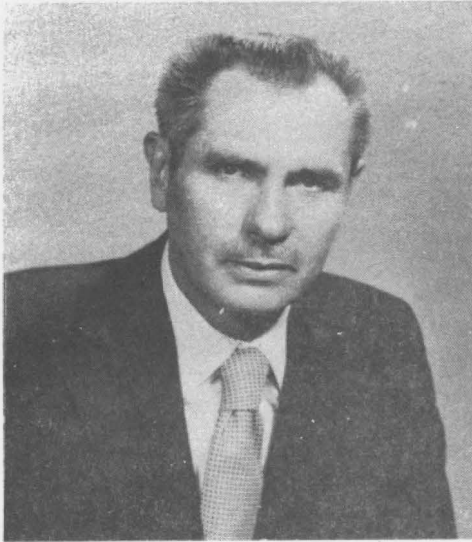

Ambassador Eilts was born in Germany in 1922, and received his B.A. from Ursinus College in 1943 and an M.A. from the School of Advanced International Studies in 1947. He served as a First Lieutenant in the U.S. Army from 1942-45.

Ambassador Eilts joined the Foreign Service in 1947, serving in Tehran, Jidda, Aden, Baghdad, London, and Tripoli, as well as in the Department. He was Ambassador to Saudi Arabia from 1965 to 1970, and holds the rank of Career Minister. He took up his current duties in Cairo on November 11, 1973.

Ambassador Eilts speaks Arabic. He is married to the former Helen Brew.

It is not necessary to play the Anthems at strictly social functions or at formal luncheons and dinners, as awkward situations and inconveniences may result. It is not the custom in Washington, D.C. to play the National Anthems at State Dinners or Luncheons. When the Anthems are played at events, it is customary to play the Anthem of the visitor's country first, then the National Anthem of the United States.

FLAGS: When the flags of the United States and the visitor's country are used, consider the area where the flags are to be placed as a stage or focal point, then place the flag of the United States on the left as viewed from the audience, and the visitor's flag on the right.
