The President today announced the appointment of four persons as members of the Board of Directors of the Pennsylvania Avenue Development Corporation. They are:

Leonard A. Haft, of the District of Columbia, a partner in the firm of Cohen, Haft, Holtz Kerxton Karabekir and Associates (a planning and design firm) of Washington, D.C. This is for the remainder of the term expiring October 26, 1976. He succeeds Mrs. Jouett Shouse, who has resigned.

Thomas F. Murphy of Potomac, Maryland, President of the International Union of Bricklayers and Allied Craftsmen, AFL-CIO, Washington, D.C. This is for the remainder of the term expiring October 26, 1976. He succeeds John T. Connor, who has resigned.

Orlando W. Darden, of the District of Columbia, President of the Community Federal Savings and Loan Association of Washington. This is for the term expiring October 26, 1980. He succeeds Willie L. Leftwich, whose term has expired.

Mitchell I. Kafarski, of Bloomfield Hills, Michigan, Chairman of the Board, Aactron, Inc., of Madison Heights, Michigan. He is being reappointed for the term ending October 26, 1980.

The Corporation was established by Congress on October 27, 1972. The purpose of the Corporation is to provide for the preparation and carrying out of a development plan for areas between the White House and the Capitol.
