4. Approval of management memo for OMB (Lynn plans to put this out in Press Conference on Friday).

Lynn: Will have briefing on Thursday on "Current Services Budget Projections" for '78 and '79.

He will be sending to President tomorrow Defense Department review of budget Economic Assumptions, and major choices and decisions in order to achieve a balanced budget in '79. Expects DOD brass to be in here next week to review DOD budget.

Seidman: A lot of his people, secretaries, concerned about future. There should be an agreement with Carter that these secretaries can stay in Government. Cavanaugh assigned job of working this out and getting word out.

Hyland: Met with David Arron, Carter's liaison with NSC. He wanted routine organizational information. Hyland gave him a list of those who wanted to stay.

Seidman: Asked which documents you can and can not take with you (Buchen said Justice is working on a memo).

Buchen: Networks had a story last night saying Justice Department is holding back on prosecuting draft dodgers and deserters waiting for Carter. (Buchen will check this out).

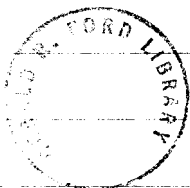

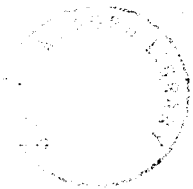

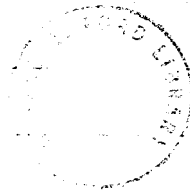
