THE ACTING SECRETARY IS INFORMING INDIAN AMBASSADOR KAUL ON FEBRUARY 19 OF THE PRESIDENT'S DECISION TO LIFT THE EMBARGO ON EXPORTS OF MILITARY EQUIPMENT TO INDIA AND PAKISTAN AND WILL DELIVER TO KAUL A LETTER FROM THE SECRETARY TO EXTERNAL AFFAIRS MINISTER CHAVAN EXPLAINING OUR ACTION. OUR NEW POLICY WILL BE TO PERMIT SALES FOR CASH ON A CASE-BY-CASE BASIS, TAKING INTO ACCOUNT THE IMPACT ON THE OUTLOOK FOR REGIONAL PEACE. 2. BEGIN TEXT. DEAR MR. PRIME MINISTER : OUR TWO GOVERNMENTS ARE NOW WORKING WITH THE OTHER MEMBERS OF THE INTERNATIONAL ENERGY AGENCY TO COMPLETE AN OVERALL FRAMEWORK OF CONSUMER COUNTRY COOPERATION ON FINANCIAL SOLIDARITY, ENERGY CONSERVATION AND THE ACCELERATED DEVELOPMENT OF NEW ENERGY SUPPLIES. WE HAVE ALREADY REACHED AGREEMENTS ON THE FIRST TWO OF THESE. WE MUST NOW COMPLETE OUR OVERALL COOPERATIVE EFFORTS WITH BASIC UNDERSTANDINGS ON OUR APPROACH TO ACCELERATED DEVELOPMENT.

AS I SEE IT, OUR COMMON POLICY ON ACCELERATED DEVELOPMENT SHOULD FULFILL THE FOLLOWING REQUIREMENTS. IT SHOULD ASSURE RAPID DEVELOPMENT OF AVAILABLE ENERGY OPPORTUNITIES IN THE CONSUMING COUNTRIES WITHOUT GIVING INVESTORS A

WHOLLY RISK-FREE OPPORTUNITY. IT SHOULD ALLOW FOR THE DIVERSITY IN ENERGY OPPORTUNITIES AMONG THE CONSUMING COUNTRIES, WHILE RECOGNIZING THAT ALL CONSUMING COUNTRIES WILL BENEFIT EQUALLY FROM THE MARKET IMPACT OF INCREASED PRODUCTION OF ENERGY BY ANY ONE OF THEM. AND IT SHOULD CREATE A BASIS ON WHICH STABLE ECONOMIC AND POLITICAL

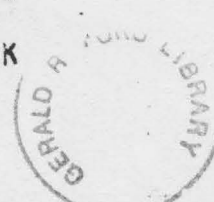
RELATIONSHIPS CAN BE NEGOTIATED WITH THE PRODUCING COUNTRIES.

AT MY REQUEST, SECRETARY KISSINGER HAS ADVANCED A SET OF PROPOSALS FOR CONSUMER COOPERATION ON ACCELERATED DEVELOPMENT. THESE PROPOSALS INCLUDE A COMMITMENT BY MEMBERS OF THE INTERNATIONAL ENERGY AGENCY TO PROVIDE PROTECTION AGAINST FUTURE PRICE UNCERTAINTY FOR INVESTORS IN CONVENTIONAL NUCLEAR AND FOSSIL FUELS IN OUR COUNTRIES, EITHER BY A COMMON FLOOR PRICE OR TARIFF; AN AGREEMENT SETTING FORTH THE GENERAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS UNDER WHICH MEMBER COUNTRIES COULD PARTICIPATE IN EACH OTHER'S PROGRAMS TO DEVELOP SYNTHETIC FUELS AND OTHER HIGHER COST ENERGY SOURCES; AND A SIMILAR AGREEMENT UNDER WHICH TWO OR MORE MEMBER COUNTRIES COULD POOL THEIR ENERGY RESEARCH AND DEVELOPMENT EFFORTS IN SPECIFIC AREAS AND PROJECTS.

WITHIN THIS FRAMEWORK, IT SHOULD BE POSSIBLE TO ASSURE AN EQUITABLE BALANCE OF COST AND BENEFITS AMONG PARTICIPATING COUNTRIES. COUNTRIES WITH LARGE FOSSIL FUEL POTENTIAL WOULD ACHIEVE GREATER SELF-SUFFICIENCY, BUT WOULD HAVE TO ASSUME THE LARGER SHARE OF THE INVESTMENT BURDEN. COUNTRIES WHOSE PRINCIPAL DOMESTIC ENERGY OPPORTUNITY IS INCREASED NUCLEAR POWER WOULD OBTAIN THE BALANCE OF PAYMENTS AND FISCAL BENEFIT OF LOWER OIL PRICES AS INVESTMENT IN OTHER PARTS OF THE IEA RESULTED IN LOWER WORLD PRICES. WE WOULD ALL AGREE NOT TO INCREASE OUR CONSUMPTION OF IMPORTED OIL IF PRICES FELL.

I UNDERSTAND THAT COUNTRIES SUCH AS JAPAN, WHICH HAVE RELATIVELY LITTLE DOMESTIC POTENTIAL TO DEVELOP FOSSIL FUELS, MIGHT BE CONCERNED OVER THE NEED TO ASSURE THAT THEY WOULD HAVE ACCESS TO THE NEW ENERGY SUPPLIES PRODUCED IN OTHER IEA COUNTRIES UNDER SUCH A FRAMEWORK

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OF COOPERATION. WE UNDERSTAND THIS CONCERN AND BELIEVE THAT IN AN EFFORT TO STRENGTHEN OUR OVERALL COOPERATIVE FRAMEWORK, WE SHOULD EXAMINE THE MERITS OF POSSIBLE UNDERTAKINGS REGARDING ACCESS TO SUPPLY AND TO MARKETS FOR ENERGY PRODUCED WITHIN OUR COUNTRIES.

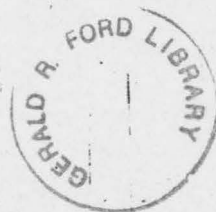
I AM OPTIMISTIC THAT WE WILL BE ABLE TO MAKE SUBSTANTIAL PROGRESS IN THIS AREA WITHIN THE NEXT FEW WEEKS AND THUS THAT WE WILL BE IN A POSITION TO HOLD A PREPARATORY MEETING BY THE END OF MARCH FOR THE FORMAL DIALOGUE WITH THE OIL PRODUCING COUNTRIES. CLEARLY, WE WILL NOT BE ABLE TO REACH DETAILED AGREEMENT ON ALL ASPECTS OF OUR COOPERATION IN ACCELERATED DEVELOPMENT BY THE END OF MARCH.

HOWEVER, I BELIEVE WE MUST REACH A FIRM UNDERSTANDING ON THE BASIC ELEMENTS AND PRINCIPLES OF OUR OVERALL APPROACH ON ACCELERATED DEVELOPMENT BEFORE BEGINNING DISCUSSIONS WITH THE PRODUCERS. WE CANNOT HOPE TO ACHIEVE AGREEMENT WITH PRODUCERS ON THE ELEMENTS OF A LONG-TERM EQUILIBRIUM OF INTERESTS BETWEEN US UNLESS WE AS CONSUMERS HAVE FIRMLY ESTABLISHED OUR OWN COMMON MEASURES OF COOPERATION IN THIS IMPORTANT AREA OF OUR OVERALL COOPERATIVE EFFORT.

I WOULD LIKE TO TAKE THIS OPPORTUNITY TO CONVEY TO YOU PERSONALLY MY APPRECIATION FOR THE POSITIVE CONTRIBUTION JAPAN IS MAKING TO THE WORK OF THE INTERNATIONAL ENERGY AGENCY AND YOUR VERY CONSTRUCTIVE ROLE IN OUR JOINT EFFORT TO RESOLVE THE ENERGY CRISIS. SINCERELY, GERALD R. FORD.

STRICTLY FOR YOUR OWN PRIVATE INFORMATION ONLY, HABIB TODAY REVIEWED MOST PRIVATELY WITH YASUKAWA THE EFFORTS WE HAVE MADE OVER THE PAST SEVERAL MONTHS TO ADVANCE AN EARLY COMPROMISE SETTLEMENT IN CAMBODIA. THESE INCLUDE DISCUSSIONS WITH THE CHINESE AND SOVIETS, AN EFFORT TO OPEN A CHANNEL TO THE KHMER COMMUNISTS THROUGH THE ALGERIANS, AND EFFORTS BY BOTH THE FRENCH AND OURSELVES TO OPEN CHANNELS TO SIHANOUK THROUGH THE CHINESE. 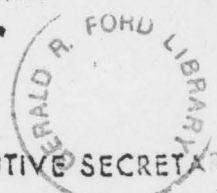

FROM DEAN BROWN TO HODGSON

1. WE ARE FACING CRITICAL PROBLEMS WITH STAGING AREAS URGENTLY REQUIRING GOJ RESPONSE IN VIEW REFTEL WHICH INDICATES GOJ MAY ACCOMMODATE NON-RELATED VIETNAMESE.
2. IN PRESENT CIRCUMSTANCES, WE CANNOT SEGREGATE AMCITS FROM NON-RELATED VIETNAMESE LEAVING SAIGON. MOREOVER, ONE IMMEDIATE PROBLEM IS WITH VIETNAMESE CATEGORY (LATEST REPORT ON AIRLIFT SHOWS ROUGH RATIO OF VIETNAMESE TO AMCITS TO BE 20 TO 1). WE NEED URGENT GOJ DECISION ON WHETHER THEY CAN ACCEPT PREDOMINANTLY VIETNAMESE FLOW INTO GOJ.

3. WE WOULD PREFER AT THIS STAGE NOT TO INDICATE HOW LARGE THE FLOW MIGHT BE GIVEN THE FLUIDITY OF THE SITUATION.

HOWEVER, YOU CAN ASSURE GOJ THAT THOSE WHOSE PROCESSING WILL TAKE LONGER BEFORE EVENTUAL RESETTLEMENT WOULD BE MOVED TO GUAM.

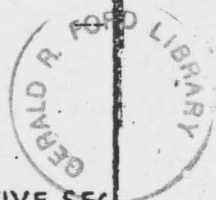
4. WE UNDERSTAND REAL PROBLEMS SURROUNDING QUARANTINE

REQUIREMENTS BUT FORESEE LARGE BOTTLENECKS IF GOJ INSISTS ON THIS REQUIREMENT. IF ABSOLUTELY ESSENTIAL, WE NEED TO KNOW HOW RAPIDLY JAPANESE QUARANTINE CAN PROCESS INCOMING FLOW.

SUBJECT: JAPANESE AMBASSADOR'S MEETING WITH UNDERSECRETARY  
SISCO ON MIDEAST DEVELOPMENTS

1. JAPANESE AMBASSADOR YASUKAWA CALLED ON UNDERSECRETARY SISCO ON JUNE 6 FOR GENERAL UPDATE ON MIDDLE EAST DEVELOPMENTS. CONVERSATION CENTERED ON SALZBURG MEETINGS BETWEEN THE PRESIDENT AND SADAT AND THE PROPOSED ECONOMIC ASSISTANCE PACKAGE FOR EGYPT.
2. PREFACING HIS REMARKS WITH A WARNING AGAINST THE UNDUO FLUCTUATIONS OF THE U.S. PRESS BETWEEN UNDUO OPTIMISM OR PRESSIMISM, THE UNDEFSECRETARY NOTED THAT THE PRESIDENT AND SADAT HAD ESTABLISHED EXCELLENT PERSONAL RAPPORT AT SALZBURG. THE PRESIDENT HAD BEEN IMPRESSED BY SAUAT'S STATESMANLIKE CHARACTER AND GRASP OF ISSUES. SAUAT HAD BEEN REASSURED BY THE PRESIDENT'S

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NOT TO BE REPRODUCED WITHOUT THE AUTHORIZATION OF THE EXECUTIVE SECRETARY

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DETERMINATION NOT TO PERMIT EITHER STAGNATION OR STALEMATE IN MIDEAST PEACE EFFORTS.

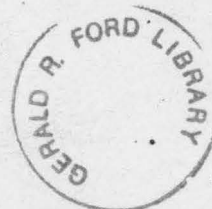
3. THE UNDERSECRETARY STATED THAT THE US HAD COME AWAY FROM SALZBURG WITH THE GENERAL IMPRESSION THAT "THE DOOR IS STILL OPEN FOR PROGRESS". HE HAD NOT MADE ANY DECISION AS TO WHETHER THE INTERIM AGREEMENT OR GENEVA

CONFERENCE ROUTE WILL PROVE MOST FEASIBLE. THE US WILL HAVE A BETTER SENSE OF THIS FOLLOWING THE VISIT OF PRIME MINISTER RABIN TO WASHINGTON. WHILE CAUTIONING THAT WE ARE UNABLE TO POINT TO SPECIFIC CHANGES IN THE ISRAELI OR EGYPTIAN POLITICAL CLIMATE, THE UNDERSECRETARY DESCRIBED THE PRESENT ATMOSPHERE AS CAUTIOUSLY HOPEFUL.

4. ASKED TO ASSESS THE POSSIBILITY OF A NEW INTERIM EGYPTIAN-ISRAELI AGREEMENT, THE UNDERSECRETARY NOTED THAT THIS IS A POSSIBILITY BUT THAT IF THERE WERE NO NEW COINCIDENCE OF VIEWS, THE PARTIES WOULD PROBABLY MOVE TO GENEVA. HE NOTED THAT BOTH OPTIONS - STEP BY STEP AND GENEVA - REMAINED OPEN.

5. YASUKAWA THEN RAISED THE PROPOSED MULTILATERAL ECONOMIC ASSISTANCE PACKAGE TO EGYPT ON INSTRUCTIONS FROM THE FOREIGN MINISTRY. THE JAPANESE EMBASSY IN CAIRO HAD REPORTED THAT IN A MEETING WITH AN UNIDENTIFIED "JAPANESE POLITICIAN," FOREIGN MINISTER FAHMI HAD STATED THAT THE US AND EGYPT HAD AGREED IN SALZBURG ON THE SPECIFIC BREAKDOWN OF THIS PACKAGE. OUT OF TOTAL \$1.5 BILLION, THE US REPORTEDLY WOULD CONTRIBUTE \$500 MILLION, SAUDI ARABIA \$250 MILLION, IRAN \$200 MILLION, WEST GERMANY \$200 MILLION, JAPAN \$200 MILLION, WITH THE REMAINDER COMING FROM WEST EUROPE AND OTHER OIL PRODUCING COUNTRIES.

6. THE UNDERSECRETARY STATED THAT DISCUSSIONS WERE IN FACT IN TERMS OF AN OVERALL \$1.5 AMOUNT. HOWEVER, THE US HAD NOT ENTERED INTO ANY AGREEMENT THAT \$200 MILLION WAS THE AMOUNT JAPAN WAS EXPECTED TO COMMIT. WE ARE IN NO POSITION TO COMMIT JAPAN, ALTHOUGH IT IS OBVIOUSLY OUR HOPE THAT JAPAN WILL COMMIT AS GENEROUS AN AMOUNT AS POSSIBLE SINCE THE EGYPTIAN NEED IS GREAT.

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7. THE UNDERSECRETARY EXPLAINED THAT THE PRIMARY PURPOSE OF THE PROPOSED ASSISTANCE WAS TO HELP EGYPT THROUGH ITS PRESENT FOREIGN EXCHANGE DIFFICULTIES. THIS WOULD BE BUDGETARY SUPPORT RATHER THAN PROJECT AID. WHILE THE OVERALL TOTAL OF \$1.5 BILLION WAS ACCURATE, THE US WAS PLANNING TO CONTRIBUTE \$250 MILLION AND HOPED BOTH SAUDI ARABIA AND IRAN COULD CONTRIBUTE SIMILAR AMOUNTS. IN ADDITION TO JAPAN, WEST GERMANY AND KUWAIT HAD BEEN CONTACTED IN REGARDS THIS PROPOSAL. WEST GERMANY HAD ALSO BEEN ASKED TO APPROACH THE EC ON THIS MATTER. THE US EXPECTED THE WORLD BANK TO PLAY A MANAGERIAL ROLE IN PROMOTING EGYPTIAN FISCAL EFFICIENCY, WHICH THE BANK WAS PREPARED TO DO ON INVITATION FROM THE EGYPTIANS.

8. YASUKAWA EXPLAINED THAT THE GOJ WAS STILL STUDYING THE PROPOSAL. THE UNDERSECRETARY EXPRESSED THE HOPE THAT THE GOJ "WOULD DO THE BEST IT COULD." HE REGRETTED THAT THIS CONFUSION REGARDING THE PROPOSED ASSISTANCE PACKAGE HAD ARISEN AND URGED THE AMBASSADOR TO CONTACT HIM SHOULD ANY MORE QUESTIONS ARISE.

9. COMMENT: SISOU DID NOT INDICATE ANY SPECIFIC FIGURE THAT WAS EXPECTED FROM JAPAN, SINCE IT IS CLEAR FROM EMBASSY GAINING REPORTS THAT THE PROBLEM OF THE OVERALL AMOUNT AND PROSPECTIVE INDIVIDUAL COMMITMENTS NEED FURTHER CLARIFICATION WITH THE EGYPTIANS. THIS WILL BE REVIEWED FROM HERE PROMPTLY, WITH A VIEW TO DETERMINING HOW BEST TO CLARIFY SITUATION.

DEPT HAS RECEIVED FBIS REPORT NO. 63 OF ASAHI EVENING NEWS BROADCAST IN ENGLISH JUNE 14 THAT FOMIN MIYAZAWA TOLD LOWER HOUSE FOREIGN AFFAIRS COMMITTEE JUNE 13 THAT DIRECT US MILITARY ACTIONS FROM BASES IN JAPAN IN EVENT OF MILITARY CLASH IN KOREAN PENINSULA WOULD BE APPROVED ONLY WHEN JAPAN'S OWN NATIONAL SAFETY IS ENDANGERED. ACCORDING TO REPORT, MIYAZAWA ELABORATED ON PRIME MINISTER MIKI'S JUNE 9 STATEMENT TO LOWER HOUSE BUDGET COMMITTEE THAT GOJ CAN REPLY EITHER "YES" OR "NO" IN CONNECTION WITH POSSIBLE US PRIOR CONSULTATION REGARDING DIRECT ACTION FROM US BASES IN JAPAN. MIYAZAWA REPORTEDLY SAID THAT MIKI DID NOT MEAN THAT GOJ WOULD EASILY REPLY "YES." FOMIN IS QUOTED AS SAYING, "I BELIEVE HE (MIKI) SAID THE ANSWER COULD BE EITHER YES OR NO, SINCE IT WOULD HAVE SOME EFFECT ON OTHER COUNTRIES NO MATTER WHAT KIND OF AN ANSWER HE GAVE."

SUBJECT: MESSAGE FROM THE SECRETARY TO MIYAZAWA

1. PLEASE DELIVER FOLLOWING LETTER FROM SECRETARY KISSINGER TO FOREIGN MINISTER MIYAZAWA:
2. QUOTE: DEAR MR. MINISTER: AS WE PREPARE TO SEND OUR DELEGATIONS TO THE NEXT MEETING OF THE GOVERNING BOARD OF THE INTERNATIONAL ENERGY AGENCY, I THINK IT ESSENTIAL THAT OUR TWO GOVERNMENTS HAVE THE FULLEST POSSIBLE APPRECIATION OF OUR RESPECTIVE POSITIONS ON THE ISSUES TO BE CONSIDERED IN PARIS. THE WORK OF THE IEA IN PREPARING FOR A RESUMPTION OF THE CONSUMER/PRODUCER DIALOGUE AND IN ESTABLISHING AN EFFECTIVE PROGRAM OF LONG TERM COOPERATION IS OF GREAT IMPORTANCE TO MY GOVERNMENT. I KNOW YOU SHARE OUR CONCERN THAT THESE MATTERS GO FORWARD IN AN EFFICIENT AND EFFECTIVE MANNER.

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ACCORDINGLY, I AM PREPARED TO SEND ASSISTANT SECRETARY THOMAS U. ENDERS TO TOKYO ON JUNE 25 TO MEET WITH REPRESENTATIVES OF THE FOREIGN MINISTRY AND OTHER INTERESTED PARTIES IN THE JAPANESE GOVERNMENT FOR A BILATERAL EXCHANGE ON CONSUMER/PRODUCER RELATIONS AND LONG TERM COOPERATION.

ON JUNE 30 THE GOVERNING BOARD MUST ACT ON A PROPOSED LONG TERM PROGRAM IN ORDER TO KEEP FAITH WITH THE COMMITMENT WE MADE WHEN WE ADOPTED THE INTERNATIONAL ENERGY PROGRAM AND WHICH WE CONFIRMED IN THE COMMUNIQUE OF THE MAY 27 MINISTERIAL MEETING. AN EFFECTIVE LONG TERM PROGRAM WILL BEGIN TO RESTORE BALANCE IN INTERNATIONAL ENERGY MARKETS AND IMPROVE OUR OVERALL POSTURE VIS-A-VIS THE OIL EXPORTING COUNTRIES. THIS IS OF COURSE PARTICULARLY IMPORTANT AS WE LOOK TOWARD A RESUMPTION OF THE DIALOGUE WITH PRODUCERS IN THE RELATIVELY NEAR FUTURE.

I AM SURE YOU WILL AGREE THAT IT IS PARTICULARLY IMPORTANT THAT OUR TWO GOVERNMENTS CAREFULLY COORDINATE OUR POSITIONS ON A BILATERAL BASIS AS WE APPROACH THIS IMPORTANT PHASE IN THE DEVELOPMENT OF THE IEA'S OWN COOPERATIVE PROGRAM AND OUR POLICY TOWARDS THE OIL PRODUCERS. BEST REGARDS, HENRY A. KISSINGER. END QUOTE.  
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
