. A Christian home stands out in bold relief in a pagan society. Paul wrote to Timothy, "Continue thou in the things which thou hast learned" (2 Tim. 3:14). What things? The answer is in 2 Timothy 1:5, "... the unfeigned faith that is in thee, which dwelt first in thy grandmother Lois, and thy mother Eunice." Timothy was a third-generation Christian.

Timothy was hand-picked by the apostle Paul to be his associate.

Now and then someone says, "I'd rather see a person who didn't come from a Christian home, but from paganism, and then came to know Christ, because of the excitement of his new-

found faith." There is only one problem to that: it is contrary to Scripture.

We are discovering at Dallas Seminary great limitations in the preponderance of men who do not come from Christian homes. Many men sit across my desk from me who are committed wall-to-wall, deeply in love with Jesus Christ, but who say, "Prof, I can't get it all together." A Christian home provides the greatest foundation upon which to build a life and ministry.

One of the most exciting things about working and ministering in this generation is to see the steady stream of young men who come to trust Christ, and whose primary purpose and passion in life is to provide distinctively Christian homes for their children.

Down through the years the greatest source of leadership in the evangelical church has been the Christian home. The disappearance of such homes from the scene is a very, very alarming trend. It ought to stab us awake. It ought to commit us to the proposition that the Lord must build the house. We'll never pull it off. There is no Plan B. God has committed Himself to the Christian home as the foundation on which to build the church. The question is, have you?





Jimmy's question is natural for a five-year-old, for he understands and uses words in their most literal sense. Derek had a similar reaction when told he was in God's house: "I want to see God's bedroom."

#### From a Child's Viewpoint

To the child, the church building is an intriguing and mysterious place. He hears it constantly associated with God. From such phrases as "the house of the Lord," he concludes that the church is the physical dwelling of God. When he also hears that God lives in heaven, confusion results. Although such misunderstandings can usually be explained to the child's satisfaction, it is

clear that children under six have a limited understanding of what the church really is.

The child brings the same thought processes to bear on his understanding about the church as he does on any other matter. His viewpoint is dominated by impressions from often irrelevant factors. Young children frequently express the uniqueness of the church in terms of some physical feature of the building, such as a towering spire, colored windows, rows of chairs or big doors.

Some children focus on special ceremonies they have witnessed such as weddings, funerals or baptisms as the most important function of the church. Robes, backward collars and big books are often vivid in the child's thinking as essential to the church's operations. These physical features and specific incidents dominate childish thought 60 about what the church is. Four-yearold Jennie protested that an outdoor worship service "really isn't church ! 'cause I don't have on my white shoes." The young child is likely to fasten his attention on some nonessential factor. Then he convinces himself that is what the church is all about.

#### Helping a Child Understand

The meaning of specific acts of worship are difficult for a child to grasp.

I took a piece of living clay,
And gently formed it day by day;
And molded it with power and art,
A young child's soft and yielding heart.
I came again when years were gone,
It was a man I looked upon.
He still the early impress wore,
And I could change it never more.

He interprets the things he sees and the words he hears quite literally. Since many of the church sacraments and ceremonies are concealed in symbolism, his understanding at best is very superficial. The Lord's Supper, for example, is beyond the young child's understanding, even though he may be able to use the appropriate verbal labels. One thoughtful parent explained, "The Lord Jesus tells us in the Bible to have this special time so we will remember how very much He loves us."

"When my mommy gives me a bath she takes my clothes off," was Angie's declaration upon observing her first water baptismal service. The physical properties of baptism tend to dominate the young child's thinking to the exclusion of the symbolic meaning of the act. Observing these dramatic portrayals does raise questions for the child. The explanations adults give need to be phrased simply, using words the child understands.

Offerings intrigue a young child. Five-year-old Gordon surprised his parents one Sunday when he announced proudly that Jesus had been in his Sunday School room. Pursuing the matter a little further, they found

that the usher who came into the room to pick up the offering container was Gordon's idea of Jesus. Gordon's teachers had carefully explained that the children were giving their money to Jesus. And in Gordon's literal thinking, what could be a more logical conclusion! Gordon and his friends needed a more specific and definite explanation of what happens to offering money.

Also, since young children are not really giving something of their own, but are merely transporting coins given to them for this purpose, giving an offering has only limited value in their learning to share. Attempting to build a habit in a child before he has understood why he is performing in such a way is neither sound educationally nor biblically accurate. Parents and teachers need to explain in simple terms that "we bring our love gift because we love God." Also, showing the child items (Bible, storybooks, materials and equipment) his love-gift money buys helps to clarify this concept for him.

#### **Encouraging Good Feelings About Church**

While the young child's understanding of the church is limited, and his behavior often seems out of place, he does form strong feelings about the church and his experiences there. In an interesting survey on this subject, Dr. Ronald Goldman questioned several hundred English children. He discovered that their attitudes toward the church had little to do with their own pattern of attendance. Rather, the single most powerful influence on the child's feelings about church evolved from whether the parents attended church. Parents' interests and attitudes have such strong effect on the child that their feelings actually are dominant over the child's own experience.

Those parents, for whom church attendance is a meaningful part of life, can help their youngsters feel "going to church" is a happy experience. When parents show by their words and their manner that they enjoy church participation, the child, seeking to be like them, will imitate their attitude and actions. When parents display negative attitudes concerning church involvement, then this attitude will likely diminish whatever enjoyments the child discovers on his own.

The most effective contribution parents can make to a young child's interest in church is to attend regularly themselves. Their example plays a key role in strengthening the child's feelings about church attendance.

Conversations with the child concerning his experiences at church can prepare him for what he will discover and will reinforce what he has experienced. Rather than simply asking, "What did you learn at church today?" parents can enrich the child's times at church with such comments as, "Sing one of your Sunday School songs for me," "Let's talk about what you liked best this morning at church" or "Tell me about the story your teacher told you today."

Focusing on a specific part of the child's experience rather than on general topics helps a child recall particular events. When the child brings home

a picture he has painted in church school suggest, "Tell me about your picture." Casual conversations about these things encourage the child to talk about his experiences, often giving an adult opportunity to correct misconceptions.

Keep in mind that the child forms his impressions not only from verbal statements about the church, but also from the real church that he finds. Both parents and teachers share the responsibility for providing a situation at church that expresses to a child, "Welcome! This place is for you! It has been planned to help you learn of God in the way you learn best-by doing." Participating in activities appropriate to his age-level interests, building stable and meaningful relationships with teachers and children and participating in moments of spontaneous worship, all combine to make a child feel good about his church experience.


If a church could accomplish only one thing with a child through his first five years of life, it should seek to help the child firmly sense that he is loved by the people at church. In this way a foundation is established to help the child see the church as not merely a building, but as a group of people who love God and love each other.


#### Get Involved

Your kindergartner probably finds attending Sunday School a pleasant experience. And naturally you're glad for his interest. To better understand the Bible teaching/learning objectives of his department, talk with the department leader/teacher. Arrange to visit the department to see ways the objectives are accomplished. Also, inquire about ways you can coordinate your child's learning experiences at home with what he is learning at Sunday School. Be available to assist where there is a need. Your interest and enthusiasm serve as a model for your child. He's likely to feel, "Sunday School is important. My family helps there every Sunday."

During these years of early childhood your child is building a foundation for loyalty to the church. Soon community projects, athletic programs and the like will also become important. Now is the time to concentrate on developing positive attitudes about his church.







Ralph and I have this philosophy of child rearing that says, in short, "Don't sweat the little things." We save our steam for really important issues and try not to make a fuss over the insignificant.

The problem is that the insignificant can suddenly take on tremendous importance. Take manners. Susan, Jack and Peter, I'm afraid, are several years behind their age group in mealtime etiquette. They tend to smack and slurp and reach and grunt, but as long as they don't fight for the last pork chop or knock over the glasses, we tend to ignore the noises with only occasional reminders to slow down. Better we should promote discussion of worthwhile topics at dinner than concentrate on salad versus dessert fork. Better we

should instill in them gratitude for the food before them than quibble over the proper way to sip one's soup.

But suddenly, last week, there was another church supper staring me in the face and the sudden realization that my children could no longer be excused as mere toddlers. At six, ten and almost thirteen respectively, one is expected to possess a certain refinement, and mine, I discovered too late, had none.

We had just three days to teach them what usually requires three years. Ralph began by placing a sign in the center of our table reading "Church," and we suggested that each pretend he was sitting there in the all-purpose room, and to act accordingly. Then we made up hypothetical problems and listened, appalled, at the solutions.



"What would you do if the person next to you asked a question and your mouth was full?" Ralph asked Peter.

"Spit it out on my plate?" Peter answered hopefully.

"What would you do if you dropped your fork on the floor?" we asked of Jack.

"Take Peter's," came the response. "I mean, we could share."

"What would you do if one of the boys pouring coffee spilled some on your dress?" I asked Susan.

She thought it over. "Well, it depends on who did it. If it was Curt Willis, I'd be mad as anything, but if it was Tom Preston, I wouldn't care. If it was Keith Saunders, I'd probably make him clean it up, and if it was Lonnie Hedges, I'd just ignore it. If it

was Clyde Rafferty. . . ."

The dinner hour arrived and Ralph and I discovered all the situations we had failed to discuss.

"Why on earth did you sit at that table eating spaghetti with your fingers?" I scolded Peter upon our return home.

He stared at me. "What else could I do? My fork fell on the floor and Jack wouldn't share his with me and you didn't say not to eat spaghetti with my fingers, so I did. What's wrong with that? I didn't drop a single piece!"

True, he didn't. He rubbed it against his cheeks, slung it over his shoulder, wound it around his finger, and stretched it across the bridge of his nose, but he didn't drop it.

# How to Be at Your Mate



Ten practical ways to face your angry feelings . . . and control them By H. Norman Wright

Like it or not, anger is a part of life-including married life. In fact, anger is an emotion given to man by God Himself. Our problem is that we don't handle anger very well. We tend to become angry for the wrong reason or we tend to express angry feelings in a hurtful or damaging way rather

than trying to help others and ourselves.

Here are ten practical principles for facing angry feelings and controlling them. Keep in mind, of course, that the wise Christian realizes he does not control anger (or any other problem) entirely in his own strength. He relies on the Holy Spirit to guide and empower. And never is the Holy Spirit needed more than when a person feels himself getting good and angry.

According to The Living Bible paraphrase of Galatians 5:19,20, when we follow our own wrong inclinations (the flesh) our lives produce evil results.

And listed in those "evil results" are hatred and fighting, jealousy and anger ... complaints and criticisms, the feeling that everyone else is wrong except

On the other hand . . . "when the Holy Spirit controls our lives he will produce this kind of fruit in us: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and selfcontrol" (Gal. 5:22, TLB).

With the background, then, of the apostle Paul's words to the Galatians concerning how to handle anger and other basic emotions, here are ten practical steps you can take:

1. Be aware of your emotional reactions. Ask yourself, "What am I feeling?"

2. Recognize your emotions and admit that you have the feeling. Admitting the feeling of anger does not mean that you have to act it out.

3. Try to understand why you have anger. What brought it about? We are often angry because we are frustrated. We suffer from frustration of our desires, impulses, wants, ambitions, hopes, drives, hunger or will. When you are getting angry, ask yourself, "Does my anger come from frustration?" Then ask yourself, "What type of frustration?" Next, ask, "What or who is the cause of my frustration?" Ask yourself, "What positive solution can I think of?"

Other reasons why we get angry include:

The possibility of harm-physical harm or emotional harm. Our security is threatened and as a defense we become angry.

We become angry due to injusticeto others, ourselves or society. Often this can be a "noble kind of anger" which is justified. But be careful and don't allow your righteous indignation over injustice become confused with another basic cause of anger which is: selfishness . . . the major cause of anger in most of us. If we are honest about

it, we get mad because we aren't getting our own way. We aren't getting what

4. Can you create other situations in which anger won't occur? What did you do to cause the other person to react in such a way that you became angry?

5. Is anger the best response? Write down the consequences of your getting angry. What is a better response? What would kindness, sympathy, understanding of the other person accomplish? Can you confess your feelings to him?

6. Is your anger the kind that rises too soon? If so, take some deep breaths or count to ten. Concentrate on the strengths and positive qualities of the other person instead of his defects.

7. Do you find yourself being critical of others? What does this do for you? Be less suspicious of other persons. Listen to what they say and feel. Evaluate their comments instead of condemning them. They may have something to offer to you. Does your criticalness or anger come from a desire to make yourself feel better? Are your opinions always accurate or could they be improved? Slow down in your speech and reactions toward others. Watch your gestures and expressions as they may convey rejection and criticism of the other person. Can you express appreciation and praise of the other person in place of criticism?

8. You may have a time when your anger or criticism is legitimate. When you express it plan ahead and do it & in such a way that the other person can accept what you say. Use timing, tact, and have a desire to help the other person instead of tearing him down.

9. Find a friend with whom you can talk over your feelings and gain some insight from his suggestions. Admit how you feel and ask for his guidance.

10. Spend time praying for the difficulty that you have with your feelings. Openly admit your situation to God. 22

Yes, it is possible to be angry in a "Christian way." Christian anger, however, must fulfill three conditions:

It must be directed at something wrong and evil.

It must be controlled and not a heated, uncontrolled passion.

There must be no hatred, malice or resentment.

Three brief sentences—easily stated, not so easily lived-especially in marriage where feelings run deep and sensitivity is often at its highest pitch. But it can be done-even a tiny step at a time. It must be done if you and your mate are to learn how to handle anger and conflict.

In his excellent book, After You've Said I Do, Dwight Small points out, "As a reality in marriage, conflict can be creatively managed for good; it is part of the growth process. Don't ever underestimate its positive possibilities! . . . In Christian marriage, conflictwith its demand for confession, forgiveness and reconciliation—is a means God employs to teach humility."\*

Ask yourself, "Do I really want to change and become more capable of handling anger, frustration and hostile feelings? Do I really want to creatively manage conflict for good?" If your answer is yes to these questions, then read Paul's prayer for the Ephesians (Eph. 3:16-21). Commit yourself anew to Christ and His love and take that love and the power of the Holy Spirit into your marriage—into the nitty-gritty arena where anger and frustration occur in various degrees almost daily. God's mighty power is at work within you and He is able to do far more than you would ever dare to ask or dream of-beyond your highest prayer, desires, thoughts or hopes!

#### How to Put This Article into Practice

1. Describe the behavior or attitude that you want to change (for example: anger, anxiety, quarreling, yelling, etc.).

2. List several very personal reasons for giving up this behavior or attitude. 3. Motivation to change is very important. From your reasons for giving up the behavior or attitude, select the most important reason. Write it down.

4. Begin to think about how you should change your behavior if you wish to succeed. Write these down.

5. Adopt a positive attitude. What has been your attitude toward changing this in the past? Describe. Indicate what attitude you are going to have now. How will you maintain this new attitude? Write down your answer.

6. Whenever you eliminate a behavior or attitude that you dislike, often a vacuum or void will remain. Frequently a person prefers the bad or poor behavior to his emptiness so he reverts back to the previous pattern. In order for this not to happen, substitute a POSITIVE BEHAVIOR in place of the negative. Describe what you can substitute for the behavior or attitude that you are giving up.

#### Questions and answers on this month's theme: "The Church and the Family"

#### HOW CAN WE EMPHASIZE CHURCH IN A FAMILY NIGHT AT HOME?

Very easily. Here's the outline: Week 1: "Why Go to Church?"

Week 2: "What Do We Do at Church?"

Week 3: "How Do We Feel at Church?" Week 4: "What Can We Do for Our

Church?"

The emphasis is on helping family members understand why Christians gather for worship one day a week and why they do certain things during church service. There are also opportunities to explore attitudes family members have toward church and to think together of things the family can do to help their church in a specific way.

#### WHY A SET OF FAMILY NIGHT PLANS ON THE CHURCH WHEN THE HOME **NEEDS HELP?**

Both need help. Both need each other. (See editorial, p. 1.) The nuclear (single unit) family is becoming more and more isolated, less and less committed to supporting organizations and other institutions. Families often see the church as a place that offers programs and activities but feel no definite commitment to the body of believers who make up the church. These Family Night plans are designed to help your family realize that a church is more than a building where people come once or twice a week. A church is people who are bound together by a spiritual purpose and power to glorify the Lord Jesus Christ. Even very young children can be taught these concepts at their level.

#### HOW DO YOU USE THE PLANS WITH DIFFERENT AGE CHILDREN? FOR EX-AMPLE, WHAT IF YOU HAVE A CHILD AGE 4 AND OLDER CHILDREN OF 8 AND 11?

One thing to remember is that young children under seven or so need something simple and not too abstract. That's why we include sections called "If you have young children . . . " in almost every plan. As for using plans when you have different ages to satisfy, you should experiment to see what works.

You may find it best to gear most of the activity to the older children and just let the younger one enjoy being with the family. Take the younger one aside later and read a brief Bible story or do a simple activity. Another possibility is to let older brother or sister read or tell the Bible story to little sister or brother.

Another possibility is to sometimes emphasize the younger child, sometimes the older one. It depends on your children, their ages, and abilities. Talk together as a family. Decide together what will work.

#### WHY GO TO CHURCH?

With Easter still fresh in the minds of your family members, now is a good time to think with them about, "Why we go to church." The key idea you want to talk about together is that Christians go to church on Sunday to celebrate Christ's resurrection from the dead. Going to church is not a chore or a duty: it's a weekly opportunity to thank and praise God-worship Him-for what He has done in and through Jesus Christ!

#### **ACTIVITIES FOR FAMILY NIGHT 1**

1. To prepare for this series of family nights you will need materials for making the "Church/Family Album" (see sketch and description). Get everything together well ahead of time so there is no scrambling and searching on family night.

2. This week, put one of the children "in charge" of making dinner. Let him or her plan the menu and any table decorations.

3. During dinner, talk about why your family goes to church. Let everyone express himself, and keep the conversation directed at some positive ideas. Before dessert, pass out 3x5 cards or slips of paper and have everyone list at least one reason why he goes to church.

4. After dinner dishes are cleared

away. Dad announces that the special project for the month will be a "Church/ Family Album" that the entire family will help make. Get out the materials for your

At least a dozen sheets of construction paper, 11x17 inches, assorted colors. (Available in stationery stores or variety stores.) Two metal rings or two large paper fasteners.

To assemble the album, punch holes in the paper and insert the rings or fasteners (see sketch). You may want to add a cover made of colorful poster board.

Design the album cover according to your family's tastes and ideas. Print title in bold letters; OUR CHURCH/FAMILY ALBUM. Decorate with pictures, photos, designs, Perhaps you may have snapshots of your family, other church members and your church which can be used.

Note: If you prefer an easier approach to the album, use an inexpensive scrapbook or a three-ring binder and plain white paper.

5. On the first inside page of the album, print in large letters, WHY DO WE GO TO CHURCH?

Use glue or Scotch tape to fasten the 3x5 cards (made during dinner) to the page. Talk about the reasons given on the cards, dealing with everyone's card

in a thorough and positive way. Don't be critical if younger children put down such reasons as, "I get cookies and punch." Talk together about church as a happy, friendly place, where people know you and love you.

6. On page 2 of the album, draw an outline of a church building with people all around (see sketch). Print at the top, REASONS FROM GOD'S WORD FOR GOING TO CHURCH. Print down the side these Bible references: Exodus 20:8; Hebrews 10:24,25; Matthew 28:1-7 (especially in The Living Bible).

Divide the family into two teams; one team looks up Exodus 20:8 and Hebrews 10:24.25, and the other, Matthew 28:1-7. Have teams decide on key words or phrases to put on page 2 of the album, next to their reference.

For Exodus 20:8, key ideas are: remember Sunday\*: keep Sunday holy (special): worship God.

For Hebrews 10:24,25, key ideas include: do good, be helpful and kind, be with other Christians, encourage each

For Matthew 28:1-7, the key idea is remember Jesus' resurrection; celebrate (be happy about) Jesus rising from the grave.

Talk together about what it means to WORSHIP and CELEBRATE. Dad can summarize: "We go to church on Sunday to worship God-praise Him. We go to church to help and encourage other Christians. And we go to church to cele-

\*If your children are a bit older, you may want to explain the difference between "sabbath" (Old Testament term

for the seventh day set aside to rest and worship) and

"Sunday" (first day of the week, set aside by Christians

for rest and worship because Christ rose on that day).

brate-to be happy as we remember that Christ rose from the dead after dying for our sins."

Pray together and give each family member opportunity to thank God for church. This is also a good time to sing together-in a happy enthusiastic way. Teen-agers and older children will enjoy, "We Are One in the Spirit." (See ideas for younger children in next section.)

7. Use the rest of the evening for fun, games and special activities. For ideas see, "Just for Fun on Family Night," p.


If you have young children (seven years and younger) . . .

Do not use terms like "worship" or "celebrate," which are too abstract for their understanding. Instead of the passages from Exodus, Hebrews or Matthew, use a phrase from 1 Corinthians 11:18 ("Come together in the church . . ."). Explain simply that, "The reason we go to church is because we love God and the Lord Jesus."

For the Church/Family Album Guide your younger children in making a "going to church" picture. Lengthwise, on a page in your album, draw a road leading to a church. (See sketch.) Then 5 glue Popsicle sticks, evenly spaced along the road, to represent your family members. Draw heads on top of the sticks. Cut garment shapes from fabric scraps and glue them on the front of the sticks. (See sketch.)

Sing as you work. To the tune of, "Farmer in the Dell" sing: "It's fun to go to church . . . it's fun to go to church . . . with all the ones in my family . . . it's fun to go to church!"

Pray briefly with your young child and -



thank God for the Lord Jesus and for church.

#### If you have teen-agers . . .

Use these "What would you do if???" situations to get discussion and exchange of ideas going:

1. What would you do if . . . you were tired and didn't want to get up for church?

2. What would you do if . . . a friend asked you why your family goes to church so much?

2. Enjoy a simple family dinner—maybe soup and sandwiches, with cookies and milk for dessert. Tip for cleanup: race the clock. Can cleanup be finished in less than 15 minutes?

3. Gather the family together and open the Church/Family Album you started last week. Quickly review what went into the album under last week's heading. "Why We Go to Church."

4. Appoint someone to letter across the top of a new page, "What We Do at Church." But before working in the album take time out for a change of scene.

5. Explain that for the next 30 minutes you are going to be a diffferent family—a "pretend" family that has never been to church. Not one of you has ever seen what happens in a church service. But recently something wonderful and exciting has happened. Someone told you about God, how great, powerful and loving He is; how He created the world and everything in it, including each one of you. You've also come to understand that God wants people to love Him, to accept His love and come to Him in worship. Because of all this your family has decided to plan a special kind of program or meeting where you can join together to praise God and show Him your love. Remember that none of you has ever seen such a meeting and all you have for a planning guide are the verses from the Bible that are listed on the poster.

6. Divide the family into two groups. Have groups work separately for 6-8 minutes reading the verses listed on the poster slowly and carefully looking for words that tell you something you can do

in your meeting. List every "do" word or phrase you can discover. (Sing, give glory, worship, praise, pray, etc.) At the end of 8 minutes have groups compare lists and make a plan for your worship meeting. Write the plan in your Church/ Family Album.

Then . . . using the plan, have your own "mini-meeting" with everyone in the family participating. With all sincerity do each thing with love and praise for God. Try to feel as if it is your very first experience of singing praises to God, the very first time to thank Him and talk with Him in prayer. (Imagine-really talking to the God who made the universe and knowing He hears!)

7. When your meeting is finished take a recent church bulletin that includes the worship service in your church and compare it with your own service. (Oops! Just that guick you are back in your own family.) Talk about: How are the services alike? How are they different?

Paste (or glue) the church bulletin in your Church / Family Album. Pray together giving thanks for your church. Sing the "Doxology." Talk about what the words say. Sing it again as a prayer.

If you have young children (seven years and younger).

Your young children will enjoy acting out what happens at Sunday School or in their children's church hour. If you aren't sure of procedures call your child's teachers during the week before family night and find out some of the activities that are part of a typical Sunday morning.

In any event, guide the child's pantomiming by commenting briefly, "Here comes Lori into her Sunday School room. First, she gives her love-gift money . . . "

With this much guidance Lori will probably catch the spirit of your words and willingly respond when you say, "Now show us what you usually do next." Continue your simple guidance. Include singing a favorite church school song. The child will also enjoy using his Bible and telling you something about Jesus he had learned.

#### Mealtime Conversation Ideas

To Review Family Night 2

- 1. Read Psalm 105:1 as the mealtime prayer. After dinner memorize the verse to use as a prayer of thanks at meals during the week. (Offer a reward for anyone in the family who learns Psalm 105:1-5 during the week. Maybe everyone in the family?)
- 2. At the close of the meal have a family prayer and sing together, "We Are One in the Spirit" or another song you all know and enjoy singing together.
- 3. Repeat together Psalm 105:1 as a prayer of thanks. During the meal give each person a turn to tell about something wonderful God has done . . . point out this is doing what the Psalm 105:1 says to do: "make known his deeds."
- 4. Talk at dinner about how to make next Sunday a special day of rest and worship. Ask for volunteers to help with Saturday tasks that will make Sunday go smoothly. Make a list.
- 5. Talk about songs different ones in the family remember singing at church. Can you pick a favorite? Try singing it together.
- 6. Who has memorized Psalm 105:1-5? Listen while those who have memorized it repeat it for the family. Give praise and a small reward.

#### HOW WE FEEL IN CHURCH

In the two previous family night plans in April your family has thought about, "Why We Go to Church" and "What We Do at Church." Knowing the why and the

what are important, but now we come to the more personal how. This family night gives each member of your family an opportunity to think about how he personally feels at church-and to discover

#### **ACTIVITIES FOR FAMILY NIGHT 3**

1. Get everything together you will need for adding to the Church/Family Album. Include: drawing paper, pencils, crayons, sheets of lined paper, paste or glue. (Your family may enjoy working with tempera paints in a variety of colors.)

2. Enjoy a family meal. Go around the table with everyone sharing something he/she liked about the day. Before the meal is over assign each person a simple clean-up task. Ask children if they have ever heard the saying, "Many hands make light work." Encourage them to share what they think it means-then put their hands to work.

3. Get out the Church/Family Album and look at what you have put into it on other family evenings. As you leaf through it, review key thoughts: Why we go to church-because God established one day a week to be a day of rest, a special day for worship to God. What do we do at church-we meet with God to worship Him as we sing, bring offerings, and pray; also we learn more about God and His Word

4. Ask for a volunteer to letter a new heading in the album: How We Feel at Church. Talk about the key question for the evening: Is it really important how we feel at church? Isn't just being there what counts? Get ideas on how feelings and attitudes can help or hinder a person meet

God in church and come to Him in worship. What about when you are angry? bored? wishing you were somewhere else? or counting minutes until time for the benediction?

5. After you have talked about different kinds of feelings in church, divide the family into two groups (or three if you have a large family). Distribute Bibles and give each group a piece of paper with the following Scripture references: Psalm 46:10: Psalm 100: Psalm 122:1: Psalm 27:6: Psalm 95:6: Psalm 150. At the word "Go" each team has 10 minutes to read references and list words or phrases that describe the kinds of feelings and attitudes that help a person truly meet God at church and come to Him with worship. At the end of 10 minutes compare lists and talk over feelings and attitudes at church that seem especially important to your family.

6. Put out drawing paper, crayons, paper and pencils and encourage everyone to express honestly some of his own feelings about church. Maybe: how I want to feel in church next Sunday; or, how I felt last Sunday; or, the way I usually feel in church. Let each person choose his own way of putting his feelings on paper. Here are suggestions:

a. Write a sentence or short paragraph expressing how you really feel when you sing, pray, give or listen to the sermon.

b. Draw a picture that in some way expresses your feelings.

c. Use crayons or paints to express in color and design your feelings in church.



d. Write a simple poem. A cinquain is a good poem style for expressing feelings. A cinquain has five lines:

Line 1-one word, a noun

Line 2-two words, describing the noun in line 1 (adjectives)

Line 3-three words, action words (verbs) telling what the noun does

Line 4-four words, a phrase that describes the action (adverbial)

Line 5-one word, the noun from line 1 or a word that means the same thing.

Here is a sample cinquain that expresses feelings about something at church.

Music on Sunday Morning Music. Happy, joyful, Sing, Praise, Shout! Singing to our God Music.

Note: Don't be shocked or condemning if someone in the family comes up with negative feelings and says they don't like church or find it boring sometimes. Your acceptance of all kinds of feelings and willingness to talk about them will encourage openness and honesty in other family situations.

7. After everyone has shared his feelings, paste all writings, drawings, poems, etc., in the Church/Family Album under the new heading: How We Feel in Church.

8. Conclude this part of family night with the family singing the "Doxology" as a prayer. If some do not know the words go through them together before singing.

9. Use the rest of the evening for family

fun. See "Just for Fun on Family Night," p. 25.

If you have young children (seven years or younger) . . .

Read Story 44 from "It Didn't Just Happen" by Ethel Barrett (p. 160). This is the story of Jesus going to the Temple when He was a boy. Your child will enjoy you talking with him and helping him compare the way he goes to church and the way Jesus went to the Temple. Talk about the method of travel, length of trip, animal love, gifts, etc. Also talk about Jesus' wanting to "be about my Father's business" at the Temple-church.

Help your young child make a picture map of the area where your church building is located and add to the Church/ Family Album. On construction paper, draw lines to indicate the street intersection where your church is located. Letter in street names. Ask questions to help your youngster remember what is on each corner and on the street near your church. Encourage him to draw a picture of the church with plenty of children and grown-ups coming to worship God. (See sketch.) Paste the picture-map in the album and talk about how when we come to church we thank God for loving us and sending the Lord Jesus to show His love for us.

#### MEET GOD AT CHURCH! GET INVOLVED

Sing! Sing to God. Make a joyful noise. Pray! Talk to God. Praise Him. Give thanks. Hear God! The Bible is God's Word. What is He saying to you? Get out a pencil! Take notes. Write reminders to yourself, like: Try this . . Read that . . . Remember to . . . Underline in your Bible. Get involved in worship. Get involved in every part of the service and when you walk from the church you will say, "It was good to meet with God today!"

#### **Mealtime Conversation Ideas**

To Review Family Night 3

1. At the end of the meal read Psalm 100 together. Assign a verse (or verses) to each family member to memorize dur-

ing the week. Goal: to be able as a family to say the Psalm from memory next Sun-

- 2. Instead of having a prayer of thanks before the meal give everyone an index card at the end of the meal and take a few minutes for each person to write his own "thank you" note to God.
- 3. Talk about everyone sharing in the offering at church next Sunday. Are there opportunities for younger children to earn money to contribute? Allowances to tithe? Plan for a special family offering of thanks. Read 1 Corinthians 16:2 and 2 Corinthians 9:7.
- 4. Check up on how each person is progressing in memorizing Psalm 100. Have a quick "practice" session.
- 5. At the end of the meal have a special time of prayer for your church. Thank God for it. Pray for the pastor, Christian education director, teachers . . . and everyone in the church.
- 6. Join together in saving Psalm 100 as a family. Make a "joyful noise" by all singing a song you enjoy. Help your family to feel happy that "the Lord is always good. He is always loving and kind, and his faithfulness goes on and on to each succeeding generation" (Ps. 100, TLB).



#### WHAT CAN WE DO FOR OUR CHURCH?

Being part of a church is like being on a team-there's something for everyone to do and everyone is needed. In this family night talk together about what your family can do for the church. Are there ways that each person in the family can do his part for the church? Is there a project that the whole family can get involved in?

#### **ACTIVITIES FOR FAMILY NIGHT 4**

- 1. Get together all materials you will need for working on the Church/Family Album. For Family Night 4 you will need crayons, pencils and an index card for each person.
- 2. Have a family "team-work" potluck dinner with different members of the family helping to prepare something for dinner. Maybe one child can make a Jello salad (with mother's help if necessary). another, prepare carrot and celery strips for finger salad. Mother can make the main dish, maybe a casserole. Dad can decide on dessert-perhaps buy some ice cream or cake on his way home from work.
- 3. During dinner bring up the idea of being on a team. Has anyone in the family ever been on a team? What happens to a team if only a few of the team members

play the game? Is every team member important? Why?

4. After dinner talk about how members of your family are part of your church team, like: I take part in a Sunday School class; I attend church; I sing at church; I pray along silently when others pray aloud; I help in the church nursery; I teach a Sunday School class; I pray for the missionaries; I write to a missionary family; etc., etc.

5. If your family is large enough, pair off into teams of two with older family members paired with younger ones. If your family is small work as one team. Give each team four index cards with one Scripture reference on each card: Psalm 100:2; 1 Chronicles 28:9; Joshua 24:14; 1 Corinthians 15:58.

Instructions: Read each verse. Decide if the verse gives you clues about how a person should serve God and take his place on the church team. Write important words for the verses on each card. After 8 or 10 minutes work together as a family to make a list of those important words. (For example, Psalm 100:2-serve with gladness. 1 Chronicles 28:9-serve with a whole heart and willing mind. Joshua 24:14-serve with sincerity and truth. 1 Corinthians 15:58-be steadfast, unmovable.)



Sending missionaries letters and tape cassettes can involve the whole family in a team project to help the church.

6. Talk together about how these words describe characteristics of a good team member, at church or on any team. Ask family members to choose the characteristic they think is most important and to give reasons for their choice.

7. Assign a member of the family to write the list of words in the Church/ Family Album under the heading, "When I Serve God in Church I Should Be . . . " After the list is written, different members of the family can participate in making a colorful border around the edge of the page using crayons and their own ideas.

8. While this is going on talk about a family "team" project that would be doing something for the church. Here are suggestions for you to talk about and choose

· Choose a missionary family to write to regularly. Younger children can draw pictures to send in the letter.

· Plan and make a cassette tape to send to a missionary. On the tape give report of happenings at church, in your family and town.

· Invite children's Sunday School teachers over for dinner or dessert some evening for a getting-better-acquainted time.

· Write a letter to your pastor thanking him for who he is and all that he does.

· Invite a friend to go to church with you. Or, think up your own family project.

Record your project on a page in your album and keep track of the results. For example, photocopy any letters written to pastors, missionaries or others and paste them in the album as a record of what you did.

9. Close this part of your family night by singing together and thanking God for your church.

If you have young children (seven years or younger). .

Do not use the team concept or the four Scriptures containing important characteristics of church team members. Instead concentrate on the specific act of giving to the church. Read from The Living Bible and use part of 2 Corinthians 9:8; ". . . give joyfully to others." Then talk about specific ways love-gift money is used in your church. Talk especially about how your child's love gift is used in his Sunday School department (to buy books, Bibles, chairs, record player, etc.). Also, talk about how "our love-gift money helps missionaries go to places where boys and girls do not know Jesus loves them,"

For the Church/Family Album, suggest to your child that he draw-n-color pictures of things his love-gift money buys for his own Sunday School room. Or, if your in family writes to a missionary family, have your child dictate a letter for you to write. S

Or, he may want to draw a picture of your church building with people all around to send with your note. Letter beneath his drawing, "Dear (name of missionary), We pray for you."

Combine ideas given above with Story 32 in Ethel Barrett's Bible story book, It Didn't Just Happen (p. 116).

#### If you have teen-agers . . .

Emphasize the family team project. Get started on it during family night and let your teen-agers do as much of the work as possible.

#### Mealtime Conversation Ideas

To Review Family Night 4

- 1. Review Psalm 100:2. Talk about serving the Lord with gladness. Why is a Christian glad he can serve the Lord?
- 2. Review 1 Chronicles 28:9. What kind of attitude does a person need to serve

the Lord with a whole heart and a willing mind?

- 3. Review Joshua 24:14. What does it mean to be sincere? How can you tell if a person is not sincere?
- 4. Review 1 Corinthians 15:58. Memorize it together. Talk about the hope that Christians have that gives them motivation and purpose for serving the Lord.
- 5. If you are learning, "We Are One in the Spirit," this month, sing it together, one verse per day. With younger children use, "When I Go to Church" (p. 18 of Little Ones Sing) or, "When I'm at Church" (p. 15 of Primary Children Sing).
- 6. Pray for workers in your church: pastor, youth director, Christian education director, Sunday School teachers. deacons, elders. Thank God for what they do and also be sure to ask God to guide you to ways you can help.

Use the following ideas for times of recreation and fun on your family nights-after your meal and Bible learning activities.

1. Make-your-own sundaes are fun to make and delicious to eat. In addition to a flavor or two of ice cream, use a variety of syrups (chocolate, butterscotch, caramel, etc.), nuts, bananas and anything else your family enjoys on ice cream.


Each person can create his own dessert. Paper bowls and plastic spoons cut down on clean-up details.

- 2. Children often enjoy hearing about some experiences their parents had when they were children. Share an experience or two-something funny, embarrassing or exciting-that happened to you as a
- 3. Go for a walk together. Use flashlights if it is already dark when you leave. Listen especially for sounds. See how many different sounds your family can identify in the area around your home. Be sure to wear light-colored clothing and carry lights for safety purposes.
- 4. Ask your children to teach you some of the songs they sing at school.
- 5. Have a "kitchen art" session. Under mother's direction, collect kitchen utensils and gadgets of different shapes. Trace around cookie cutters, potato



An experienced counselor gives sound advice . . . for the divorced person and for churches

How can I face this smothering loneliness? How can I bear to sit down to one more meal alone? How can I live with myself and my overwhelming feelings of failure?

These are the kind of questions newly-divorced people ask me. And there are no easy answers. There is no school of preparation for divorce or courses in marital disintegration. Couples who choose divorce as a way out of their difficulties cannot be expected to know the many ways that decision will affect their lives, or the many adjustments which divorce necessitates. From my observations here are some of the difficulties the divorced person

must cope with (and churches should understand).

Divorce often affects the emotional and physical balances of life. The divorce process begins long before the services of an attorney are sought. The decision to end a marriage may be as long as two years in the making. During this time, in effect, people practice at being divorced. Therefore, emotionally and behaviorally, partners may be poles apart before the legal process begins. These factors help to explain why divorce is such a traumatic experience. It affects all areas of life.

\*Ray B., 26, lost interest in food. The food he managed to eat was digested with great difficulty. He slept irregularly and displayed considerable anxiety. His health, in general, deteriorated.

\*Pat S., 30, found it hard to concentrate. She often forgot where she was going and where she had been. Eventually Pat was dismissed from her employment.

\*James J., 27, began to drink once again, was involved in a freeway accident, and was required by the court to enter counseling.

A healthy grief reaction: first step in restoring the balance. Marriage begins in an atmosphere of hope in the company of friends with the words, "I pronounce you man and wife." It ends in a death-like atmosphere in words, "Divorce granted." The prevailing mood at the time of divorce then is one of loss.

When we suffer the loss of someone who is emotionally significant in our lives-whether the loss comes through death or by divorce-we react by grieving or mourning. This period serves as a time of adjustment during which the individual prepares to resume his normal style of life. It may require from six months to a year for a divorced person to adjust to his/her loss.

\*The grief reaction of Marianne E., 30, contains all elements of the grief cycle. She describes her experience in this way: "Marriage was like walking on a bumpy sidewalk. Divorce was falling into a deep hole. What was happening to me seemed unreal. The shock of the divorce was followed by the feeling that a heavy burden had been released from my shoulders. I felt isolated from everyone. Physical distress was constant. And I really felt guilty over the failure to make my marriage work. I thought panic would overwhelm me. It was my own hostility at seeing myself in such a terrible state that forced me to make contact with people again."

The important thing to remember about the grief reaction is that it is necessary for a successful adjustment to loss. Panic is the lowest point in the grief experience. Panic is followed by brief glimpses of hope after which most people make tentative contacts with other persons and proceed on toward normal involvement in society.

Sometimes individuals are alarmed that they have some of the feelings which surface during the grief cycle. Perhaps you have been concerned in this way. If so, a reminder is in order.

Accept the feelings you have. They are part of you. Don't deny them. Understand them. Talk them out with an understanding person or counselor. Denying one's feelings is a dangerous avoidance of reality. Resist the temptation to deny your feelings for that only gives them control over you. Claim those feelings, yes, even the ones you aren't proud of, as your own. Keep them in the ballpark where you can achieve control over them. Accepting and understanding your feelings puts you in command and enables you to re-direct them into constructive chan-

Defining who I am: second step in restoring the balance. In marriage persons are identified as being part of a couple or as members of a certain family unit. Divorce changes all that and makes it necessary to re-define who you are.

Taking a "Who Am I Now?" inventory helps a person understand who he is right now. Write your name. List the things you do, the social activities you're involved in, the roles in which you function.

For example, while Barbara was married her list would have included: wife, mother, Sunday School teacher, professional woman, and sponsor of the high school group in her church. But divorce changed Barbara's lifeand her list. She had to cross out wife. But at the same time she underlined mother because that role was enlarged as she had to assume the primary responsibility for the children still at \$ home. Her divorce made continued involvement in her in-law's business impractical. So she crossed out "professional woman," and because of her divorce the roles of Sunday School teacher and sponsor of the high school group were eliminated too.

Making a simple "Who Am I Now?" list helped Barbara understand something about the emotional turmoil she was experiencing. Seeing it on paper a made it possible for her to recognize the changes taking place in her lifestyle and to understand her changing identity. The next step was to tap hidden resources within herself, discover new interests and to seek out new directions for her life.

Obtaining an emotional separation from one's former mate: third step in restoring balance. Restoring the balance to life following divorce means cutting the emotional cords of the former marital relationship. While it is doubtful whether the emotional ties of marriage are ever completely severed, it is highly desirable that one separate himself as completely as possible from the former partner. Holding on means living in the past.

It is important that you work out a clear definition of what your former partner means to you. Unless this is accomplished, old feelings have a way of blinding you to all those things (the habits, acts, gestures, words, behaviors) which led you to make the decision to divorce. Old love is strong and lingers on. Many people continue to court each other without ever recognizing what they are doing.

The following situations illustrate just a few of the many ways couples perpetuate the marital relationship, even though divorced.

\*A former husband calls his wife regularly to "see how she is doing." They talk as they always did while married. When they hang up each thinks, "It might have worked out, if we had tried harder."

\*A former wife bakes the pie that was her husband's favorite and invites him over to sample a piece.

\*Former mates continue to perform the same tasks around the house as they performed while married. He trims the shrubs and mows the lawn. She does his laundry and mends his torn shirts. He moves back into the home because "it feels good to be with the family." a Later, they quarrel and each reminds the other again why they were divorced.

Hanging on prevents personal growth. Let go. Permit your former mate to be separate for your sake and his sake as well. Become alert to ways you keep the old relationship alive. Fix the flat tire yourself. Mend your own shirts. Be separate.

Facing some cold, harsh realities: fourth step in restoring the balance. The divorced must understand that:

1. Divorce is a traumatic disorganization of life. It destroys familiar roles, familiar routines, and affects all areas of life.

2. Society offers no role models for divorced persons to follow as it does for widows; therefore, divorced individuals do not know what is expected of them.

3. Society often judges divorced people as failures. Many divorced persons accept this judgment.

4. Many married couples find it hard to be themselves around divorced people. They are uncertain whether it is best to ignore the fact of divorce altogether or be lighthearted around those who have been divorced.

5. Those who are divorced risk being stereotyped as carefree, fancy free, persons more interested in sex than is normally the case.

6. Because of the traumatic nature of the divorce experience, some persons feel they are losing their minds.

7. Divorced individuals often feel alone and alienated from friends, relatives, church, and sometimes, from God.

8. Divorced people must often work through their grief alone as few persons understand divorce as a loss.

9. Emotional separation from one's former marital partner is necessary for successful adjustment following di-

10. The attitude of the divorced individual toward his own situation is the Continued on page 33

Here's how to communicate with positive effect . . .

"When it comes to discussing sex," said a teen-ager to his Sunday School teacher, "most adults are dishonest and evasive. I would like to talk to my parents about sex and some of the questions that bother me, but I can't. I don't feel free with my mom and dad."

It's no secret that many parents have

great difficulty keeping lines of communication open between themselves and their children. And on no subject is this more true than the subject of sex. This isn't surprising. Thinking and talking about sex is powerful enough to stir up all sorts of emotions and reactions. It's hard to talk about sex as casually as we talk about the

weather. The sexual relationship between a man and a woman is tremendously important. As parents, we're aware of that importance, and know a mistake in the area of male-female relationships can tragically affect a person's entire life.

On the other hand, we know that sex in marriage can be a glorious, beautiful relationship. But how can a parent get this across to his child? Not sure of an answer to that question, many parents keep quiet.

Because of such hesitations, only a small percentage of young people receive their sex education from their parents. Surveys show children are more likely to learn about sex from their peers, and many times what they learn is incorrect.

Yet, it doesn't have to be that way. Sex-related topics can be discussed meaningfully with children of different age levels in the Christian home.

Actually, teaching children about sex is a two-sided task. There's the *factual* side—helping youngsters understand the difference between males and females. And there is the *moral* side—helping our children understand what's right and wrong in sex attitudes and behavior.

Most parents agree neither side of sex education is easy. But the area of moral standards seems to cause the most concern. Often parents feel if children and teens know too much about sex they'll want to put this knowledge into action and begin experimenting. The facts are quite the reverse. It's ignorance in sexual understanding, rather than accurate sex

knowledge, that produces curiosity, experimentation and misguided conduct. Nevertheless, many parents still believe that what children don't know won't hurt them. And thus parents feel it's in the interest of *morality* to shield their children from knowledge of sexual facts.

There is no denying that teaching our children about morality and the factual side of sex is a challenging task. It always has been, but there are guidelines that help Christian parents do a good job in guiding sons and daughters in their growth toward manhood and womanhood.

Here are five basic suggestions.

- 1. Establish a home climate that enhances rather than inhibits sex education.
- 2. Be alert for teaching opportunities.
- 3. Be prepared.
- 4. Be sensitive.
- 5. Don't fail to stress the importance of the Christian message.

In this article we will talk about what parents can do to establish a good climate for sex education. In subsequent issues of FAMILY LIFE TODAY we will go on to discuss other important guidelines for sex education in the Christian home.

Whether we're aware of it or not, we convey sex education messages to our children from the earliest days of their infancy. A baby who is cuddled and spoken to with tenderness and love is receiving a type of sex education. An infant basks in the pleasurable sensations of being picked up, held closely and tucked into a cozy bed. He comes to understand how wonderful and comfortable it is to be close to another body as he is cradled in loving arms and stroked adoringly while he sucks at his mother's breast or drinks warm milk from a bottle. All of this is nonverbal communication, and the infant learns quickly that his body produces

perimenting. The facts are quite the reverse. It's ignorance in sexual understanding, rather than accurate sex

A second aspect of the climate we should aim for in the home is one in which children can not only sense love being directed toward them, but one in which they can also see the object lesson of their parents' love for each other. Families and individuals vary in the amount of affection they display through hugs, kisses and words of endearment. Some people are demonstrative; others (whose love may be just as deep) are not. Love can be shown in different ways, but the important thing is that it be shown.

A child learns a great deal by watching how his mother and father relate to one another. He can sense more than they realize how they feel about each other, their delight in one another (or lack of it), their devotion to each other, their concern, affection and enjoyment of one another's companionship.

A mother and father can show to the child the warmth and depth that is possible in the relationship between a man and a woman. Children see the smile of understanding that passes between a husband and wife, the kiss as they greet one another or say goodbye, the spontaneous embraces when they're together, the quick squeeze of a hand or affectionate pat on the head. All this and more conveys to children what it really means for parents to love and respect each other. This is a crucial part of sex education. Children may joke and tease about how silly it is to be "mushy" and "gushy," but underneath they are happy in the security of knowing their mom and dad really

care about each other. "You don't know how lucky you are," a high school friend told a girl from a Christian home. "Your parents really love each other! So many parents don't."

A third requirement for developing a positive sex education in the home is openness. This means that from earliest years, children are encouraged to feel at ease in talking with their parents about anything and everything that concerns them. It means parents will attempt to understand the child's point of view, taking time to listen carefully without stifling his honest expression of feelings.

Openness includes a willingness to learn and grow with our youngsters rather than trying to pretend we know everything and have all the answers. It means being willing to admit that we're wrong sometimes. And it means being willing to say, "I'm sorry," to apologize and to ask forgiveness of our children when we've been wrong in a judgment. It also means accepting our children when they express ideas different than our own.

Openness means being free from pretense and hypocrisy and sincerely sharing our thoughts and feelings. It means not speaking one way to our children and living out our lives by a different standard.

In this kind of atmosphere children will feel free to bring us their questions, doubts and problems without fear of censure and condemnation. Children don't want to be shamed, ridiculed, or chided. Children are people. They need affection and acceptance if their feelings and questionings are to be drawn

These then are the ingredients that produce an atmosphere where sex education can be communicated in an honest, natural and free manner.

single most influential factor of divorce adjustment.

Divorce is a cold, harsh, disturbing unwelcome reality which touches persons regardless of their social, economic, or professional standing. Above all, divorce makes it very clear that men do not live perfect lives or anything approaching perfect lives. Because Jesus understood this fact, He spoke to the prevention of divorce and to the healing of wounded lives rather than to the punishment of divorced people.

At the same time, Jesus made it equally clear that a man is held personally responsible for his life and is not relieved from the consequences of his behavior. This means that in the period of post-divorce adjustment divorced persons should examine themselves and accept full personal responsibility for any part of their conduct which may have contributed to the ineffectiveness of the marriage.


Sometimes, however, divorced persons hesitate to undertake such an examination. The rejection of divorce is felt so deeply that hostility and anger are tapped in the individual. These feelings are often directed toward God because "He allowed this to happen to me." Having laid responsibility for the divorce at God's doorstep it is easy to rationalize one's behavior. In a real sense this person becomes doubleminded.

Double-mindedness takes many forms. Following a divorce Christians may experience a conflict between the mind of Christ and the mind of the world in the living of their lives.

This conflict is especially evident in the area of sexual promiscuity. It is as if these divorced individuals were saying to themselves, "Well, I've blown my marriage. I've sinned, so why not go all the way." And with their emotions in control these people take the events of their lives and use them to rationalize their sexual behaviors. In time, however, these experiments in counterfeit intimacy cause inner turmoil. Guilt feelings surface and must be faced. Repentance brings the needed corrective to end the conflict of double-mindedness and life takes on new meaning and purpose.

Some individuals, on the other hand, rationalize their sexual conduct so effectively that they appear oblivious to the double-minded nature of their behavior. Oh, it isn't that they are unaware of the unacceptableness of their conduct. It's simply that they give more weight to their needs than to the demands of the gospel. And they intend to repent . . . someday. Till then, they, like Agrippa, will wait for a convenient season. Repentance is taken lightly, the consequences of behavior ignored.

But the tragedy is that while God lovingly forgives our behaviors, the consequences of behaviors continue to affect our lives. As individual followers of Christ and as members of the body of Christ, we must work out effective ways to say to our divorced brothers, "In your struggle you are not alone. Jesus has promised to be with you continually until the end of the age. (See Matt. 28:20.) He is there, present in your struggle to adjust, bringing reconciliation to your relationships and healing to your hurts. And the church as members of the body of Christ is there, because He has committed to us the word of reconciliation. (See 2 Cor. 5:19.) Jesus is actively present in the events of your life applying the soothing balm of His love and acceptance in order that you may find rest when you are tired from carrying your heavy loads. (See Matt. 11:28.) Beyond even these things, He is there eager to work a new thing in your life, challenging you to move with Him beyond the mistakes and & failures of life to a new creative involvement in the world."

**Communicating Trust to Your** Teen-Ager

"How can I ever prove that you can trust me if you don't give me a chance?" Mike shouted the words at his parents and then stalked out of the room.

Until a couple of months ago Mike had been failing in all of his classes, drove his car recklessly, drank occasionally with the guys from school and blatantly refused to follow any rules that his parents laid down.

But in the past few weeks Mike seemed to be trying to change. He had pulled up all of his grades to at least passing, he was more careful in his driving and he had been making considerable effort to cooperate with his parents.

Curiously enough, as Mike began to improve his behavior, his parents raised their demands. They decided not to let him drive at all and they tightened up on the hours he kept-overall they were stricter than before!

Apparently, Mike's parents had an ideal of what their son should be, and when they thought there was a chance he could be quickly transformed into that image they attempted to speed up the process by becoming increasingly strict. To Mike, however, their actions could only be interpreted in one way: unfair! The more trustworthy he became the less freedom they gave him.

Mike's reaction is understandable. How could he show them he could be trusted to drive a car or handle late


hours now and then if he never drove that car or was allowed to stay out late? Furthermore, how could he trust parents who rewarded his good behavior with greater restrictions? The result was rebellion on the part of Mike and distrust on both sides.

Fairness and forthrightness are both essential in communicating trust to a teen-ager. When Mike improved his behavior, for example, he had earned a chance to prove he could be trusted. The teen-age years are a time when a young person is reaching adulthood. Consequently he must increasingly be given a chance to prove to himself and his parents his ability to handle the responsibilities of adulthood. Within a certain framework of wisdom parents must let loose and trust. Letting a teen-ager know that you trust him with the car for the evening, not that he's just conned you into letting him use it, tends to make that teen-ager want to prove worthy of that trust. Trust breeds trust.

On the other hand, if the teen-ager fails to fulfill the responsibilities of that trust and misuses the car, he needs to hear that from his parents. The father who says to his daughter, "I can't trust you" may be expressing a valid feeling. But the same father shows wisdom when he puts the responsibility for trust into his daughter's hands where it belongs by saying: "When you prove that you can go out on a school night, be \square depended upon to come home at our agreed hour, then you will be allowed " to go out. Until then you can only go out nights on the weekend." In fact, the daughter, Wendy, proved in a short period of time that she could be trusted by being responsible about doing household tasks and by her handling of her nights out on weekends. Once she had shown that she could be trusted her parents responded fairly and al-

lowed her opportunities to prove that trust.

Waiting too long to trust and trusting when there's no basis for such trust can be equally disastrous. Trust must be earned, but then again it can only be shown when a parent takes the first step and provides the opportunity for the teen-ager to prove himself.

revelations—with the expected accompanying claims come and go. The tendency to place emphasis on some tangent aspect of Scripture is always with us, it seems.

Currently the words submission, discipleship, relationships and covering are prominent. Sadly, even though these are good words, in some areas they are causing schisms and misunderstandings. Questions such as "To whom are you submitted?" are being used as a test of fellowship.

These times are similar to the days when the Apostle Paul wrote the churches in Galatia saving, "I marvel that ye are so soon moved from him that called you into the grace of Christ unto another Gospel: Which is not another; but there be some that trouble you, and would pervert the Gospel of Christ."

A publisher has the edge on most people because he sees the volume of manuscripts which reflect the divergent thinking of people all over the world. Much of the teaching on discipleship seems solid. But there are problems. Should the "shepherds" submit to shepherds outside their locality? Are the discipleship groups actually "churches?" Should the shepherds receive tithes from the "sheep"-or as one shepherd puts it, "I handle the wool.?" And finally, how do sheep ever get to be shepherds?

Reports are pouring in that people are being "disfellowshipped" because they do not submit to some elder who in turn submits to another elder hundreds of miles away. It makes me wonder whether even the Apostle Paul would be accepted today in some groups. After all, he wrote: "But I certify you, brethren, that the Gospel which was of Christ to bear on the news of the world. preached of me is not after man. 

# THE DILEMMA OF DISCIPLESHIP



THE NUMBER ONE problem in charismatic circles today is charismatic discipleship. Is it Biblical? What are the problems? Why is there so much of a furor? How is charismatic discipleship different from other discipleship programs such as Navigators and Campus Crusade for Christ? What does present-day discipleship have to say to

For the past 25 years I have been involved in discipleship so I feel I have a leg in each camp. I understand the tremendous need for discipleship, yet I cannot escape my mandate to build the local church. Sometimes I really feel one leg is on the pier and the other is in a departing dinghy.

As I looked at the power and glory of the early church described in the book of Acts. I saw, in contrast, how anemic was the contemporary church. It was merely a pale imitation, certainly unable to turn the world upside down. The weakness of the local church seemed to stem from lack of emphasis in five basic areas.

#### 1. The Priesthood of All Believers

I saw this as a theory in Protestantism, but not a fact. I knew Luther and Calvin had proclaimed this as a foremost New Testament principle, but I also knew it had never really reached the pews. The man in the pews never really had become the minister he was destined to be. According to the New Testament, every Christian is a minister. Ministry isn't something 4. Denominationalism he takes on. A minister is something he is. The theory of the Reformation was correct—that the laikoi and the cleros both refer to the same people of God-but the practice was almost totally lacking. It was apparent in our churches that the pastor was more the president of a business than one who equipped the saints. I'll never forget one of my deacons

who said to me, "Mr. Farah, you do the work, we'll pay the bills."

#### 2. Lav Evangelism

In the New Testament it is quite apparent that the burden of reaching the world for Christ was primarily a lay function. They simply gossiped the gospel everywhere they went, and their follow-up was extraordinary. Instead of a handshake and a God bless you, they incorporated these new believers immediately into a warm, loving family. They made everyone feel a part of the family of God. They shared their possessions with them, they bound them with a love they had never known before. Lay evangelism was really the secret of the early church's spread. But today...?

#### 3. Missionary Enterprise

In the New Testament mission, the mission churches collected funds to support the mother church. Yet in our times it was mother churches who supported the church overseas. Missionaries never really got around to establishing indigenous churches in the New Testament sense. Many years ago Hudson Taylor wrote that missionaries are only the scaffolding around the building. When the building is erected the scaffolding should come down. I wondered how it was the scaffolding had become so incorporated into the building that if it were removed the whole building would collapse. The paper theory was present, but there was no practice.

I looked around and it seemed everyone was intent on building his own kingdom. Denominations were spelled with a large "B" or "P" or "E" or "M." Divisions appeared on the basis of social status. None of these things could I find in the New Testament. There the local church really was composed of all the people of God in a single place, in a sin-

gle locality, including both Jews and Gentiles. Yet today a fierce competition exists that makes the church more analogous to a competitive business than the church of Jesus Christ. My conclusion: Denominationalism is a sin and has no place in New Testament Christian-

#### 5. Discipline

The story of Ananias and Sapphira, as far as the continuance of the purity of the church is concerned, is one of the most important miracles in the whole book of Acts. If Ananias and Sapphira had been allowed to lie to the Holy Spirit, if the early church had not purged those who broke the purity of its call and mission, the church could not have survived. And as difficult as Acts 5 is, it points out the power of God when the power of the Spirit runs high in the church. I suspect that as the church grows in power, we will see miracles like this occur again.

Desiring to become a disciple myself. I found myself drawn to a tightly knit, closely bound group of hard-hitting, two-fisted men who had great integrity in their ministry and who were dedicated to a total mobilization of the laity. If the church was to be the church, it would consist of men who were under discipline. Disciples.

In a group called The Navigators I found people who really understood how to mobilize men into disciples. I saw sailors, men from the streets, ordinary Joes, stand up and give witness as to how they were leading others to Christ and following them up. I saw stumbling men who had little education articulate their faith better than I could. After I graduated from seminary I attended a conference that was a kind of watershed experience in my life. I often found tears in my eyes as I listened

to men who had no benefit of college, some with no benefit of high school, who gave a more positive heart, he almost certainly will and a more tremendous witness to Christ than I. At test time and to my shame, I hardly knew if there was a single soul I had led to Christ. If there had been one, I didn't know.

So I joined this gap organization, and found that the New Testament was not a dream that someone had manufactured for the priesthood of all believers, but was a fact.

I learned that a disciple is three things. He is a learner, a follower, and a transmitter.

#### A Learner

Jesus said. "Come, learn of me..." A disciple must learn from the Lord himself. He must learn how to seek the Lord for himself. He must be able to find the Lord's will for himself. In Mark 3:14 we read that Jesus took twelve to be with him. This is the law of association. Jesus took them to be with him so they could learn from his example.

#### A Follower

"Follow me and I will make you fishers of men," Jesus said. These men had to forsake father, mother, and family for the privilege of following Jesus. He called them to leave all to follow him. It was a simple but effective way of discovering how sincere they really were.

#### A Transmitter

Jesus sent them forth two-by-two and they came back absolutely exhilarated. God had done the same thing through them that he had done through Jesus. What Jesus was learning? #### Today's Problems

Every discipleship program faces a fundamental problem: What is its relationship to the local church? Most discipleship groups explain that they are not a church; they are simply a service organization to the whole church. Yet in the present charismatic discipleship movement, its spokesmen affirm that they are indeed a church. This makes for a very sticky wicket indeed. How then can a man belong to two churches at once? Which one has the greater pull in his life? Where do his loyalties belong? Where do his tithes and offerings go and in what percentage? Who really calls the strokes in his life? The local pastor or the disciple maker?

There are additional problems. One is elitism. Elitism is a particular trap for the neophyte disciple. > The present charismatic discipleship melieu, however, has produced other unique problems. For instance, the present discipleship program is a church. There is a difference between a church and a work (ministry). Whereas most discipleship programs disclaim the designation church, the current move, sponsored and promoted almost entirely by a particular body of men, does not. Furthermore, this discipleship program believes in an extra-local authority. It believes there is an apostolic authority which bears power over areas outside of its own locality. It also enunciates the principle of tithing to a man, rather than tithing to a local body of believers-based on the example of Abraham tithing to Melchizedek. The "shepherd" is in turn subject to another elder (or group of elders), who in fact may be outside of his area entirely. His basic guidance, therefore, comes from men outside his location.

Recently a "disciple maker" told his disciple, who in this case was the pastor of a Lutheran church in Texas, to close down his church. The pastor, dutifully submissive, did what he was told. Now I know nothing about the circumstances of that particular church. It may have been a right decision. #### The Problem of Evangelism

Discipleship training without evangelism becomes a new legalism. The Bible does not say, "Stay and make disciples." Jesus said, "Go and make disciples." Disciples are made in the going, not in the staying. If disciples are made in the staving. soon they stagnate, and the cry of "legalism" is heard throughout the land. No discipleship program can long endure unless there is an active program of evangelism along with it. "Combat is the basic objective of all training."

Jesus gave the original command to disciple in the context of evangelism. The Great Commission tells us to go out and make other disciples, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost. It is in the going that the making of disciples occurs.

Discipleship has to be in the context of training for battle, for engaging the enemy, for setting the captives free, and for turning those disciples into reproducers. Without evangelism, discipleship becomes proud, banner-waving, powerless legalism.

Much of the present charismatic discipleship program is a solid transplant from South America. It has worked wondrously well there



#### Methods

Does the New Testament outline some system to help disciples reach their goal of becoming like Christ? I believe so.

For one, I am convinced of the necessity of memorizing Scripture in order to become a true disciple. Yet it is easy to get hung up on the method. Memorize three verses a week. Have a "Quiet Time." Attend Bible study. Predictably enough the charge of "legalism" is soon heard.


Now there's nothing a man does that cannot be charged as legalistic. Some people think it's legalistic to get up in the morning. Some people consider it legalism to brush their teeth, at least my kids do. So the charge of legalist has to be understood in the context of where it is spoken. If a person has engaged in the discipleship program and all he sees is the method, in a very short time he's going to cry out legalism.

But let's say he has advanced to where he understands the objective. If a man concentrates on the objective, if he understands that knowing Christ is the objective, and it is that to which he presses, then discipleship programs yield life transferral. Disciples are enablers who transfer their lives in Christ to someone else. They reproduce themselves. The goal of discipleship is transferring my life in Christ to another so that he in turn may implant his life in another. To be satisfied with anything less in the Christian life is sin. To try to do more is heresy.



# OBEYING THE LAST COMMAND



IT SEEMS THAT regardless of what you say these days, someone, somewhere, is going to try to shoot you down by taking the opposite view. A friend of mine works behind a counter in a local store. He enjoys talking about the joy of the Lord to his customers. One day, recently, he completed his transaction at the cash register and grinned at the customer. "Have a nice day!" he said sincerely.

counter and said sarcastically, "How come you limit me to only one day?" He then stomped out to spread gloomy stories about the man at the cash register who had no concern for his future.

No matter what a man says, there are some who will misinterpret both his words and his intentions. With that in mind, I am going to make some basic, foundational statements about the most maligned and misunderstood principle in the current move of God-the principle of discipleship.

Of course we have with us always those who deal in extremes, those who take any current teaching and try to turn it into something totally true or totally false. Some think discipleship may be the final answer to the world's dilemma, while others feel it is the latest charismatic error and smells like the leeks and garlic of Egypt. However, I do not want to deal with either extreme, but rather want to deal with the main thrust of what I feel God is saying and doing today—calling us to make disciples.

In Jesus' day there were those who felt he was a false prophet. His new doctrine spelled trouble to the status quo, both religious and political. Their answer to his "heresy" was to quote (or misquote) Scripture. With a flick of the theological pen they said smugly, "Search and see, there arises no prophet from Galilee." With a horrifying kind of religious complacency, flavored with doctrinal smugness, they com-

pletely dismissed the Son of God as a heretic-and in so doing missed God's eternal purpose for their lives and their nation.

I am concerned that many people are taking the same attitude toward the current teaching (and teachers) on discipleship. However, before you throw the baby out with the bath water let me hasten to say there are some real and vital issues being raised in the realm of disciple-The man snatched his bag off the ship, submission and the nature of spiritual authority that must be

#### Change of Behavior

Before we get into the scriptural basis for discipleship let me quickly say the basic reason of discipleship is that of behavior. If you are the kind of Christian who has his marriage, family and personal conduct in perfect order then perhaps you don't need to be discipled. If, however, you are like most of us who see more truth in the Word of God than we can appropriate in our daily living, then read on. You, too, need these concepts.

The chief characteristic of the training of the twelve disciples was that of being with the Savior. The idea was one of constant contact his words—it involved following his example. Jesus intended to alter their behavior patterns and impart to them ability and know-how which could come only from continual as-Jesus was training his. This is illustrated by Dr. Charles Farah's definition when he says, "A disciple of the Lord Jesus' doctrines; rests upon his sacrifice; imbibes his Spirit he is commissioned by the Lord. and imitates his example."

Surely this is the implication behind the "great commission" in Matthew 28:19-20. Although the King nations," the Amplified Bible cor-

rectly says, "Go then and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them into the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit; Teaching them to observe everything that I have commanded you, and lo, I am with you all the daysperpetually, uniformly and on every occasion-to the (very) close and consummation of the age. Amen-So let it be."

The Living Bible says, "Therefore go and make disciples in all the nations, baptizing them into the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teach these new disciples to obey all the commands I have given you; and be sure of this-that I am with you always, even to the end of the world."


The Lord's ultimate aim was that all should be discipled. By his instruction it should come in three distinct steps:

First: The door to discipleship is water baptism which opens us to a whole new life. The old is buried and the promises and privileges of the Kingdom now become applicable.

From Sheep to Saints

Although the word disciple does not appear in the epistles, it does appear some twenty-eight times in the Acts of the Apostles indicating that discipleship was an intricate part of the early church life.

"And after they had preached the Gospel to that city and had made many disciples, they returned to Lystra and to Iconium and to Antioch." (Acts 14:21 NASB)

"And when he had come to Jerusalem, he was trying to associate with the disciples; and they were all afraid of him, not believing that he was a disciple." (Acts 9:26 NASB)

Thus it seems that the book of Acts is the transition from disciple to brothers and saints as used in the epistles. Dr. Sanday says, "After His departure the names given indicated their relation to each other and to the society." Disciples were called Christians. Mutual discipleship involves us in mutual brotherhood, and is not intended to create artificial or ecclesiastical distinctions.

Discipleship, then, becomes that period of training and discipline leading toward our placement and function as brothers and saints in Christ Jesus. Jesus called, trained and then commissioned the first disciples to institute a process of discipleship which, if carried out correctly would follow the same pattern: calling, training and releasing. If such a program were instituted

It is no wonder, then, that at this precise point we have the greatest objections and misunderstandings. To tell a man that in order to follow Jesus he has to sell all he has and give to the poor, or to tell a man to put away his sword and trust in the Lord, will bring great conflict and inevitable misunderstanding.

To present our whole life, possessions and future to the Lord, however, presupposes an awareness of our need for behavior modification as well as insatiable desire to have our life and ministry effectual in this present age. The implementation of this kind of serious Christianitybecause of present subnormal standards-is being dubbed as a new form of discipleship. Actually it is nothing more than taking seriously the command of Jesus in the Great Commission.

**Charges and Accusations** 

I've known for years there would come a time when those of us walking in the Spirit would have to move on from our "goose bump" type of religion to the more serious aspect of following Jesus all the way to the cross. I've also known that such a commitment and relationship would probably bring its own cross with it. Therefore I am not surprised to find the kind of relationships the Holy Spirit is now precipitating is being misunderstood as domination, control, and even as "man's manipula-

any kind of order and discipline. we first entered the walk in the Spirit. However, the alternatives should be clear lest we think the choices are only bondage or liberty.

Jesus taught in John 8 of a restriction placed upon believers that was not legalistic bondage, but was rather an evidence of discipleship. It is called continuance in his Word.

The choice is not simply liberty or bondage, but rather the discipline in the Spirit needed to mature. The choice may be, after all, the choice between spiritual independence leading to religious anarchy or the embracing of his voke which is a symbol of discipline and restriction. We need to remember that even though the voke of Jesus is easy, it is still a yoke, nonetheless.

Understanding the Scriptures, walking in the Spirit, obedience to the Lord's commands, ministry to others are all skills to be learned. This is why we have Bible schools and seminaries. The missing factor, however, is not teaching information, but life formation, which comes either by being discipled under someone who knows the way, or through personal trial and error.

#### Discipleship Means Involvement

Discipleship is different than teaching in that while it includes teaching, it also involves deeper commitment. The Greek word disciple implies an adherent who keeps the instruction given to him, and makes it his rule of conduct. Sadly, the modern church has not made disciples. In fact, any reference to this kind of involvement brings great cries of protest as the status quo is threatened by those daring to go further and deeper with the Lord.

Most church members live on a take-it-or-leave-it basis. If some teacher comes in and begins explaining the serious demands of the Lord Jesus, or if the pastor grabs hold of the Biblical concepts and begins to teach this deeper truth, then we have a tendency to dismiss both teacher and teaching as irrelevant

# ON THE CARE AND FEEDING OF SHEEP



I HAVE CONCLUDED, after nearly thirty years of pastoral ministry, that any effort to ridicule the place of the local church in the purposes of God, and to decentralize the authority of the local pastor, will scatter the sheep and bring deep currents of division in the community of saints.

Today many teachers are saying the church has failed in its mission: that real disciples are made only in small, highly disciplined groups apart from the structured institution. This is false teaching. In the New Testament, the word disciple refers to a person who professes to have learned certain principles and doctrines from one in authority over him. It implies a personal, devoted relationship between teacher and pupil such as Jesus had with his followers—a relationship which today me more than these?" is found between shepherd and sheep in the local church.

All the ministries listed in Ephesians 4 are God-given and are needed to bring the saints of the Lord to maturity. The pastoral gift, however, is unique. Pastor is simply another word for shepherd. Jesus is the perfect Shepherd because he gives his life for his sheep and the authority of a pastor comes from him. Remember his discourse with Simon Peter in John 21:15-17?

"Simon, son of Jonas, lovest thou

"Yea, Lord; thou knowest that I love thee."

"Feed my sheep," Jesus said.

Again, Jesus asked Peter the same question and received the death, burial and resurrection, the same answer. Once again Jesus

veals to us the exact occasion when Jesus delegated pastoral authority to Peter. From that moment on, Peter was to oversee, lead and feed the flock entrusted to him.

#### The Duties of a Shepherd

This is exactly what a pastor does. He is a leader and a companion. He is a strong man who is capable of defending his flock against attacks from the enemy. He is gentle with the sheep and adapts himself to their needs. The shepherd cherishes each sheep that has been put into his care.

The authority that is given to him is not disputed by the sheep because it is based on his devotion and love for them. The mature shepherd also directs and coordinates the talents of the other ministries so the total community will mature and develop in their ministries as the flock grows and expands.

What enables the shepherd to lead, govern, and discipline the sheep is his God-given ability to feed the flock eagerly and lovingly. The relationship between ruling and feeding is recognized in both the Hebrew and Greek languages. Actually, the words "to rule" and "to feed" are one and the same. When the Apostle Paul left the Ephesians after a lengthy stay, his parting admonition was: "Take heed therefore unto yourselves, and to ALL THE FLOCK over the which the Holy Ghost hath made you overseers, to feed the church of God, which he

hath purchased with his own blood." (Acts 20:28)

Beautiful words, but easier said than done. The ability to read the Bible and quote Scriptures is not synonomous with feeding the flock or even a segment of it.

Feeding the Sheep

Through the years I have heard such phrases as, "He preaches the revival; he preaches the visitation; he is a part of the renewal." I have learned that it is possible to preach "revival truths" and scatter the sheep at the same time. Preaching and feeding are not necessarily one and the same thing. The reason: not everyone is given the charisma gift to feed and guide the sheep.

This is precisely what makes a ing of his flock. successful pastor-his ability to feed. This charisma attracts sheep and changes them, equipping them to feed, gather, carry and lead. (Isa. 40:11) Well-fed sheep stay close to the shepherd and experience contentment.

The sheep become the pastor's God's appointed representative. life and reason for existing. His love, devotion, and strength provide a necessary ingredient in the life of the sheep. He enjoys intimate and personal relationships with them.

It has been my observation that some pastors who have divided their local church into "discipleship groups" have done so because the care of the sheep has become a burden to them. They have become too busy. When we are too busy for personal relationships with people, for their care and feeding, we are too busy. The sheep are cared for within the confines of the sheepfold. The sheep need their shepherd. They also need one another.

#### **Personal Care**

But what if the sheep feel the shepherd is not feeding them properly? It is not the sheep's duty or responsibility to decide the fitness of the shepherd. Shepherds, good or bad, are but instruments in God's hands. The bad shepherd will be judged by God. In the Lord's own time, the shepherd will be changed, removed, or experience the scatter-

God can use a shepherd, good or bad, to accomplish his own ends. Sheep who attempt to judge a shepherd are, in fact, passing judgment on God's will—a will they cannot fully understand. The sheep will be judged by their level of obedience to

Certainly membership in some flocks is more desirable than membership in others. Some flocks have more experienced shepherds. Some are blessed with better pastureland. Some have a better grade of sheep. Some flocks have better training. But all sheep belong in a local church flock under a God-appointed shepherd. If they don't have one, they should find one.

Just as a father, good or bad, is the head of a household, so is a shepherd a father to his flock. There can be good or bad parents, but the Bible directs that we should honor our father and mother. It doesn't stipulate that we should honor them only if they are just. It decrees that we should honor them without reservation. This is a wise rule.

The present need in our nation is leadership. We need governmentgood government-for without it, we are disjointed and bewildered. This is also the need in the church, local and universal.





church today is quite different from bors. the type of membership we read of in the Bible. Most modern churches require three things for membership:

(1) Attend the meetings.

(2) Pay tithes and offerings to the church.

(3) Live an upright life.

pays tithes and offerings, and lives a life of holiness we say he is a good member of the church. However, if we gave that definition to Paul I'm afraid he would say, "That is not a body-type member; that is a clubtype member. For club members attend the club, pay the monthly dues and abide by the rules. Bodytype membership is another thing."

Discipleship is not a communication of knowledge, but a communication of life. Jesus said, "The word I have spoken unto you, the language I speak to you, is not a letter word in language—it is life. Paul made disciples by living a life that taught others how to live. He said, "You must be like me, be imitators of me." 

#### Submission

Here is the first law of discipleship. There will be no formation of life without submission. The club type members don't submit. It's the other way. They want the pastor to submit to them. They have the annual general assembly of the club where they vote. In this way each year the pastor must be approved by the people. In the "new Bible" that we have written for ourselves. the pastor is submitted to the members; but my Bible says that the people should be submitted to the pastor.

Submission means submission. Nothing less. I can form the life of my children because they submit to me. But if each time I corrected them I knew they could run away, it would be a different matter. If they could go to another father saying, "I no longer want to be a child of Juan Carlos Ortiz, I want to be a child of yours," and the other father would say, "Oh, welcome, welcome," then my correction would be constantly frustrated. But I am sure they are going to stay in my home, at least when they are young and have nowhere else to go. That, by the way, is the time to teach them that correction is not rejection, but an expression of deeply caring love.

The average pastor, though, does not form lives because he is afraid to lose his members.


Paul says to Titus, "This speak, exhort, and rebuke with all authority." We first have to speak. If the speaking is not obeyed, we exhort them. And if by exhorting nothing happens, we'll rebuke them with all authority. That is the way to form life and make disciples. People don't know the harm they do themselves by not submitting. They become spoiled children.

#### E. Judson Cornwall

WHAT HAS HAPPENED to worship? Where are the proclaimers that "Jesus is Lord?" Where are those prayer meetings where the flow of the Spirit in other tongues seems to make time stand still and Jesus supremely real?

The initial thrust of the Spirit in the charismatic renewal was to make Jesus real in the Word, to make worship vital through praise. and to make fellowship meaningful because it was Christ-centered. What has happened?

Today the emphasis has shifted to structure, submission, and authority. We seem to be wrangling over the place of apostles, elders and women in the body. We seem to be more interested in being a New Testament church than in being New Testament believers. How did the first produce the second? How could this come out of that?

The coming of the Spirit into the life of the believer should effect radical changes in his life and behavior. He not only brings us into a right relationship with God but with one another and with ourselves. We begin to examine and apply many Scriptures which before were grossly skimmed over. When we are filled with God we automatically come under the dealings of God in order that we may become mature sons of God. But the purpose of these changes and dealings is not to focus our attention on them, but to submit our will to the will of God and press earnestly "toward the





The leader said he had prayed about the group, but I doubted it. Even if he had, was he capable of really hearing from the Lord? And even more important, was the idea of committing oneself to a group part of God's plan?

Then there was the biggest question of all. Was it part of God's plan for us to be "discipled" by anyone but Jesus? I could see how being a leader could feed a man's ego and even turn him into a dictator. I had seen it before. What was different about this group, if anything?

Any person who enters this kind of relationship becomes vulnerable. This type of group cannot work unless there is openness. That meant I would learn things about my friends I could later use as weapons against them. They, in turn, would have weapons to use against me. There would have to be mutual trust and understanding. But was any group capable of handling this kind of trust? I doubted it.

We began meeting once every other week for dinner. After dinner the group divided, the women going into one room and the men into another. It just so happened that all the women had an interest in writing, and all the men were established engineers. At least we had that much in common.

We would meet separately for an hour and then come back together. Our leader, the husband of one of my closest friends, is a gentle, kind man. At the same time he has never been afraid to call us a discipleship group. Even though I had serious questions about this in the beginning, I soon realized his one purpose



was to make us better disciples of Jesus. His role, as leader, was to listen, care, love and pray for us.

There were some things about our leader that made him uniquely qualified for this position. He had been a Christian for many years and had walked in the Spirit for the last eight years. He was a Christian first, an engineer second. His home was in order. I had seen traits in his children that I wanted mine to have. Besides all this, he did not ask us to submit to him, but to submit to each other-the same way he was submitted to the elders of our church.

"You cannot disciple others unless you are first a disciple," he said. He had authority because he was under authority. He became our shepherd who leads us consistently to the cooling waters of Jesus.

#### A Problem

The women's part of the group presented a small problem for me from the beginning. There were two established writers in the group. One was an editor. They all thought like writers—all the time. The most common phrase heard was, "That would make a good article." Everything that happened seemed to be a potential story.

One evening, after sitting through almost an hour of writers' "shop talk" I could contain myself no longer. I blurted out my frustration and suddenly realized I had lowered my shield and made myself vulnerable. I cringed, waiting for the other women to turn and slash me down.

I was dumbfounded, however. The most experienced writer turned and said, "I understand, Linda, I never wanted to write either."

"You didn't?" I stuttered. "But you've had things published in magazines and newspapers."

"I know," she smiled. "But I really don't have much talent. All I know is that God has put us in this position. I have merely decided not to fight what God has done-but to flow in it."

Her soft answer cooled my steaming heels. "God has put us in this position. I decided not to fight but to flow." There was no biting correction, no accusation, no setting me straight.

She didn't care if I ever became a writer. She released me through that simple statement and allowed God to speak to my heart. I sat back and listened to his still small voice.

"Linda, she wants you to be who you are. But she is going to be who she is, too. She has accepted you. Can you not accept her?"

#### **Growing in Christ**

Suddenly it was clear. Only as we learn to trust each other can we grow in Christ. Only as we make ourselves vulnerable can we walk in faith. In this kind of group you open yourself, put down your shield of protection and trust in Jesus as your shield.

We've been meeting for a year now. The discipleship group has been a trying, learning experience. There have been, and will continue to be, rubs. But I find myself relaxing in the confidence that this isn't a totally new concept. We are only getting back to the biblical name. The pattern for such groups is scat-The other woman and myself tered throughout church history. The denominational church has practiced it in some form—through Sunday school classes or training groups-for years. We're not off on a tangent but in the main stream.

> The problems I saw at the beginning are still there. They always will be. We can't close our eyes to them. Yet in a group formed and established with Jesus as the leader, we learn he can turn each problem into a glorious learning experience. The obstacles become avenues which lead us closer to the Father.

> And after all, isn't that the true purpose of discipleship?

LIGHTHOUSE RANCH, located at an old Coast Guard station on the northern California coast, began as a Christian commune in the early '70s with a group of twenty-five young believers. Jim Durkin, a local Eureka pastor and realtor became their elder in 1971. Under his leadership, the ranch became a discipleship center where thousands of young people have learned the disciplines of hard work plus the principles of kingdom living.

"You are to hear the sayings of Jesus and then do them." Jim told his young disciples. Some have stuck with their commitments, however. They have started local businesses, gone into ministry, joined the tree planting teams, even traveled to distant cities as "missionaries." It is, in the words of one observer, practical discipleship.

#### Local Newspaper

publish the Tri-City Advertiser. Jim believed the young people should learn how to work-a cardinal principle of being a disciple. An early ad salesman tells the story.

"At first, a group of young people at the Ranch started an odd job service taking any kind of work that came along-cleaning windows, yard work, salvaging train wrecks. One job we did was to deliver a door-to-door advertising circular for Sears in Eureka. From that we got the idea of publishing our own advertising shopper and selling ads to local merchants. As we thought about this we became excited. especially when someone suggested that we 'use the profits to print a gospel paper.'

"We divided Eureka and its two neighboring cities, Arcata and Fortuna, into sales territories and went out to sell our first issue. We didn't have any samples to show the local merchants so we took a San Fran-One of the early projects was to cisco newspaper, marked a page in-

to square blocks of different sizes with a felt tip pen and put the price of the ad in each block. Crude but by the end of two weeks, we put out our first issue with enough profit to encourage us in selling the next one."

None of the five young people who started the Tri-City Advertiser had business experience. All came from some type of counter-culture background with previously bad attitudes toward business. Today, however, the paper has a circulation of more than 20,000 and the young people have become competent businessmen.

#### **Local Ministry**

Jim's teaching on discipleship has helped the young people of Lighthouse Ranch to gain the respect of the local community.

"Just telling people about Jesus is not enough," Jim tells them. "They must be able to see his truth by the integrity of your lives."

Over the last five years, the ministry of the ranch has brought thousands of young people (and many older ones as well) into a relationship with Jesus Christ. "Discipleship," Jim repeats, "means doing the Word of God. A disciple is one who is wholly committed to practice God's Word at any cost."



Larry says, "The only way to get blessed in tree planting is to give it all you've got. I have real joy when I know I am planting trees for God's glory. In rainy weather, the steep hills are wet and slippery. The mud sticks to your hoedad and it's difficult to swing. Your hands are sore with blisters. Every muscle in your body aches. But you learn many spiritual principles on the slopes. You learn to overcome your own negative feelings. You learn to say 'I love hard ground. I love slash piles. I love rocks. I love the snow in my

Many lives have been changed as a result of tree planting discipleship. Rick, who now is twentythree, worked in Our Father's Car Wash, run by the Lighthouse Ranch, when he first came to Eureka. Through tree planting, the young believers contact other churches and work toward unity throughout the Body of Christ. Sometimes they are asked to share songs, testimonies and even to teach the Word. At other times, they attend just to be spiritually fed.

Three women, usually the wives

tracted several older women who help disciple the younger women. Dacie Durkin, Jim's wife, disciples the younger women in principles of child-rearing, homemaking, hospitality and giving.

Honore Osberg, former newspaper editor, lives communally with seven other young people in an old yellow Victorian ministry house in Eureka. Her task is to encourage the young disciples in prayer.

Sabine Ball, once the wife of a Miami millionaire with a yacht and many servants, started a "maid service" for the younger women.

Four janitorial franchises, from ServiceMaster International, are held by Ranch teams. The three cleaning businesses in Alaska and one in Los Angeles not only provide financial support, but give the young people a chance to witness up and down the coast.

Lighthouse Ranch sponsors a tenacre farm in Palmer, Alaska, where they have a bakery that has become the second largest in Alaska. Another eighteen-acre ranch is located in Perris Valley between Los Angeles and San Diego.

Cassettes of Bible teaching and Christian music are sent into many places to witness for the Lord. A team of twenty young men and women have been given the responsibility to use media as a means of training and discipling people.

Jim Durkin says, "I have a vision in my heart. I see the people of God going out all over this world and covering it with the name of the Lord Jesus Christ, making disciples." However, Jim knows that before one can make disciples, he must first be a disciple. That's what Lighthouse Ranch is all about. <

SO IMPORTANT WAS the Church to Jesus, so vital was its future work in the earth, that in his parting counsel he told the believers exactly what they were to do after his ascension. They were to return to Jerusalem and wait (1) for the promise of the Father (Acts 1:4), (2) for the baptism of the Holy Ghost (Acts 1:5), (3) for the enduement with power from on high (Luke 24:49).

With characteristic human sensitivity for the true purposes of God, the disciples parried with the Lord by asking him the question, "Wilt thou at this time restore again the kingdom to Israel?" (Acts 1:6) They wanted something that was visible, something that had an outward show of glory. 





As soon as he convinced me the loss of my breast didn't make all that much difference to him as long as it didn't to me, then I could assure him the loss didn't make that much difference to me if it didn't to him. We were on our way to acceptance and a deeper love and concern for each other than we had ever experienced before. His gentleness and love touched me deeply. My appreciation for his acceptance of me after the surgery. made even our intimate relationship deeper and more meaningful. One day he said, "Honey, I'm grateful because this has given me a chance to show you how much I really love you. Not every couple has that opportunity."

Our two teenage daughters were very quiet, but I saw evidences of their concern for me. Our married daughter lived in northern California and I didn't want to worry her with the upcoming surgery. 

surgery and asked, "Are you in pain?" I realized I had not even thought about it. That night the nurse woke me up with "Time for your pain shot," but I had no pain. I did not take as much as an aspirin through the whole recuperation process.

Before I left the hospital, my surgeon said, "I want you to start working with your arm until you can reach behind your head."

I said, "Like this?" as I reached for the back of my head.

Surprised, he answered, "Yes."

Later, after I went home and my arm began to be sore from renewed activity, I said, "Lord, please let this pulling and aching be a reminder for me to just say, "Thank you." And that was a challenge. I found myself praising the Lord more than I had in my whole life.

Mastectomy patients are given a variety of arm exercises to help restore the use of their arms. Instead of counting to ten, I found it more rewarding to quote Bible verses approximating ten words. Some of my favorites were: "Because the Lord is my shepherd, I have everything I need." "I am with you and that is all you need." "I will praise the Lord no matter what happens."

Was I really praising the Lord because of the surgery itself? I wasn't sure, but I knew I was praising him because "He hath done all things well," and we are to "count it all joy" when our life is full of difficulties and temptations. Imagine, the Bible says we are to "rejoice" when we run into problems and trials for we can know they are good for us. There is so much that we can learn only in the hard places.

Some of the hardest times came after I came home from the hospital. One was the first time I had to remove the bandages so I could take a shower. I sat on the side of the bathtub and cried. Now I really had to face the results of the surgery and the adjustments that had to be made in the days ahead.

I wanted so much to let this whole experience be a witness for my Lord and to bring glory to him. The night the Bible class resumed in our







after I have heard singing in the Spirit which is indescribably beautiful, I remember similar sounds in China, sounds like waves of the sea or lovely organ music.

The presence of God was overpowering and unmistakable in those revival missions. At times Father's presence seemed almost incidental to the move of the Spirit. He often said he did not know how to conduct a revival; all he did was present his message from God, then let the people pray.

In one meeting where Father was emphasizing the need to confess sin, a beloved elder of the church rose before the large congregation and said, "I have committed adultery, and I poisoned my wife to get rid of her." Immediately that vast audience went to their knees, crying out to God for mercy. It was the beginning of a great revival that swept hundreds of unsaved into the Kingdom.

#### A Turning Point

That was over 50 years ago. But, thank God, the power of Jesus Christ, our Lord, is just as mighty today. As the wife of an Evangelical Presbyterian minister, however, I had genuine doubts about the validity of the current use of "gifts of the Spirit"—especially tongues. Then one day I attended a charismatic prayer group and the people wanted to pray for my healing. It was a turning point in my life.

Each member of the group began to speak in tongues. As I listened I realized one lady was talking Mandarin Chinese, one of my first two languages. She said, "Shang-ti-aini!"-"God loves you." She said it over and over. Then she said, "Shang-ti-buh-yao-ni-tung!", which means, "God doesn't want you to suffer." Then another sentence I cannot remember but I knew it meant, "Just accept his healing." I looked up and said, "Thank you dear Lord!" Instantly I was healed.

#### **LUTHERANS LOOSE WRATH ON CHARISMATICS**

LAST MAY, Concordia Seminary in Springfield, Illinois, an institution of the dissent-torn Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod, issued a policy stating that applicants to the school who are "Neo-Pentecostal" may not receive a diploma authorizing ordination in the Missouri Synod denomination. In July it almost happened that the entire Synod, meeting in convention, voted to warn its members against the charismatic movement. However, it failed to come to the floor.

These declarations are side-effects of the takeover of the Missouri Synod in recent years by Jacob Preus, a right-wing leader. His brother, Robert Preus, is president of the Springfield Concordia Seminary (not to be confused with Concordia of St. Louis which, until recently, was the largest seminary in the United States). Preus and his associates had focused most of their wrath on liberals and moderates in the denomination. Now they have trained their guns on charismatics.

Most of the objections raised have been heard before, except one. Charismatics were also deplored for their unionistic tendencies. Although understandable in light of Missouri Synod exclusivism. this accusation does stand in humorous contrast to the old complaint that charismatics are divisive.

On reflection we ought to be reassured by this outburst. The charismatic movement has been gaining such wide acceptance that it was in danger of being spoken well of by all men. More seriously, though, we need to learn an old lesson that bears repeating. Our help cometh neither from the left nor the right; but only from the Lord. This attack, though it is grievous to see the agony of the Missouri Synod, is in fact the blessing of God, for being shot at by liberals and conservatives alike will, by God's grace, drive us more surely into the life of Jesus.

#### WOLF! WOLF!

OVER THE LAST several months a flurry of petitions have appeared calling for the censure of Madalyn Murray O'Hair for trying to keep the astronauts from reading the Bible from outer space. The circulars assert the famed atheist has renewed

her efforts and that letters are needed to "stop Madalyn Murray O'Hair."

As much as we oppose the atheistic principles of Mrs. O'Hair, this time she's not involved.

Mrs. O'Hair did bring suit against NASA and the astronauts back in 1969 following Frank Borman's Christmas Eve reading from Genesis from the back side of the moon. However, Neil Hosenball, general counsel for NASA states that the two suits were dismissed by the lower federal courts and the U.S. Supreme Court twice refused to hear an appeal, the last time in 1971.

Mrs. O'Hair, in a recent interview, said, "Perhaps someone found one of the old 1969 petitions and thought something new was underway. But absolutely nothing is happening."

NASA's official position, according to Hosenball, is: "It is NASA's policy neither to direct nor to limit the astronaut's religious activities at any time."

John Baker, of the Baptist Joint Committee on Public Affairs, commented on the issue recently. "The name of Madalyn Murray O'Hair triggers a conditioned response in many religious people." He adds, "Why don't church people stop shooting cannons at sparrows and give themselves to the more important issues in advancing the cause of Jesus Christ?" AMEN!

#### A PLEA FOR UNITY

EVERY MOVE OF the Spirit of God can be divisive. When the church began to learn the truth of the baptism of the Holy Spirit many leaders called it divisive. Some evangelicals say "speaking in tongues" divides churches. A few mainline Pentecostals believe certain teachings on deliverance sow seeds of discord. Local pastors have fought the formation of home churches, saying they divide the fellowship. It was so in Jesus' day, and is still so today. New light on truth often brings divi-

Ever since Jesus told his followers to "go and make disciples" people have been divided over the method. In the early church the influence of the disciplemakers was so strong the believers sold their property and laid their possessions at the feet of the apostles. Surely, such a radical move must have elicited severe criticism from some parts.

Later, in the fourth century, Constantine at-

tempted to "disciple" the entire Roman army by marching the army through the water in mass baptismal services. His motives were excellent. His method, however, was less than perfect.

Down through history each new wave of revival has eventually crystallized into a structure as the leaders realized it was not enough for men to just "be saved." The Roman Catholic Church, through its various orders, has practiced tight discipleship for centuries. Groups such as the Navigators and Campus Crusade for Christ are disciplemakers. Among charismatics discipleship has been practiced at various levels by such ministries as the Community of Jesus at Cape Cod, the Catholic community in Ann Arbor, Michigan, and the Church of the Redeemer in Houston.

It comes as no surprise, although it is a disappointment to some, that the charismatic move is beginning to crystallize into discipleship groups (although hopefully not into a denomination). The need to relate to one another, to submit to spiritual authority, to do the words of Jesus is built in to those filled with the Spirit. No one disagrees with this. It is how it is accomplished that has caused the controversy.

By far the most powerful influence in the current discipleship movement is Christian Growth Ministries (CGM) in Ft. Lauderdale, Florida, Through the teaching tapes which pour out of CGM, through the personal ministries of the teachers (Bob Mumford, Derek Prince, Don Basham, Charles Simpson, John Poole and Ern Baxter), and through New Wine magazine, many are being persuaded to "form an army" in which all the disciples are solidly linked in doctrine and obedience.

Logos Journal has reservations about some of the methods espoused. We agree with Dr. Charles Farah of Oral Roberts University that the seeds of denominational structure have been planted, although the leaders at CGM say they have no desire for this. We also fear the dangers of extra-local submission which is at the heart of the controversy. Discipleship in its purest form, it seems, must be on a local basis. Neither does the current CGM move make it clear that a believer is primarily a disciple of Jesus, rather than a disciple of man. In Acts 6 the word "disciple" was synonymous with the word

"believer." Men were not disciples of Peter or Apollos, but of the living Lord.

As in all movements, it takes a healthy push of the pendulum to set it in motion. We feel that. given time, the discipleship movement will stabilize. One thing is sure: The CGM leaders are men of God. However, these men need to exert extreme caution in suggesting this as a universal principle. Many cannot receive it and will cause problems. Martin Luther's great statements on freedom precipitated the horrible bloodbath of the revolt of the peasants.

Most heresy is truth carried to an extreme. From the reports pouring in there are a lot of extremists trying to set up discipleship groups (and calling themselves disciples of Mumford, Prince et. al. when actually they are not). Such groups are seeking to obtain position without authority and will eventually perish.

Not only the teachings coming from CGM bother us, but also those who have reacted radically and are racing through the Kingdom waving red flags. Perhaps you remember James Thurber's little story of the man dashing through the village shouting, "Run for your lives, the dam has burst!" The people fled in panic. Finally, panting and out of breath, one man turned to his wife. "What dam?" he asked.

We know many among us strongly oppose those involved in covenant discipleship. In some cases, they have taken unusual actions to express their opposition. We are deeply concerned over such manifestations, fearing they may further widen the spiritual gap between themselves and those with whom they disagree. We can sympathize with their position but want to urge them to the utmost caution lest their ways of protesting excesses bring reproach on themselves.

We issue a new call for unity—and patience. Let us pray for one another, hear one another, respect the other's opinion and give him the right to believe differently. Our enemy is not our Christian brother. Our enemy is Satan. Let us communicate, speaking the truth in love, encourage one another and wash one another's feet. Let us stand together, submitting to one another as better than ourselves, that the world may know that Jesus is the Son of God.

Alfred Plummer in the Dictionary of the Apostolic Church states. "During his life on earth, the followers of Christ were called 'disciples' in reference to him. Afterwards they were called 'saints' in reference to their sacred calling. Then 'brethren' in relation to one another." Plummer adds, "It is remarkable that St. Paul does not call his converts his disciples. That might be seen to be taking the place of Christ. But he does speak of them as being his imitators.'

When Paul says, "Follow me as I follow Christ," he acknowledges his ministry of teaching-training and tutoring them as they serve in the capacity of Christ's disciples.

The very fact that disciple is used so predominately in the four Gospels and is no longer used after the closing chapters of Acts indicates a relationship between Christ and his followers that is very personal, individual and fulfilling.

Technically then, no human being has disciples. No teacher, pastor, evangelist, prophet or apostle has disciples. At the same time, all these ministries can humbly serve the whole body of believers, those called by the Word of God. Christ's disciples.

Sons of God Return by Kelly L. Segraves Spire Books, 1975, 191 pp., \$1.50

Ivan Spencer: Willow in the Wind by: Marion Meloon, Logos, 1974, 234 pp. \$2.95

Elim Bible Institute, now located in Lima, New York, has raised up many men of God prepared on a solid foundation; missionaries to foreign countries, teachers and pastors in the present national charismatic movement, and laymen in the Body of Christ. That God has been able to produce such fruit in and by Elim faculty and graduates must mean that someone chose to lose his life for God, preferring to be sown into the ground to die so that a mighty plant could later grow forth.

As a young boy living on his parents' farm in upstate New York at the turn of the century. Ivan was marked by a spiritual sensitivity. When he was young his mother read to him from the Bible, always out of sight and sound of his stern father, who disapproved of religious study which he took for foolishness and weakness.

In later years, while his father continued to train him as a farmer, training which later provided multiple illustrations for teaching and preaching, Ivan con-

tinued to search the Bible for answers to the strange longings in his heart. In the summer of 1909 he found John 3 and. quickened by the Spirit, cried out to God for salvation. At that moment he also received God's call to preach and responded with a "yes, Lord."

During the training years of his response to God's call, first at Wyoming Seminary and later at Rochester Bible Training School, Ivan was greatly hampered by feelings of inferiority due to his uncluttered upbringing. His country ways made him awkward and shy in the city institutes while his father's scorn of his chosen vocation and unwillingness to help him made him despair of even becoming a minister at all. Yet God blessed him. Although still a farm boy, ineloquent, shy and introspective, at this time God revealed to him in visions the world revival in which he was to share later in his life.


In the first few years of his ministry, now with a family, even as God repeatedly melted and tempered this vessel, Ivan felt frustrated. He could not find a boat to take him to India where he felt God had given him a calling, so, in the first church in Paterson, N.J., he started his Pentecostal ministry. And God did bless himuntil he insisted on being friendly with people from other denominations. Ivan and Minnie, his wife, yearned for more love and communion among all God's people though the trend at that time was for ever more specialized and particular groups to band together, suspicious of and superior to the rest. Few understood Ivan's broad vision of the Body of Christ in that day and the Spencers were forsaken by many because they insisted on more freedom in the Spirit and more love among the brethren even while adhering to basic Pentecostal doctrine.

These heartaches continued from the time Elim was born in 1924 until the Latter Rain revivals began twenty-five years later. To her credit the author refuses to chronicle these years as a simple progression "from glory to glory:" history in her biography Ivan Spencer: she shows more truthfully how the rejections cited above, the long, painful struggles to pay off each new campus, and even Ivan's attempts to complete God's will his own way, were important phases of the dying of the seed that was being sown in the ground that something of lasting value could grow.



Prison Letters by Corrie Ten Boom, Revell, 1975, 90 pp., \$3.95 illustrated

This slender volume of letters exchanged by Corrie and her family while she and sister Betsy were being shuffled through various prisons in Holland and Germany during World War II is a very useful one. Because it consists of documents of the period rather than recollections, the feeling transmitted to the reader is one of undiluted historical reality. This is not a testimony; it is the far more subdued diary of the test itself.

One of the most interesting single points which the book unconsciously brings out is the similarity, in its general aspects, of the trial of imprisonment to other trials which face Christians in "normal" life, such as after an accident or severe illness, or even as a result of being closely involved with someone who is suffering. Corrie and Betsie speak repeatedly of their problems controlling their thoughts and desires, resisting fear and self-pity. They encouraged their family and friends to uphold them in prayer and testified of great strength coming from this faithful intercession. And they experienced many small miracles in the midst of their trial. Finally, when it was all over, God had a different ending for each of them; one died, the other was released alive to start a world-wide minis-

energy through more prayer, meditation and fasting. It is in fact a much more useful book than that; it is a complete and practical study of the root causes of fatigue in the life of the sincere Christian.

Dr. Carlson begins by affirming that God has given to each all the time and energy needed to fulfill his will in their lives, yet, he says, many misuse or even abuse this time and energy and therefore are often fatigued. The book reveals the many causes of fatigue, relating some to specific areas of rebellion and sin in the life of the individual, and also proposes steps towards freedom from fatigue.


In the first chapters Dr. Carlson explains in laymen's terms the possible organic, constitutional and physical causes of fatigue which require consideration. Then he focuses on the inter-related psychological-spiritual causes which plague the Christian, describing fourteen different root causes, such as inadequacy, critical negative attitudes, and peoplepleasing which produce undue anxiety and busyness which results in fatigue. Each root cause he connects with a root sin such as guilt, unforgiveness or idolatry. For example in the chapter on "sin and guilt" he says:

A typical example is the sincere. hard-working, self-giving, but weary Christian who feels guilty if he says 'no' to any opportunity of Christian service, so he gets busier and more tired and begins to doubt and question. He doesn't realize that his basic need...may be for time in the Word and meditation or to admit a personal problem, need or wrong attitude. (p.60)

After dealing with the individual root causes of fatigue, exposing and explaining the sin behind each one. Dr. Carlson adds a valuable section on the "solution." While stressing the individual dealings of God with each person and the need for specific repentance from the root sins, he uses diagrams and inventory lists to outline step by step how to cooperate with God in changing the patterns in life which have led to fatigue. And woven into the book are particularly helpful examples from his professional files and honest, revealing instances of fatigue in his own life.

Dr. Carlson's willingness to expose his own struggles with fatigue and the resulting confessions of sin add an authority and depth to this book making it a valuable tool for those who fall prey to fatigueproducing busyness and anxiety and who wish divine healing in this area of their lives. ### **IS IT RIGHT TO SUBMIT TO MEN?**

#### Frank S. Longino

RECENTLY OUR CHURCH in Louisville, Ky. became the target of some bitter criticism. Some folks in our city were saying we had fallen into error and heresy because we were involved in some anti-Christian teaching called "discipleship." It seems to be a word that is on the "no-no" list this year.

The criticism stung deeply forcing me to reexamine what the Bible actually teaches-and what God expects us to teach concerning submission. I finally arrived at some firm conclusions.

I am supposed to teach submission to men. I am to teach children to submit to their fathers (who are men) and wives to submit to their husbands in the Lord. (Husbands also are men.) I am to teach people to submit to policemen, and to governors and presidents, most of whom also are men. I am to teach the church to submit one to another.

Now of course every Bible-reading Christian accepts the fact that God delegates governing authority through our governmental leaders and that we are encouraged to obey these leaders for our own good (Rom. 13:1-7); (Titus 3:1). Yet many of these same persons deny that God governs his people and his church through delegated authorities. All the while they read about Moses, Joshua, Gideon, Samuel, David, Elijah (a man of like passions as we), Nehemiah, Peter, Paul and the like.

We have generally ignored such Scriptures as "Obey them that have the rule over you, and submit yourselves: for they watch for your souls as they that must give account, that they may do it with joy, and not with grief..." (Heb. 13:17) Or, "Remember them which have the rule over you, who have spoken unto you the Word of God: whose faith follow considering the end of their conversation." (Heb. 13:7) "Let the elders that rule well be counted worthy of

#### **Delegating Authority**


Isn't it strange that we accept the fact that God led Israel of old by delegating authority to fleshly men, and then deny that he leads spiritual Israel (the Church) by delegating authority to fleshly men. We know that God has governed through kings and presidents, many of whom were pagans like King Cyrus of Persia. Yet we reject the notion that God will govern through even spiritually anointed men today in the Church. We say, "no-one is going to get between me and Jesus-besides, what about the priesthood of the believer?" God says authority is to be submitted to. If we don't, we are not recognizing it as authority.

It may come as a surprise to many Christians that God does not recognize democracy as the government of the Church. Christ gave apostles, prophets, evangelists, pastors and teachers to the Church. He picks them and he uses them to make known his will and to bring the people of the Church to maturity. (Eph. 4:11,12) Pastor-elders have the over-sight of the flock for their responsibility. (Acts 20:28) They are to exhort and rebuke with all authority, allowing no man to think little of them. (Titus 2:15) This is not government by congregation, but by anointed leaders whom God has chosen himself. Some object saving, "this sounds like dictatorship or legal sin." That is a Scripturally ignorant statement. What we are talking about is a Theocracy-government by God. And God says authority must be submitted to or it is not authority.

Right here lies the trouble. First of all, submission lies furtherest from the real desire of even bornagain, Spirit-filled Christians. God's biggest obstacle to having his way on earth is not Satan, but the compulsion of his own people to have their own way.

I find few people who really know what submission is. The other day a man accused me of teaching submis-



sion to men and I asked him. "What do you mean by submission? What does it involve?" He stammered and stuttered and wound up admitting he couldn't even define the conduct of which I was supposed to be guilty.

Submission is a spirit, not just external acts of obedience. The elder son of the father in Luke 15 was scrupulously obedient but his spirit was a snarling, complaining thing. It was not really submissive.

Submission has to be offered. It cannot be demanded. God never demands it. He gives us every opportunity to offer it. As husband and head of my house, I cannot demand submission of my wife. That's her department-submission. Mine is to love her as Christ loved the Church. As pastor of my flock, I cannot demand submission. That's the flock's responsibility. Mine is to feed them, protect them, and lead them. If they don't want to be led, the shepherd may warn them and exhort them but he cannot coerce them. He just turns them over to God. God deals with individuals sometimes by cutting them out of the flock. If the whole flock is affected, in extreme cases, God may remove the Shepherd and leave them leaderless. each one turning to his own way.

Submission is daily. It is never a static decision. We may make a general commitment to the idea of submission, we decide to submit or not. Some pastors who thought they were submitted to a group of other pastors have recently found out that they weren't when a particular crunch came. Jesus said we were to take up our cross daily. I believe that cross is the cross of submission to the will of God.

It does seem that we just can't get away from trips to the cross, doesn't

Have you ever considered an annual parent/teacher conference? Set it up during the Sunday School hour, when parents can observe actually what goes on in the classroom. Teach the regular tesson. Allow time at the end for parent questions and answers. Or allow the entire class time for teacher-parent discussion. Children can be present in their parents' care, or plan an open session for each department, to occupy the learners while the parents visit the classroom.

A handy, quick, fill-out form given to interested parents can provide valuable observation feedback from the parents to the teacher. Such a form could be used while teaching the class with parents in it, or during parent teacher discussion.

The professional pacesetter of such a program builds inherent quality in the Sunday School. Teachers are enthused and challenged, while parents become deeply committed to the teaching effort for their child's eternal welfare.



#### Filmstrip Production A Super Project

Either a class or the entire division can participate in this one. Have the learners write and produce a filmstrip story. Take the lesson thrusts of a quarter and make them into a modern experiential story. Students plan the script, costumes and "filming." Shoot it all with 35mm and ask your developer not to splice the negative film. If ever a project generates enthusiasm, this is it.



More Children's Tips . . .

Make it Easy on Yourself!

Consider the following suggestions for more effective teaching/learning and a more attractive room environment. Discuss these ideas with fellow staff members.

Aides—Ask high school/college students or adults to assist you. Aides may gather materials needed for Bible Learning Activities, prepare Bible Learning games, act as scribes for students who have difficulty writing down ideas. They may become future teachers, trained while they assist you.

Room Environment—Create an atmosphere which says to anyone entering the room. "Something exciting is going on!" Use posters to capture students' attention and to motivate them for further learning. See sketch.

#### 3 Good Ways to Go With Youth in Your Church.

1. Teacher Preparation.

Get the youth teaching staff together one evening a week at a house gathering. You may want to split Jr. High one evening and Sr. High another evening. There's a simple plan to get the most out of your time together:

- a) The first part of your time can be staff night—sharing and discussing the result of the Word in your lives. Use the lesson text for the week as the staff devotion-quite time.
- b) The second part is the planning meeting for the teaching session. This is the huddle for your team before they break to play ball on Sunday morning in the class.
- c) Lastly, there are long range plans and goals to hammer out. Nothing complicated. Just healthy cohesive planning.

2. Correlate the Sunday School Teaching Materials with the Student's Daily Lives Between Sundays.

"Growth" books for Junior Highers are personal notebooks—for taking notes, of course. No better commitment to memory than hearing, writing and seeing it. Notes from lessons and sermons. Youth need a strong encouragement for such an organizational tool. It's a great record book for prayer requests, quiet time, further inquiry/study, and calendar of future events.

### 3. A Para-Church Facility for Youth.

Try a new location from the church. Calm the board with sensible inputs and strong leadership. Sunday School is best. Jr. and Sr. Highers can bring more friends to a non-steepled building than your church. The "Old Belfry Club" and "Sunday Seminars" are a great success for Grace Chapel. Is there a store front, vacant house, or garage near your church?







Some of the family may feel excited and happy. Someone else may be tired, headachey, even homesick. Talk about how God is right there loving each person no matter only hope is in you' (Ps. 39:4-7).'

#### MINISTRY TO CHILDREN, FAMILY AND LEADERS AT FIRST BAPTIST OF BAKERSFIELD, CALIFORNIA

The 1800-member First Baptist Church of Bakersfield, California, has a dynamic ministry outreach with particular emphasis on Family Life and Children. Pastor Ron Shelton, known as Minister to Family Life and Children at First Baptist has undertaken unique approaches in each of his pastoral interests.

Pastor Shelton's Fish Program has had a good response among the children. Each week, between 200–300 young children in the Bakersfield area dial 322-FISH. They hear a short Bible related story which Pastor Shelton has dictated on the phone answering machine. The pastor is moving toward segmentation of stories to provide continuing installments. He is also planning to study the users of this service ministry. He eventually hopes to develop an envangelistic outreach among those contacted through the calls.

Pastor Shelton recently reported a record 53 people on the Spring Family Retreat. At that time a family life strategy in the church was formed "encouraging families to do 'family time,'" in their homes. "Family Time" is part of the Gospel Light Family Life program in use by many churches across the nation.

Integrating Family Life with their Vacation Bible School this summer, First Baptist has proven itself a pacesetter with creative innovation. Both Gospel Light's VBS and Family Life materials were used.

Family Life were invited to share in "Family Times." The demonstrable success of these "primer" occassions have had a profound effect, according to Pastor Shelton.

After the summer months the Wednesday evening family time will move to the church. Following a shared supper-time at the church, the children participate in a graded choir program for grades 3 and up. Adults register for electives in the church's "Academy of Biblical Studies."

Speaking of their 600-attendee Sunday School, Pastor Shelton noted, "ICL (International Center for Learning) is a real key in training our teachers and leaders." ICL, a division of Gospel Light Publications, has trained over 55,000 Sunday School teachers and leaders over the last 3 years through its national schedule of Seminars and Clinics.
