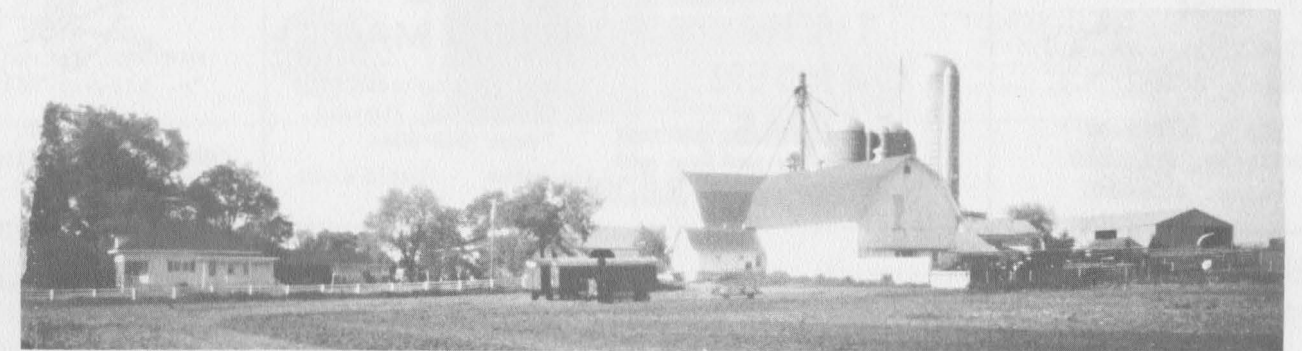


The young men from Harvard High School F.F.A. program will escort Milk Day visitors to the Leonard Nerge farm on Rte. 14 North of Harvard; the Harold Weeks' farm South of Sharon on Burr Oak Road and the Dean Milk Processing plant in Chemung. Busses will leave from Jefferson School at 9 a.m. returning in time for the Milk Day Parade.

The Nerge's have four people involved in the farm operation, presently milking 31 cows and raising 60 heifers. They have five tractors and other miscellaneous farm equipment used to produce crops on this 140 acre farm. Mr. Nerge has lived on a farm for his entire life, and has been at the present location for the past sixteen years.



The Harold Week's farm is staffed by members of five families and two outside helpers. Fifteen hundred acres are involved in the operation of which 200 acres are owned by the Weeks. They have five tractors over 105 H.P., 1 semi, 2 cyclone planters. They have storage room for 110,000 bushels of corn. They are presently milking 75 cows. Father Harold Weeks has been on the farm for fifty years.
