NOTICE TO THE PRESS

Preceding their participation in Farnborough International 74 at Farnborough, England, the crew of a SAC SR-71 aircraft from Beale Air Force Base, California, attempted and set a new world speed record of 1 hour and 56 minutes from New York to London.

The previous record of 4 hours and 46 minutes was set by a British Royal Navy F-4K in 1969. The SR-71, with a second crew, returned to its home base in California on September 11th setting another world record of 3 hours and 48 minutes from London to Los Angeles. (There was no previous record.) The SR-71 reached speeds in excess of 2,000 mph (Mach 3+) and altitudes above 80,000 feet on both flights.
