2. AT THE END OF THE COMMENTS RECURDED PARA 6, THE PREMIER SAID THAT WITH THIS PUSITION IN MIND HE HAD LAID HXIS CARDS ON THE TABLE IN HIS RELATIONS WITH AMBASSADOR UNGER AT THEIR FIRST MEETING(LAST MAY) AND THEREAFTER; HE HAD ALSO CARRIED OUT EVERYTHING THAT HE SAID HE WOULD DD.

1. AMBASSADUR DISCUSSED QUESTION OF TEMPORARY STAGING OF REFUGEES FROM SOUTH VIETNAM WITH FOREIGN MINISTER SHEN CHIANG-HUAN, APRIL 19, ALONG LINES REFTEL EXCEPT FOR PARA 3. HE EMPHASIZED NOID TO KEEP SUBJECT IN STRICTEST CONFIDENCE AND THAT INQUIRY WAS FOR PURPOSE OF CONTINGENCY PLANNING ONLY AS INSTRUCTED REFTEL.

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

5. AMBASSADOR ALSO EXPRESSED APPRECIATION FOR FORMIN'S UNDER-STANDING AND HELPFUL ATTITUDE AND ASSURED HIM THAT WE WOULD KEEP GROC AS RULLY INFORMED AS POSSIBLE OF DEVELOPING SITUATION IN SAIGON. AMBASSADOR ALSO MENTIONED PRELIMINARY SURVEY CONDUCTED BY US MILITARY ON TAIWAN OF OUR CAPABILITIES HANDLING TRANSITING REFUGEES AT SUCH LOCATIONS AS CHING CHUAN MANG (CCK) AB AND TAINAN USING US ASSETS. AMBASSADOR ALSO EXPRESSED UNDERSTANDING OF ROC'S CONCERN ABOUT CHINESE AND SINU-VIETNAMESE WHO MAY SEEK EVACUATION FROM SOUTH VIETNAM AND SAFE-HARBOR IN TAIWAN. 3. PREMIER'S LETTER SHOULD BE ACKNOWLEDGED BY PRESIDENT FORD, AND AS PROMPTLY AS POSSIBLE, AS MATTER COURTESY TO LEADER OF A FRIENDLY NATION. MORE IMPORTANT, IT IS VERY MUCH IN OUR INTEREST TO SUSTAIN THE OPEN DIALOGUE, NOT YET SERIOUSLY DAMAGED, WHICH WE HAVE TRIED TO MAINTAIN WITH PREMIER CHIANG AS AN ESSENTIAL, PERHAPS THE MOST ESSENTIAL ELEMENT, IN THE CONDITIONING PROCESS BY WHICH WE HAVE BEEN SEEKING TO PREPARE THE ROC FOR THE FURTHER EVOLUTION OF OUR CHINA POLICY AND TO TRY TO ASSURE THE ROC'S CONSTRUCTIVE REACTION THERETO. EXPECT OR COUNTENANCE AND CONCERNS EXPRESSED PARA 5 CAN ALSO BE AVOIDED AS ROC HAS TO SOME EXTENT ALREADY DEMONSTRATED IN THE RELATIVE DIPLOMATIC ISOLATION WHICH IT HAS ALREADY EXPERIENCED.
