UNITED NATIONS (UPI) -- THE SECURITY COUNCIL AGREED TODAY TO POSTPONE A DECISION ON THE APPLICATION OF VIETNAM FOR MEMBERSHIP IN THE UNITED NATIONS UNTIL AFTER THE U.S. ELECTIONS.

THE DECISION WAS TAKEN BEHIND CLOSED DOORS IN INFORMAL CONSULTATIONS AT THE SUGGESTION OF FRANCE.

THE PRESIDENT OF THE COUNCIL, AMBASSADOR MANSUR RASHID KIKHIA OF LIBYA, ANNOUNCED THE POSTPONEMENT THROUGH AN OFFICIAL SPOKESMAN. HE SAID IN A BRIEF STATEMENT THAT THE COUNCIL HAD DECIDED TO DEFER ITS CONSIDERATION OF THE APPLICATION UNTIL NOVEMBER SO THAT THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY COULD DISCUSS THE MATTER SIMULTANEOUSLY DURING ITS FORTHCOMING 31ST SESSION.

HE SAID THAT THE MISSION OF VIETNAM HAD AGREED TO THE POSTPONEMENT.

THE COUNCIL HAD SCHEDULED A MEETING OF ITS ADMISSIONS COMMITTEE FOR TUESDAY MORNING, BUT KIKHIA ANNOUNCED LATE MONDAY THAT IT HAD BEEN CANCELLED AND THAT COUNCIL WOULD INSTEAD HOLD INFORMAL CONSULTATIONS.

THE CANCELLATION WAS PROMPTED BY PRESIDENT FORD'S DECISION TO BLOCK ADMISSION OF VIETNAM TO THE UNITED NATIONS.

UNITED NATIONS (UPI) -- THE SECURITY COUNCIL TODAY DECIDED TO POSTPONE A DECISION ON VIETNAM'S APPLICATION FOR MEMBERSHIP IN THE UNITED NATIONS UNTIL AFTER THE NOV. 2 U.S. ELECTIONS.

THE DECISION TO POSTPONE ACTION ON VIETNAM'S MEMBERSHIP APPLICATION FOLLOWED BY ONE DAY U.S. AMBASSADOR WILLIAM SCRANTON'S ANNOUNCEMENT THAT THE UNITED STATES WOULD VETO THE APPLICATION.

A SPOKESMAN FOR COUNCIL PRESIDENT MANSUR RASHID KIKHIA OF LIBYA ANNOUNCED THE POSTPONEMENT, SAYING THE COUNCIL HAD DECIDED TO DEFER CONSIDERATION OF THE APPLICATION UNTIL NOVEMBER SO THAT THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY COULD DISCUSS THE MATTER SIMULTANEOUSLY DURING ITS 31ST SESSION.

HE SAID THAT VIETNAM AGREED TO THE DELAY.

IN HIS BRIEF STATEMENT, KIKHIA DID NOT MENTION THE U.S. ELECTIONS, BUT DIPLOMATIC TALK IN THE U.N. HAS CENTERED ON THE ASSUMPTION THAT THE UNITED STATES COULD NOT AGREE TO VIETNAM'S ADMISSION BEFORE THE ELECTIONS. SCRANTON'S ANNOUNCEMENT MONDAY LEFT NO DOUBT ABOUT THE U.S. POSITION.

SCRANTON SAID PRESIDENT FORD ORDERED THE VETO BECAUSE VIETNAM HAD NOT GIVEN A FULL ACCOUNTING OF AMERICANS MISSING IN ACTION DURING THE VIETNAM WAR.

A MEETING OF THE COUNCIL'S ADMISSION COMMITTEE WAS SCHEDULED TO DISCUSS THE APPLICATION TODAY, BUT KIKHIA ANNOUNCED LATE YESTERDAY THAT IT HAD BEEN CANCELED AND THE COUNCIL INSTEAD WOULD HOLD INFORMAL CONSULTATIONS.

DIPLOMATIC SOURCES PREDICTED THAT EFFORTS WOULD BE MADE IN THE NEXT TWO MONTHS TO ENCOURAGE NEGOTIATIONS BETWEEN VIETNAM AND THE UNITED STATES FOR A SOLUTION TO THE MIA PROBLEM.

JIMMY CARTER AGREES WITH PRESIDENT FORD'S REFUSAL TO ALLOW VIETNAM TO JOIN THE UNITED NATIONS AND SAYS THE MEN APPOINTED TO THE SUPREME COURT BY FORD AND RICHARD NIXON ARE DOING A GOOD JOB.

IT APPARENTLY IS PART OF AN EFFORT BY THE CARTER CAMPAIGN TO PUT A MORE CONSERVATIVE FOOT FORWARD IN THE SECOND WEEK OF THE CANDIDATE'S TRAVELS IN SEARCH OF VOTES. BUT THAT HASN'T SLOWED CARTER'S CRITICISM OF FORD'S LEADERSHIP.

THE PRESIDENT DEFENDED HIS STAY-AT-HOME STRATEGY TODAY, SAYING THAT AS LONG AS THE DEMOCRATIC-CONTROLLED CONGRESS IS IN SESSION HE HAS TO "MAKE SURE IT DOESN'T GO OFF THE DEEP END."

FORD SAID IN AN INTERVIEW: "WHEN WE DO HAVE AN OPPORTUNITY FOLLOWING THE TIME CONGRESS ADJOURNS, WE CERTAINLY WILL BE CAMPAIGNING. WITH CONGRESS IN SESSION, IT IS VITALLY IMPORTANT THAT SOMEONE BE HERE TO CHECK ON THEIR ACTIVITIES."

THE PRESIDENT SPOKE ON NBC-TV'S "TODAY SHOW."

CARTER BEGAN MONDAY IN THE SOUTH; THEN CHASED THE SUN ACROSS THE COUNTRY; ENDING HIS DAY IN ARIZONA.

FOR FORD, THE SECOND WEEK OF THE CAMPAIGN BEGAN LIKE THE FIRST WEEK - WITH THE PRESIDENT STUDIOUSLY REMAINING AWAY FROM THE CAMPAIGN TRAIL.

ALTHOUGH HE WAS NOT SEEING ANY POTENTIAL VOTERS; PLENTY OF THEM WERE SEEING HIM AS HE SIGNED BILLS AT CEREMONIES DESIGNED TO PUT HIM BEFORE THE TELEVISION CAMERAS AND EMPHASIZING HIS WHITE HOUSE RESIDENCY.

FORD, WHO HAS LEFT THE WHITE HOUSE ONLY ONCE SINCE THE FALL CAMPAIGN SEASON BEGAN ON LABOR DAY; PLANS TO LEAVE WASHINGTON ON WEDNESDAY FOR A SPEECH AT HIS ALMA MATER; THE UNIVERSITY OF MICHIGAN. HE PLANNED TO MEET WITH HIS SPEECH WRITERS TODAY TO POLISH THE MICHIGAN ADDRESS.

IN HIS INTERVIEW TODAY, FORD SAID HE WILL USE HIS MICHIGAN SPEECH TO REVIEW HIS RECORD; AND HE PROMISED SOME SURPRISES.

QUESTIONED IN THE OVAL OFFICE BY REPORTERS IN NEW YORK WHO USED A LONG-DISTANCE TELEVISION HOOKUP; THE PRESIDENT GAVE THIS AS THE THRUST OF HIS UPCOMING SPEECH:

JIMMY CARTER AGREES WITH PRESIDENT FORD'S REFUSAL TO ALLOW VIETNAM TO JOIN THE UNITED NATIONS AND SAYS THE MEN APPOINTED TO THE SUPREME COURT BY FORD AND RICHARD NIXON ARE DOING A GOOD JOB.

IT APPARENTLY IS PART OF AN EFFORT BY THE CARTER CAMPAIGN TO PUT A MORE CONSERVATIVE FOOT FORWARD IN THE SECOND WEEK OF THE CANDIDATE'S TRAVELS IN SEARCH OF VOTES. BUT THAT HASN'T SLOWED CARTER'S CRITICISM OF FORD'S LEADERSHIP.

THE PRESIDENT DEFENDED HIS STAY-AT-HOME STRATEGY TODAY, SAYING THAT AS LONG AS THE DEMOCRATIC-CONTROLLED CONGRESS IS IN SESSION HE HAS TO "MAKE SURE IT DOESN'T GO OFF THE DEEP END."

FORD SAID IN AN INTERVIEW: "WHEN WE DO HAVE AN OPPORTUNITY FOLLOWING THE TIME CONGRESS ADJOURNS, WE CERTAINLY WILL BE CAMPAIGNING. WITH CONGRESS IN SESSION, IT IS VITALLY IMPORTANT THAT SOMEONE BE HERE TO CHECK ON THEIR ACTIVITIES."

THE PRESIDENT SPOKE ON NBC-TV'S "TODAY SHOW."

CARTER BEGAN MONDAY IN THE SOUTH; THEN CHASED THE SUN ACROSS THE COUNTRY; ENDING HIS DAY IN ARIZONA.

FOR FORD, THE SECOND WEEK OF THE CAMPAIGN BEGAN LIKE THE FIRST WEEK - WITH THE PRESIDENT STUDIOUSLY REMAINING AWAY FROM THE CAMPAIGN TRAIL.

ALTHOUGH HE WAS NOT SEEING ANY POTENTIAL VOTERS, PLENTY OF THEM WERE SEEING HIM AS HE SIGNED BILLS AT CEREMONIES DESIGNED TO PUT HIM BEFORE THE TELEVISION CAMERAS AND EMPHASIZING HIS WHITE HOUSE RESIDENCY.

FORD, WHO HAS LEFT THE WHITE HOUSE ONLY ONCE SINCE THE FALL CAMPAIGN SEASON BEGAN ON LABOR DAY, PLANS TO LEAVE WASHINGTON ON WEDNESDAY FOR A SPEECH AT HIS ALMA MATER, THE UNIVERSITY OF MICHIGAN. HE PLANNED TO MEET WITH HIS SPEECH WRITERS TODAY TO POLISH THE MICHIGAN ADDRESS.

IN HIS INTERVIEW TODAY, FORD SAID HE WILL USE HIS MICHIGAN SPEECH TO REVIEW HIS RECORD, AND HE PROMISED SOME SURPRISES.

QUESTIONED IN THE OVAL OFFICE BY REPORTERS IN NEW YORK WHO USED A LONG-DISTANCE TELEVISION HOOKUP, THE PRESIDENT GAVE THIS AS THE THRUST OF HIS UPCOMING SPEECH:
