RON NESSEN BRIEFING

June 1, 1976

10 A. M. POSTINGS:

Numerous bill signings and personnel announcements plus transmittal to Congress of report on Actions Taken by the United Nations to Obtain an Accounting of Americans Missing in Action in S. E. Asia.

ANNOUNCEMENTS:

Second Supplemental Appropriations Act of 1976 bill signing at 3:30 p.m. today. Will provide money for Italian earthquake relief in the amount of \$25 million. (Margaret Earl, Big Deal to the President, will be putting together a fact sheet on the bill.)

PRIMARIES:

Same schedule as on previous Tuesdays. PFC will be open and Morton will be available to answer questions there. Ron will be here at the White House. President feels his chances are good in Rhode Island and will do well in South Dakota.

WEEKEND TRAVEL:

Sunday in New Jersey and Monday in Ohio. Overnight in Ohio. Return to Washington early Monday evening. Return to Calif. not likely due to limited funds and the President's schedule. Mrs. Ford and some of the children will be campaigning in Calif. for the President as well as other Adm. spokesmen. PFC pays for Mrs. Ford's and the children's travel. President is running on his record in Calif. and feels he is running behind but is closing the gap and will continue to do so.

INTERNATIONAL ECONOMIC
CONFERENCE:

Discussions on meeting are not yet completed but Ron expects to have something later in the week. Meeting to take place late in June, in Puerto Rico. The U.S. initiated the meeting. Same countries who participated in Rambouillet. I will participate in meeting plus Canada. Meeting has been in the works for about 2 1/2 to 3 months. (Greenspan brought to the President's attention the need for such a meeting.) 2 factors brought it about -- (1) Recovery proceeding faster in some countries, and (2) Economic matters within individual countries.

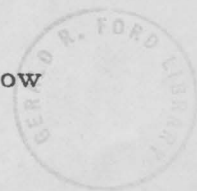

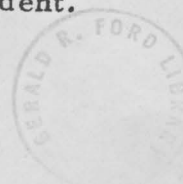
