"There may be as many as eight such trips but not that many in the immediate future," Nessen said.

He said Ford wants to be in Washington during Congressional sessions.

White House sources said the Atlanta trip probably would be Feb. 3-4. Nessen said if Ford goes to Atlanta, he would address a meeting of the Opportunities Industrial Corporation, a black self-help group he has aided since before becoming President.

Atomic Bombs to Kill Cancer

Palo Alto, Calif. (UPI) -- Cancer researchers at Stanford University said today they had developed a radiation device that would kill cancer cells with "miniature nuclear explosions."

Dr. Henry Kaplan, a leading expert on Hodgkins disease, said the approach was "absolutely unique" and would produce little or no damage to nearby healthy organs or tissue.

The device is designed for use on cancers of the mouth and throat, certain tumors of the brain and lungs and those which presently resist conventional radiation.

Old Timers Bid Fox Farewell

Washington (UPI) -- Jacqueline Kennedy Onassis sent a telegram and White House social secretaries and press secretaries dating back to the Truman era showed up Friday for Betty Ford's farewell party for Sanford Fox, retiring chief of the Presidential Entertainment Office. *75*

More than 100 persons who had known Fox through his White House years helped salute him on the occasion of his retirement after 32 years in government.

Fox has had charge of the handlettering of White House invitations and placecards at all of the State functions.

In her telegram, Mrs. Onassis said: "I wish I could be with you today on this very special occasion. I know how much you will be missed at the White House. But I hope your future years will be very special ones."

Mrs. Ford presented Fox with a certificate of meritorious service from the President and a numbered oil painting.

Frank Wisner III, a State Department official here, said yesterday his mother went to London to avoid publicity over the marriage.

A New Columnist

Former White House aide Pat Buchanan has found himself a job. Starting the first week in March he'll be writing a column three times a week for both the St. Louis Globe-Democrat and the Special Features Syndicate of the New York Times News Service.

Buchanan will report out of Washington on "the entire spectrum of human affairs" and matters national and international, according to a spokesman for the Globe-Democrat.

Festive Farewell

Sanford L. Fox, the White House calligrapher who has had a hand in presidential invitations since the days of FDR, was honored at a farewell retirement party yesterday. Ending 32 years of government service, Fox was chief of the social entertainments office at the White House.

First Lady Betty Ford and her daughter, Susan, were among the 100 guests in the White House theater where there were special gifts for Fox and a certificate of meritorious service from President Ford.

Letitia Baldrige, White House social secretary in the Kennedy administration, brought a special message from Jacqueline Kennedy Onassis.
