THE WHITE HOUSE

The President today announced his intention to nominate Peter H. Dominick, of Englewood, Colorado, to be Ambassador to Switzerland. He will succeed Shelby Davis who is resigning.

From 1963 to January, 1975, Senator Dominick was a member of the United States Senate. In 1955 to 1958 and 1958 to 1961 he was a member of the House of Representatives, Colorado General Assembly and from 1961 to 1963 he was a member of the 87th Congress, from the 2nd District of Colorado. From 1947 to 1961 he was a partner with Holland and Hart and from 1947 to 1956 he was an Attorney in Cherry Hills, Colorado. From 1946 to 1947 he was an Associate with White and Holland in Denver, Colorado.

Senator Dominick was born on July 7, 1915, in Stamford, Connecticut. Mr. Dominick received an A. B. degree in 1937 and a J. D. degree in 1940 from Yale University. He was admitted to the New York Bar in 1940 and from 1940 to 1942 he was an Associate with Carter, Ledyard and Milburn, of New York City. He served in the United States Army Air Force as a Captain from 1942 to 1946.

Senator Dominick is married to the former Nancy Parks and they have four children. They reside in Englewood, Colorado.
