SUBJECT: Additional Information Items

Communications System Being Restored in South Vietnam: Restoration continues on the integrated telephone communications system built by the U.S. in South Vietnam. This network, consisting of country-wide cable, microwave, and tropospheric scatter radio relays, can provide from four to 300 channels. The system was put back in operation in areas south and west of Saigon shortly after the fall of the government; current efforts are being directed toward restoring and testing radio-relay units. According to DIA, restoration of the network will give the Vietnamese a highly effective nationwide communications system with important military and civilian uses. It will increase military command and control capabilities in both training and operational situations and will facilitate economic recovery and development.

Chile to Expel Priest: The Chilean government has informed our officials that a detained U.S. citizen priest, Father Panchot, will be expelled from Chile, possibly as early as today. In the meantime, however, further consular access to him has been denied. He is the fifth churchperson detained by Chilean security officials in recent weeks who will have been allowed to depart at the request of the U.S. (Brownell)

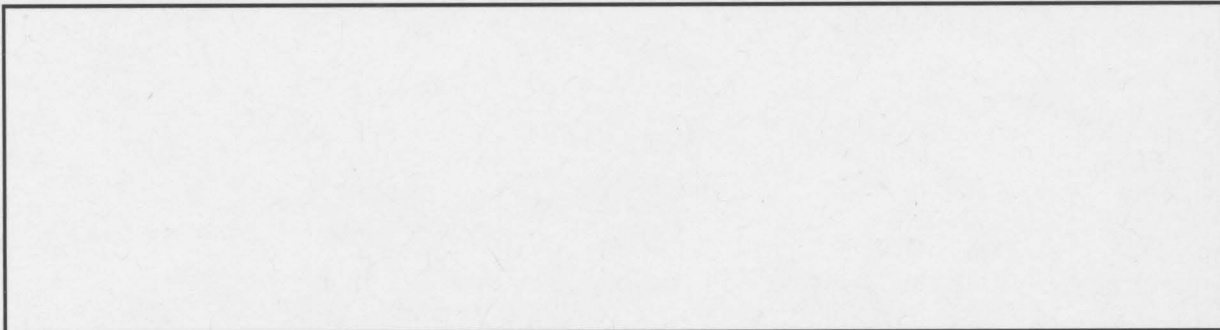

Fourth Committee Votes on Belize: Following defeat of a Guatemalan challenge of the competence of the Fourth Committee to adopt the Belize resolution sponsored by the UK and Caribbean nations, the committee defeated a resolution on Belize sponsored by Guatemala and voted by a large margin to adopt the UK-Caribbean resolution. The resolution calls for self-determination and independence for Belize and supports the inviolability of its territorial integrity. Prior to the vote, the UK representative made a conciliatory statement emphasizing his government's desire to "begin negotiations with Guatemala on a fresh basis as soon as possible."
