SUBJECT: Delay of Military Equipment Transfer
Announcement to the ROC


The Deputy Assistant to the President for National Security Affairs requests that the Department of Defense delay notification to the Republic of China of the transfer to the ROC of the below-listed major items of U.S. military equipment until at least a week after President Ford returns from the People's Republic of China in early December. The Assistant to the President for National Security Affairs approved the transfer itself October 17.

-- Three excess T-28C trainer aircraft (memorandum from the Deputy Secretary of Defense, dated March 7, 1975 (Tab A)).

-- Four excess S-2E anti-submarine warfare (ASW) aircraft (memorandum from the Deputy Secretary of Defense, dated April 1, 1975 (Tab B)).

-- Two ocean-going minesweepers (MSOs) (memorandum from the Deputy Secretary of Defense, dated February 21, 1975 (Tab C)).

-- One thousand AIM-9J (sidewinder missile conversion kits) (memorandum from George S. Springsteen, Executive Secretary, Department of State, dated November 7, 1974 (Tab D)).

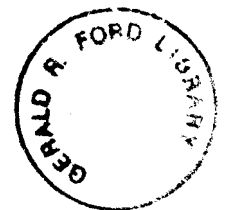
State recommends, and Clint Granger and I concur, that we hold off on notifying the Republic of China of the approved transfer of major items of U.S. military equipment until a week after the President leaves Peking. The ROC could make some ill-timed and mischievous press releases beforehand. Defense has no objection to the delay but would like confirmation in writing since the October 17 decision (Tab B) made no mention of delaying the notification.

RECOMMENDATION:

That you approve the memorandum to General Wickham at Tab A.

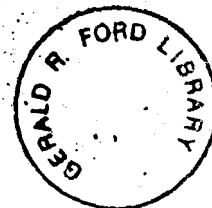

The Assistant to the President for National Security Affairs also has approved deactivation of the 327th Air Division and related support activities in Taipei Air Station with a small contingent of USAF air

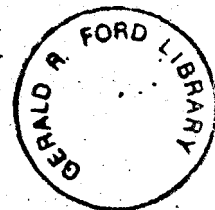

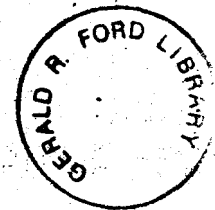

Our Office of Munitions Control has for its consideration the attached application for approval of a technical assistance agreement which would permit the Philco-Ford Corporation to modify one thousand AIM-9B missiles to the AIM-9J configuration. The Department of Defense has determined that this upgrading would significantly increase the ROC missile capability, and thus, in accordance with NSC Memorandum dated October 21, 1971, the agreement requires White House approval.

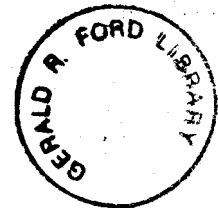
The Departments of Defense and State agree that there would be no objection to the Philco-Ford proposal and recommend approval. Their comments are attached.

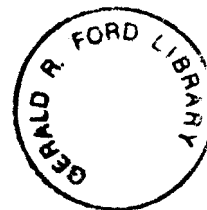

In the Staff Meeting last Friday, a question was raised concerning U.S. military equipment from Thailand being sent to Taiwan. We have learned that this equipment is primarily pierced steel planking (PSP) that is being included in our WRM stock in Taiwan.

This equipment is quite bulky and readily visible and it is conceivable that someone might get the idea that we are building something up in Taiwan. However, it all appears innocent enough and particularly sensible because if we left it in Thailand we would be sure to have it disappear in a very short period of time.

SUBJECT: Improved HAWK for Taiwan

The Secretariat returned your action, #8374, "FMS Sale of a Second Improved HAWK Battalion for Defense of Southern Taiwan" for coordination, prior to forwarding it to Brent.

I brought it back to your office, but you had departed; hence, in spite of the time pressure, I am returning it by memo.

I have no problem with the substance; and can appreciate the desire to settle the problem before the production lines are closed. However, implied in any sale of equipment is the agreement to provide the training required. In this case, the capability to train the ROC on I-HAWK will be delayed for some time because of lack of available facilities in the United States. I regret that the holiday season has made it impossible to give you a precise date, but those who could provide it are not available today in the Pentagon. However, to avoid any misunderstanding with the ROC later, any agreement to provide the I-HAWK should be accompanied with a warning that there will be a delay on the training. I would suggest a modification to your implementing letter as follows:

"The proposed sale is approved, subject to notification to the Republic of China that training on the Improved HAWK system will be delayed because of lack of United States training capability in the immediate future."

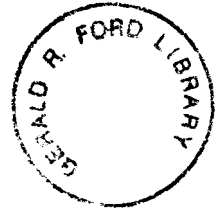

