Also there will probably a Bipartisan meeting early, as well a drop by of a social event in the city in the evening.

TODAY: The President met with Gyula Szeker (the usual pronunciation), who just so happens to be the Deputy Prime Minister of Hungary. He is here at our invitation to meet with businessmen, etc. His visit to the WH today is purely a courtesy call.

Also today, the President will meet with Helmut Kohl, CDC-CSU Coalition Candidate. He is here on his own initiative to meet with various business groups, etc.

FEC VETO: The President hasn't even seen the bill yet. Not sure if it will arrive here today. Ron doesn't expect a decision right when it arrives here anyway. We'll wait and see.

President met with Morton this a. m. (Press allowed to ask questions concerning primary at 12:30 event.) Ron said the Pres. and Morton had a brief review of where things stand with the campaign. Ron said our problem was that the President and his campaign have not adequately explained the genuine accomplishments of this President as the Pres. sees them. Those accomplishments are: 1. restoring the economy, 2. accomplishments in the field of foreign affairs, and 3. restoration of trust, confidence, and honesty in the Adm. The President feels very firmly that he is going to win the nomination and win on the first ballot in Kansas City. The party will unite behind him and he will attract Independent and Democratic voters in November.

FEC:

The bill arrived late yesterday at the WH, the Pres. gave instructions to his staff to move as quickly as possible to review it and give him their recommendations as quickly as possible. He also asked some members of Congress for their recommendations.

WPI:

The Wholesale Price Index is up 8 10ths of 1% - this is attributed to an increase in farm products and processed foods.....so watch it all you farm product and processed food consumers in the audience!!!!!!

CAMPAIGN STRATEGY:

When asked whether or not the President has adopted any new campaign strategy in view of the recent primary results, Ron said that campaign strategy is assessed and reassessed on a daily basis. If there were a strategy change we wouldn't announce it openly. Campaign strategy is reviewed in the light of many things. In addition, when asked to comment on whether or not the President is laying the blame on anyone for the losses in Texas, etc., Ron indicated the President doesn't blame anyone.

When questioned if the President still wants Sen. Tower to be his floor manager at the Republican Convention, Ron said that the President continues to want Tower to be his floor manager. The PFC is looking into it.

OREGON AND CALIFORNIA

Here are some of the cities and some of the events that will take place on this weekend's trip:

We anticipate, at the present time, a departure on Saturday by the President in the 9 a.m. area. That would mean the press would be leaving an hour or so earlier.

On Saturday, the first stop will be Medford, Oregon, where the President will address a public rally. Saturday evening, he will speak to the World Affairs Council in Portland. The overnight will be in Portland.

On Sunday, he will deliver the commencement address at Warner Pacific College in Portland. In the afternoon, he will go to Pendleton, Oregon for another address to a public rally. During the afternoon, he will participate in a Bicentennial event at Mission Viejo. And in the evening, he will speak at Leisure World (a senior citizens community) in Laguna Hills. The overnight will be in Anaheim.

On Monday, the President will speak before the California Peace Officers Convention in Anaheim and in the afternoon he will be in San Diego. On Monday the overnight will be in Los Angeles.

LUNCH LID UNTIL 3 P.M.

QUESTION: Mr. President, there is an element of skepticism about your participation on the busing issue. Why are you doing this now and how would that affect the Kentucky primary?

THE PRESIDENT: First, let me say this: I have vigorously opposed court ordered forced busing to achieve racial balance from the very beginning, and that goes back to about 1964 and 1965. I have a consistent record that court ordered forced busing is not the way to achieve racial balance.

Last November I got the Attorney General and the Secretary of HEW, David Mathews, together and I said we have to find a better answer, a better remedy to quality education because court ordered forced busing is not the answer.

So, as far back as November I have been working with those two Cabinet officers and they have met with me, submitted option papers to me over that period of time. Several months ago the Attorney General told me that he and his Solicitor, Mr. Robert Bork, were looking for a case where the Federal Government might intervene. I didn't decide which case, and I am not sure which case today that they might intervene, in order to try and get the court to take a slightly different viewpoint or a viewpoint that is different from the court decisions up to date.

I am for desegregation, but I am totally opposed to court ordered forced busing.

Now, the White House didn't release any of this information that has come to the news media over the last three or four days. If I had wanted to, for political purposes, I could have gotten the Attorney General perhaps before the Massachusetts primary to intervene, or he might have decided to intervene prior to the Michigan primary.

As of now he hasn't told me whether he will or he won't. He might do so in Louisville. I don't know. That is a decision that I left to the Attorney General to make, and I just want to be informed if and when he does.

QUESTION: Is your Administration going to offer an alternative to busing?

THE PRESIDENT: Well, there are two answers to that. One, there is a possibility that the Attorney General may intervene in one of the court cases that are now in the Federal Courts. That is one possibility.

Number two, as I indicated, I have asked the Attorney General and the Secretary of HEW to find some other alternatives that would be far preferable to court ordered forced busing --

QUESTION: Have they commented?

THE PRESIDENT: -- and they have submitted to me three alternatives that I will pass judgment on probably within the next few weeks. They appear to be constructive, and I hope would be effective.

QUESTION: Can you tell us what they are?

THE PRESIDENT: I would rather wait until I have made the final decision, but we are in the process right now.
