Dear Jack:

As we discussed in our telephone conversation today, I am sending you copies of comments filed by the Justice Department (Antitrust Division) and Pasco, Inc. regarding FEA's proposed regulation for allocating old oil. I have also included a short paper that has been distributed for briefing purposes, which summarizes the problem with the FEA proposal.

Pasco, Inc. is a small oil company established in the Rocky Mountain and Plains States Region pursuant to a 1972 antitrust decree. The company has invested nearly \$165 million in an effort to compete with the large refining operations that market in this region. The proposed FEA entitlement program, set up to aid small and independent refineries compete against major integrated companies, will, quite simply, bankrupt Pasco in short order unless modified to exempt small refiners.
