Discussion

We are advised by Senator Hugh Scott's staff that the subject of the Joint Resolution, Mrs. Phan Thi Yen, is a Vietnamese refugee currently residing with her family in Camp Hill, Pennsylvania, under the sponsorship of Senator Scott. This Joint Resolution, upon approval, will permit Senator Scott to employ Mrs. Phan as a member of his staff assigned to his Harrisburg, Pennsylvania office. No additional appropriations will be necessary.



Senator Scott's staff further informed us that Mrs. Phan was an employee of the United States in Vietnam from 1963 until her evacuation in 1975. From 1963-1968, she was employed by the U.S. Air Force in Saigon. From 1968 until her evacuation, as one of the last Vietnamese to leave Saigon, she was on the passport staff of the U.S. Embassy in Saigon. We are further advised that Mrs. Phan was personally responsible for assisting in the evacuation of American government personnel and civilians from Saigon and that during her first few weeks in the United States at Indiantown Gap Military Reservation, she served as a volunteer assisting with processing of Vietnamese refugees.

Senator Scott, as sponsor for Mrs. Phan Thi Yen and her immediate family, has substantial interest in your approval of this Joint Resolution.

Dear Mr. Lynn:

This is in response to your request for the Commission's views on enrolled Joint Resolution 100 "To authorize the Secretary of the Senate to pay compensation to Phan Thi Yen."

This legislation would permit Mr. Yen to be employed and compensated by the Senate without regard to any provisions of law prohibiting the compensation of aliens. It would not affect any laws or regulations administered by the Civil Service Commission. Although the Commission does, by regulation, restrict the appointment of aliens in the competitive civil service, we have no jurisdiction over the employment and compensation of Senate employees.

Thus, from the standpoint of our personnel responsibilities for the executive branch, we would have no objection to the President signing this enrolled joint resolution into law.

Your office has asked for the views of this Department on the enrolled enactment of S.J. Res. 100, "To authorize the Secretary of the Senate to pay compensation to Phan Thi Yen."

The enrolled enactment would provide that, notwithstanding any other provision of law, the citizenship or nationality of Phan Thi Yen shall not prohibit the Secretary of the Senate from paying compensation, for a period not to exceed twelve months, to the said Phan Thi Yen while serving as an employee of the Senate.

The Department has no knowledge of the need for this legislation, and therefore has no recommendation as to whether or not the enrolled enactment should be approved by the President.
