THE WHITE HOUSE

The President today announced his intention to nominate Harold F. Eberle, of Cathedral City, California, to be a Deputy Under Secretary of the Treasury. His area of responsibility will be Legislative Affairs. He will succeed Frederick L. Webber who resigned effective September 1, 1975. Upon confirmation by the Senate and appointment by the President, the President intends to designate Mr. Eberle as an Assistant Secretary of the Treasury.

In September 1974, Mr. Eberle joined Parsons and Whittemore, Inc., in New York City as Project Development Officer, serving until July 1975. From 1973 to September 1974, he was Assistant to the Director of the Office of Management and Budget for Congressional Relations. He was Assistant to the President for Congressional Relations of the Overseas Private Investment Corporation. From July 1961 to November 1972, he was Administrative Assistant to the late Congressman Robert J. Corbett. He was a Foreign Service Officer with the Department of State from September 1955 to June 1961, after having been with Dean Whitter & Co. as a registered representative from February 1954 to September 1955.

Mr. Eberle was born on May 14, 1925, in Los Angeles, Galifornia. He attended Woodbury College and received his B.B.A. degree in 1948. He received a B.A. from Sacramento State College in 1954. He served in the United States Army Air Corps from 1943 to 1945 and the United States Air Force from 1948 to 1953.

Mr. Eberle is married to the former Jane Sudderth. They reside in the District of Columbia.
