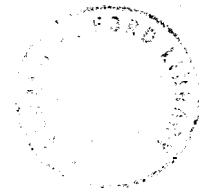
A candidate has been approved by the President for the Chairmanship of the Commission. For your information, the candidate is Lowell Perry who is presently in FBI clearance.

As you probably remember, the Democrat vacancy will be filled by William Kendrick. Mr. Kendrick has been approved by the President and has completed his clearances. We are holding nomination until we can present the Senate with a package.

A candidate has been selected for General Counsel and is in clearance. We expect a memo to go into staffing within the next few days on Ab Sibal.

As soon as all three candidates are ready, they will be nominated together. The executive director vacancy will be filled after the qualification of the new chairman. We are gathering resumes and interviewing candidates whom we will bring to the attention of Mr. Perry upon his qualification. Perry will select the executive director which is an NEA GS-18 position.

There will be a Republican vacancy effective July 1, 1975. The incumbent is Ethel Walsh presently serving as Vice Chairman of the Commission and Acting Chairman. 

Thank you very much, Kent, distinguished Members of the Congress and of the Cabinet, members of the Department of Interior, family, ladies and gentlemen:

It is a great thrill and a wonderful privilege for me to be here and to participate in the swearing-in of Stanley Hathaway, as Secretary of the Interior.

Stan's swearing-in will be another important piece in the putting together of a first-class Cabinet of men and women who will be extremely helpful to me and to the Congress and to the country, in policy advising responsibilities, in working with the Congress, in making this country a better place for all of us to live. He is another important ingredient in a team that we are going to have for the betterment of all of us.

Stan comes to this new responsibility after eight years as an extremely able and effective Governor of the great State of Wyoming. He was not only popular, but he got things done, and his record will go down in the history of the State of Wyoming as an outstanding one.

He was a good administrator, and he had a great desire and an effective one to do what was right for his people in that State. He brings to this position, as Secretary of Interior, the skills that he developed in eight years as Governor of that State, and he brings with it the same desire to do a first-class job as Secretary of Interior. 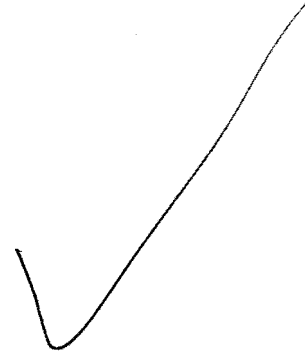

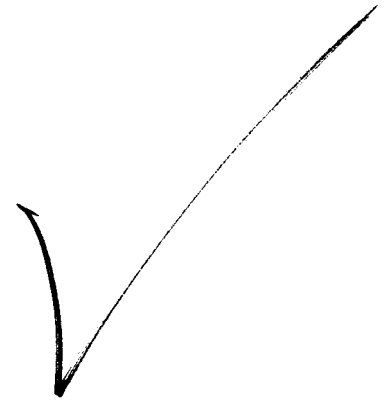

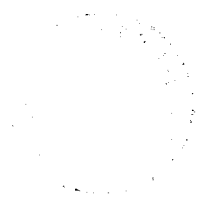

As reason for delay, they were advised that the very slight chance of a confirmation before the recess induced us to hold-off for now and thereby avoid having his name flapping in the wind for 7 weeks (notwithstanding the fact that the word is out on Banowsky, anyway).

All were agreeable but Fannin said rumor was already around the Hill that we were going to withdraw Banowsky altogether. He asked for positive denial of this assertion. Doug Bennett confirms that rumor is absolutely untrue and says he will tell Senator Fannin directly. I also informed the Senator in keeping with a commitment I had to get back to him immediately.
