The President today announced the appointment of five persons as members of the National Advisory Council on Adult Education. They are:

Charles P. Puksta, of Claremont, New Hampshire, Manager of Training, Jones and Lamson Division of Waterbury Farrel (Textron Company), and Mayor of Claremont, New Hampshire. This for a term held by Norbert J. Hruby expiring July 10, 1976.

Donald G. Butcher, of Big Rapids, Michigan, Dean, School of General Education, Ferris State College, Big Rapids, Michigan. This is for a term expiring July 10, 1978. He succeeds Harold Spears whose term expired.

Alton C. Crews, of Charleston, South Carolina, Superintendent, Charleston County Public Schools, Charleston, South Carolina. This is for a term expiring July 10, 1978. He succeeds Alfredo N. Saenz whose term expired.

Kyo R. Jhin, of Huntsville, Alabama, Executive Director, Top of Alabama Regional Education Service Agency, Huntsville, Alabama. This is for a term expiring July 10, 1978. He succeeds Roberta Church whose term has expired.

Eugene L. Madeira, of Lancaster, Pennsylvania, Director, Adult Basic Education, School District of Lancaster, Pennsylvania. This is for a term expiring July 10, 1978. He succeeds Kong Lee whose term has expired.

The Council consists of 15 members appointed by the President for terms of 3 years.

The Council shall advise the Commissioner of Education in the preparation of general regulations and with respect to policy matters arising in the administration of adult education, including policies and procedures governing the approval of State plans and policies to eliminate duplication, and to effectuate the coordination of programs offering adult education activities and services.
