The President today announced the appointment of seven persons as members to the National Advisory Council on Vocational Education for terms of three years. They are:

JoAnn Cullen, of Bristol, Pennsylvania, student,
Trenton State College, Trenton, New Jersey.
This is a reappointment.

Marvin J. Feldman, of Montclair, New Jersey, President,
Fashion Institute of Technology, New York, New York. This
is a reappointment.

Russell H. Graham, of Coffeyville, Kansas, President,
Coffeyville Community Junior College; also Adjunct Professor,
Kansas State College of Pittsburgh, Pittsburgh, Kansas.
He succeeds Luis M. Morton, Jr., whose term expired.

Thomas A. Jackson, of Great Falls, South Carolina, Director,
Lancaster Vocational Center, Lancaster, South Carolina.
He succeeds Martha G. Bachman, whose term expired.

Walter K. Kerr, of Tyler, Texas, President, National
Youth Foundation; President, Texas Industry Council for
Career Education; State Coordinator of Industry, Education
and Labor, Tyler, Texas. He succeeds James A. Rhodes
whose term expired.

Malcolm R. Lovell, Jr., of the District of Columbia,
President, Rubber Manufacturers Association, Washington,
D.C. He succeeds Sal B. Hoffman whose term expired.

Robert Boisseau Pamplin, of Lake Oswego, Oregon,
President, R.B. Pamplin Corporation, Lake Oswego, Oregon.
He succeeds David Van Alstyne, Jr., whose term expired.

The President today also designated John W. Thiele, of Fort Smith,
Arkansas, presently a member serving a term expiring January 17,
1976, to serve as Chairman of the Council. He succeeds James A.
Rhodes in this capacity.

The Council consists of 21 members serving staggered terms of three
years. The purpose of the Council is to review the possible duplication
of vocational education programs at the postsecondary and adult levels
within geographic areas and make annual reports to the Secretary of
Health, Education and Welfare.
