SECRETARY KISSINGER: We continued our explorations in a very friendly atmosphere, and we'll continue to stay in close touch.

QUESTION: Will you be in touch at all tomorrow or does this mean this was the last meeting?

SECRETARY KISSINGER: No. I expect to see both Mr. Bitsios and Mr. Esenbel tomorrow.

QUESTION: Dr. Kissinger, will you be going to Ankara any time soon?

SECRETARY KISSINGER: I have no immediate plan. I'm going back tomorrow as planned, but we'll stay in very close contact.

<u>QUESTION</u>: Will this — the train of thought that was started here in <u>Brussels</u> — will this continue on?

SECRETARY KISSINGER: I have great expectations that it will.
