The President's Schedule

The President came to the Oval Office this morning at 7:40 a.m. He held meetings with members of his staff during the morning.

At 11:00 a.m., the President will meet with members of the Executive Committee of the Farm Bureau. The purpose of the meeting is to hear the views of the American Farm Bureau Federation regarding grain sales to the Soviet Union. Participating in the meeting will be William J. Kuhfuss, President of the Farm Bureau; Roger Fleming, Secretary-Treasurer of the Bureau; Allan Lauterbach, General Counsel of the Farm Bureau; Secretaries Butz and Dunlop and L. William Seidman. There will be photo coverage.

At 12:10 p.m., he will tape television messages for four organizations. They are for the President's Exhibit at the Center of Science and Industry, the March of Dimes Dinner, the National Endowment for the Arts 10th Anniversary, and the Federal Bar Association. This will take place in the Library.

The Clemency Board Meeting, originally announced for today at 5:30 p.m., will be held on Tuesday. The meeting was postponed because of the Religious Holiday.
