The President today announced the appointment of seven persons as members of the Advisory Committee for Trade Negotiations for terms of two years. They are:

Paul Hall, of Westwood, New Jersey, President, International Seafarer's Union of North America, Brooklyn, New York.

Samuel C. Johnson, of Racine, Wisconsin, Chairman and Chief Executive Officer, S. C. Johnson and Son, Inc., Racine, Wisconsin.

Donald M. Kendall, of Greenwich, Connecticut, Chairman of the Board and Chief Executive Officer, Pepsi Co, Inc., Purchase, New York.

Bruce N. Lynn, of Gilliam, Louisiana, President, Gilliam Gin Company, Gilliam, Louisiana.

Buck Mickel, of Greenville, South Carolina, Chairman, Daniel Construction Company, Greenville, South Carolina.

Myer Rashish, of the District of Columbia, Consulting Economist, Washington, D. C.

The Committee is composed of not more than 45 individuals, and shall include representatives of government, labor, industry, agriculture, small business, service industries, retailers, consumer interests, and the general public.

The Advisory Committee shall issue a report to the Congress as soon as is practical after the end of the period which ends 5 years after the date of enactment of P. L. 93-618.
