The President today announced the appointment of Marshall L. Lind, of Juneau, Alaska, as a member of the National Advisory Council on Adult Education for a term expiring July 10, 1978. He will succeed Charles P. Puksta whose term expired July 10, 1975.

Since 1971, Mr. Lind has been the Commissioner of Education for the State of Alaska. From 1969 to 1971, he was Superintendent of Schools for the Kodiak Island Borough School District in Kodiak, Alaska. He was Administrative Assistant to Dean W. R. Hazard of Northwestern University from 1967 to 1969. During 1966 to 1967, he was Area Supervisor for the Bureau of Indian Affairs Day School at Emmonak, Alakanuk, Kotlik, Mountain Village and Sheldons Point in Alaska. From 1962 to 1966 he was principal teacher for the Bureau of Indian Affairs Day School in Goodnews Bay, Alaska.

Mr. Lind was born on June 1, 1936, in Appleton, Wisconsin, and received his B. S. degree from the University of Wisconsin in 1958. He taught in Bonduel Community Schools in Bonduel, Wisconsin, from 1959 to 1961 and taught at the Bureau of Indian Affairs Day School in Kwigillingok, Alaska during 1961 to 1962. He received his M. Ed. from the University of Montana in 1965. He attended Northwestern University and received his Ph. D. in 1969.

Mr. Lind is married to the former Lois Zimmerman and they have three children.
