As the year draws to a close, I wanted you to know what a privilege it has been to serve under your leadership for so many years in the House of Representatives and during the past two years of your Presidency.



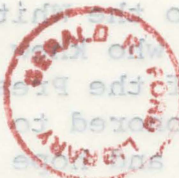
