THE FULL-SERVICE COMMERCIAL BANK, STATE CHARTERED WITH 7,000 SHAREHOLDERS AND \$3 MILLION CAPITALIZATION, IS SAID BY ITS OFFICIAL TO BE THE FIRST ORGANIZED BY WOMEN AND THE "ONLY AMERICAN BANK COMMITTED TO ECONOMIC PARITY FOR WOMEN."

BANK EXECUTIVES SAID SPECIAL EFFORTS WILL BE MADE TO INFORM WOMEN ON ESTABLISHING CREDIT AND QUALIFYING FOR LOANS.
