
We have been informed that the King of Sweden will be presenting you with an inscribed photograph and a medallion commemorating the Bicentennial during his upcoming visit to the United States.

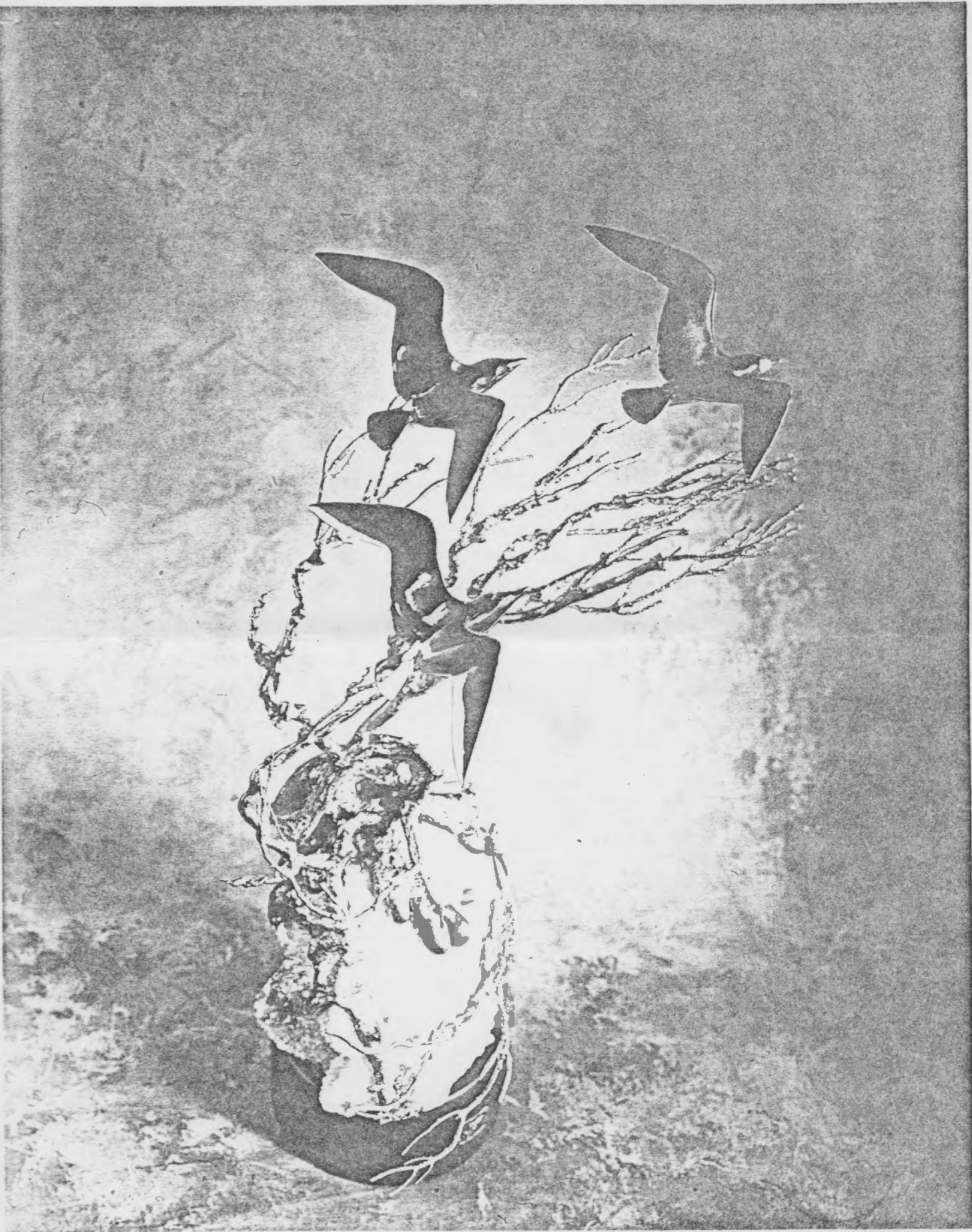

"TWO CHAMPS", A BRONZE SCULPTURE BY HARRY JACKSON,
PRESENTED BY PRESIDENT AND MRS. FORD AS THE STATE GIFT
TO HER MAJESTY QUEEN ELIZABETH II AND THE PRINCE PHILIP

Washington, D. C....July 7, 1976..."Two Champs", a bronze statue on a solid Wyoming jade base, sculpted by the renowned artist Harry Jackson of Lost Cabin, Wyoming, was presented today by President and Mrs. Ford to Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II and Prince Philip at the White House, on the occasion of the royal couple's State Visit to the United States.

Incised into the bronze base of the sculpture are the following words:

"To Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II and His Royal Highness The Prince Philip Duke of Edinburgh from the President of the United States and Mrs. Ford, July 7, 1976."

The sculpture (measuring 33" x 19 1/2" x 15 1/2") depicts the famous cowboy Clayton Danks astride "Steamboat"; the first nationally known bucking horse. The bronze thus commemorates a champion rider and a champion horse. Danks, winner of two world championships in 1907 and 1909 at the Cheyenne Frontier Days Rodeo, became a legend in cowboy history. (His widow, Marie Fitger Danks, lives today at age 91 in the Pioneer Home, Thermopolis, Wyoming.

On June 22nd the State Department wrote the sculptor, "Thank you for this fine sculpture and the opportunity it gives The President to demonstrate the strength and beauty of art in our country."

Harry Jackson is the outstanding sculptor of the American frontier. He spends half of his year at a special bronze casting foundry in Italy, and the other half in his studio and with his horses in Wyoming. He has had many unusual commissions, including TIME cover portraits, and the monumental "Stampede" and "The Range Burial" works. Jackson's sculptures and paintings are in major museums and private collections around the world.

INFORMATION FOR MRS. FORD'S PRESS OFFICE OF THE OFFICIAL GIFT EXCHANGE DURING THE STATE VISIT OF HIS EXCELLENCY WILLIAM R. TOLBERT, JR., PRESIDENT OF THE REPUBLIC OF LIBERIA, AND MRS. TOLBERT, SEPTEMBER 21, 1976

To President Ford from H.E. William R. Tolbert, Jr.:

1. A heavy wooden map of Liberia showing the nine counties and rock types indigenous to the different areas of the country. It measures 30" x 27" and the frame is 4" thick. The wooden framed map on wooden background is made of the 5 types of wood found in Liberia. The counties are shown by the different colored rocks: lenticular gneiss, quartz, quartzo-felspathic gneiss, granite, pink granite gneiss, banded biotite gneiss, diabase, and granite gneiss.
2. A large color photograph of President Tolbert, white matted and framed in mahogany wood with ivory inlaid birds and stars. Photograph in matting measures 20 inches by 24 inches; in frame 27" by 31". Inscription reads "Cordially yours, W.R. Tolbert" with Liberian flag in background.
3. An off-white ceremonial robe ornamented with heavy applied designs in glossy white threads, matching cap with tassel.
4. A full-length color photograph of President Tolbert with a sitting room background inscribed by donor: "To President Gerald R. Ford, With highest esteem, William R. Tolbert." In a silver frame, the photograph measures 11" x 13 1/2" with the Presidential crest at top.

To Mrs. Ford from Mrs. Tolbert:

1. Mahogany inlaid jewelry box, 10 inches by 7 inches by 3 inches, with purple velvet lining, containing gold necklace and bracelet in African design
2. Autographed black and white photograph, 15 1/2 inches by 12 inches, of Mrs. Victoria A. Tolbert, in a gilt-colored wooden frame.

To President and Mrs. Tolbert from President and Mrs. Ford:

A formal portrait of the President of Liberia and Mrs. Tolbert and the President and Mrs. Ford, in a silver frame with the Presidential Seal.

To the President of Liberia from President Ford:

A sterling silver plate/plaque with a portrait of George Washington etched in vermeil, limited edition issued by the White House Historical Association.

To Mrs. Tolbert from Mrs. Ford:

An old fashioned "Rose Jar" with six different roses cameoed on the porcelain panels, made by Cybis Porcelain, approx. 4 inches tall.

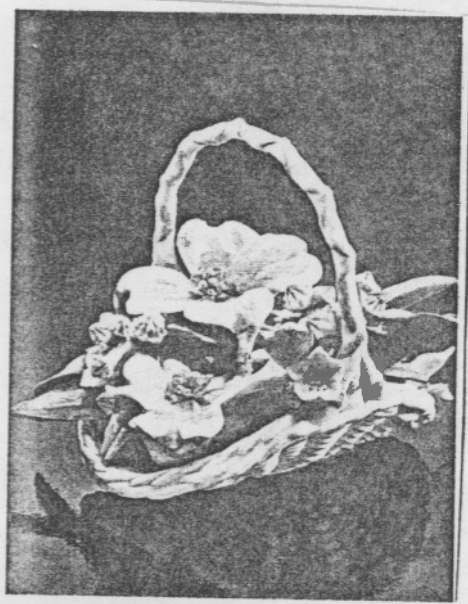

We have been advised that, although forewarned of our modest/token gift program, the Pakistani Prime Minister and Begum Bhutto are bringing you a "painted screen", Mrs. Ford a "carpet" and your children "tennis rackets" and "chess sets". Upon the recommendation of the Pakistani experts of the Department of State, I am recommending the following as a response in kind, the absence of which might give offense to your guests. These gifts have all been drawn from objects purchased for use as official gifts prior to last Summer. Your and Mrs. Ford's use of them now will demonstrate one more aspect of your determination to reduce spending.

For the Prime Minister --
