THE WHITE HOUSE

The President today announced that he intends to appoint five persons as members of the Advisory Commission on Intergovernmental Relations for terms of two years. They are:

John H. Altorfer, of Peoria, Illinois. He succeeds Howard H. Callaway.

James T. Lynn, Director of the Office of Management and Budget. He succeeds George P. Schultz.

Governor Richard F. Kneip, of Salem, South Dakota. This is a reappointment.

Governor Philip W. Noel, of Warwick, Rhode Island. He succeeds Dale Bumpers who has resigned.

Robert P. Knowles, of Richmond, Wisconsin, State Senator of Wisconsin. This is a reappointment.

The Commission was established by Public Law 86-380 of September 24, 1959, and consists of 26 members serving terms of two years. Of the 26 members, 20 are appointed by the President, 3 by the President of the Senate, and 3 by the Speaker of the House.

The Commission was established to maintain a continuing review of the operation of the Federal system and make recommendations for improvements.
